



> the beginning of a public library in Goldthwaite. Mrs. Fred Reynolds was program leader for the afternoon. Invocation was given by Mrs. Reynolds. A travelogue was presented by Mr. and Mrs. Lee Walton with their beautiful pictures which took the members to all parts of the United States.
