First Primary Election Is This Saturday

Republican Primary Scheduled In Priddy Precinct

The Republican Party will hold a primary election in Mills County this Saturday, May 2, it has been announced by Walter J. Marwitz, chairman of the Mills County Republican Committee.

Plans call for the Republican primary to be held in the Priddy Precinct 10, at the Priddy School. Voting will open at 8 a. m. and will remain open until 7 p. m.

Official Republican Primary Election ballots have been printed with candidates for seven state offices and for U. S. Senator. No candidates are listed for county offices, except for County Chairman.

Contests will involve two offices, one for U. S. Senator and the other for Governor of Texas. Two candidates are on the ballot for each of these two offices.

Robert Morris and George Bush are candidates for the U. S. Senate office and Roger Martin and Paul Eggers are the candidates for Governor.

Byron Fullerton is the candidate for Lieutenant Governor and Edward M. Yturri is the candidate for Attorney General.

For Comptroller of Public Accounts the candidate is S. L. Abbott and Robert F. Koenneke is the candidate for State Treasurer.

Harry Trippett is the candidate for Commissioner of General Land Office and Daniel C. Heath is the candidate for Commissioner of Agriculture.

Walter J. Marwitz is the candidate for Mills County Chairman.

Three Contests For Nomination To County Offices To Be Decided

The first Democratic Primary Election of 1970 will be held here this week Saturday, May 2.

Democratic Executive Committee Chairman, Claudia Cokrum, has announced that the polls will open at 8 a. m. and will remain open until 7 p. m. She urges voters to bring their Certificate of Registration with them when they go to vote, to avoid delays.

There are nine voting boxes in Mills County.

Absentee voting has been light this year. Walter A. Bryant, County-District Clerk, announced that absentee voting closed Tuesday, April 28, with 75 votes cast.

Five state offices will be in contest this year with two or more candidates, along with the contest for the office of U. S. Senator.

Three offices, one county-wide and two commissioners' precincts, will have a contest with two candidates seeking each place, in Mills County.

The U. S. Senate race promises to be a lively one in Mills County, along with all Texas. Incumbent Ralph W. Yarborough is being challenged for the nomination by former Congressman and Houston businessman Lloyd Bentsen.

Crawford C. Martin and David H. Brown are candidates for Attorney General.

For Commissioner of General Land Office candidates are Jerry Sadler, Fred Williams and Bob Armstrong.

Connie Lawson and Ben Ramsey are candidates for Railroad Commissioner.

For Supreme Court, Associate Justice, Place 3, candidates are Hawthorne Phillips, Matt Davis and James G. Denton.

Truman Roberts and Earl W. Smith are candidates for Court of Criminal Appeals, (Judge).

Other State and District officers are without contest.

REGIONAL TRACK MEET HELD IN DENTON

The Regional Track Meet was held last Saturday and Monday, April 25 and 27, in Denton.

In the 440 yard relay Goldthwaite placed 9th out of 16 teams with a time of 45.9. All of the boys on this team will be back next year.

Goldthwaite placed 5th in the Mile Relay out of 16 teams with the best time of the year, 3:34.3. They won over Bangs who came into the meet with the best time. Time splits were Johnny Johnson, 54.1; Bennie Humphries, 54.9; Mike McCoy, 52.3; and Kennon McLean, 51.0.

Kennon McLean placed 6th in the broad jump with the best jump of the year, 20' 3/4".

In the intermediate hurdles Mike McCoy placed 5th with a time of 43.5.

AUSTIN, Tex. — "Things are going to get worse, unless we plan and fight a war against drug abuse in Texas," Gov. Preston Smith told the Conference on Public Health and Drugs.

Noting that in the past 10 years "arrests of teenagers for drug abuse increased 800 per cent," Smith urged the conference to come up with new means of controlling and preventing drug problems, as well as reviewing what is being done.

"We need to examine penalties," he said.

"The drug offender who is caught is often very young. He may have been pressured into experimentation with drugs."

"Yet, within the legal machinery, his punishment can be as severe as that of a dope pusher, or seller."

"Is this fair? Or is it out of proportion with the crime?" Smith asked.

Earlier, Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes—accompanied by newsmen, law officers and government officials—toured drug treatment

and mental health facilities over the state. On the trip, Barnes proposed a State drug center near a medical school for treatment, rehabilitation and research.

Later, Barnes joined Atty. Gen. Crawford Martin at the meeting of the Crime and Narcotics Advisory Committee with the Texas Education Agency to hear what plans the agency has developed for teaching a course on the dangers of drugs and crime, as required by the last Legislature.

Speaking to the meeting Martin expressed concern over the increasing use of heroin, which, he said, is becoming a major problem.

Involving young people in the program will be necessary if it is successful, the Attorney General said, because "no program of narcotics control can ever be effective unless the young people themselves want it to be effective."

VOTER REGISTRATION

A record total of 4,150,645 Texans are qualified to vote during the primary and general election this year. Secretary of State Martin Dies Jr. reported that count as the State Chief Election officer.

Statewide total is almost 80-

000 more than in the 1968 presidential year.

Metropolitan area county registrations rose dramatically from 1969. Harris County (Houston) alone accounted for 650,612 of the votes, Dallas 466,925 and Bexar (San Antonio) 260,225.

Dies said he is confident new procedures for registration and various drives by groups produced the record turnout, which he had predicted, even though 1970 is a non-presidential year.

ROAD DEVELOPMENT ASKED

South Texas highway boosters called on the Highway Commission for \$150.8 million worth of highway developments ranging over 1,275 miles during the next decade.

Projects are in District 15 which includes Atascosa, Bander, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Guadalupe, Kendall, Kerr, LaSalle, McMullen, Medina and Wilson Counties.

Delegation urged state expenditures of \$146.5 million for construction and \$4.2 million for right-of-way in "Plan for '70's." About 87.9 million of the total would go for farm-to-market roads.

Long-range plan does not include interstate projects, those programmed for later construction or strictly-urban facilities.

Bilingual Districts Picked

Thirteen Texas school districts have been selected by the U. S. Department of Education to submit plans for a bilingual education program during the 1970-71 school year.

They are Alamo Heights, Northside Independent School District and South Side ISD, all of San Antonio; Alice; Colorado City; Corpus Christi; Del Valle; Edinburg; El Paso; Galveston; Kingsville; Orange Grove and Port Isabel.

Children three to 18 with limited English-speaking ability will be benefitted. Seventy-six other districts now operate under bilingual program funding.

COURTS SPEAK

Supreme Court set an April 29 hearing on the question whether

a businessman can collect damages for libel if a credit rating agency puts out an incorrect report that he has filed for bankruptcy. A Midland businessman brought suit against Dun & Bradstreet which corrected its error.

High Court heard arguments on the question of whether the residence of the district superintendent of the Methodist Church conference is tax exempt. Also booked for hearing is the tax-exempt status of officially-declared historic sites.


Court of Criminal Appeals upheld the life sentence for robbery by assault given a Lubbock man, despite expert testimony he was mentally retarded.

Uncorroborated testimony of one who may have been an accomplice to a conviction for possession of marijuana, Court of Criminal Appeals held.

Lawsuits have been filed in federal court in El Paso to force district courts, courts of civil appeals and justice of the peace courts redistricting in line with the one-man, one-vote ruling of the U. S. Supreme Court.

As It Looks From Here

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The 14th Amendment to our Constitution has been the launching pad for many controversial Supreme Court decisions in recent years.

Just a few days ago it entered another dimension unheard of or imagined. It embraced the extraordinary idea that an individual can claim welfare payments as a "property" right even when his eligibility to receive payments from the Government is under question.

The 14th amendment provides that no entity of government can deprive persons of life, liberty and property without due process of law. The Court by a 5 to 3 vote decided that welfare payments were a part of the individual's "property" and they can not be removed from the welfare rolls without a court hearing. There is little doubt that a Government attorney will be furnished to represent the individual, although in other instances it is illegal for those in Government to represent a client having a claim against the Government.

The ruling strikes at the heart of the concept that welfare programs are an instrument of charitable support. Instead, the decision portrays the collection of welfare benefits as an established property right.

In a Dissent, Justice Hugo Black said "Government's promise of charity expressed in our welfare programs considered to be a property right, strains credulity."

An immediate consequence of the ruling will not only add to the already staggering cost of welfare but will lead to endless hearings before courts already burdened with overloaded dockets. In the meantime, those found ineligible by those responsible for such a determination will continue to be paid.

The elevation of public welfare into an obligation of the Government to support every citizen is in danger of being written even more explicit into

our laws when the Nixon Administration's "Family Assistance Plan" is enacted by the Congress.

The Administration's proposal assures every family that its income, for whatever reason, will not fall below a specified level.

Once people are on the welfare rolls, under the Court's ruling it will be extremely difficult for them to be removed, even though it is determined by local welfare administrators that

their eligibility has ceased to exist. It will discourage efforts to remove those found to disqualify for whatever reason.

It is not a matter of not being responsive to the genuine needs of unfortunate people. The American people have always responded in helping those who can not help themselves. Cities, counties, states, the Federal Government — plus countless private agencies, groups and organizations, provide aid to genuinely needy people. True charity is one thing but a Court's decision which says it is guaranteed under the Constitution removes the moral concept of charity and places those who are unwilling to work in a position to claim public money as a property right. It gives the lazy and shiftless a right alongside those in genuine need and who are unable to support themselves.

The Court's decision is a viol-
