Freezing is one of the simplest and fastest methods of preserving foods at home. It keeps the natural color, fresh favor, and tables, and meats better than other methods of food preservation. Freezing provides the convenience of having food products that can be prepared quickly for serving.

Costs of owning and operating home freezer may range from 13 to 28 cents a pound of frozen food, depending on rate of turnover. On a pound basis, freezing costs decrease as the quantity of food frozen is increased. Cost estimates are based on electricity used, costs of packaging materials, repairs and average freezer costs distributed over 10 years.
