Post Office will be closed Thanksgiving Day with no service and no rural route deliveries. Special mail will be taken care of and dispatched as usual.

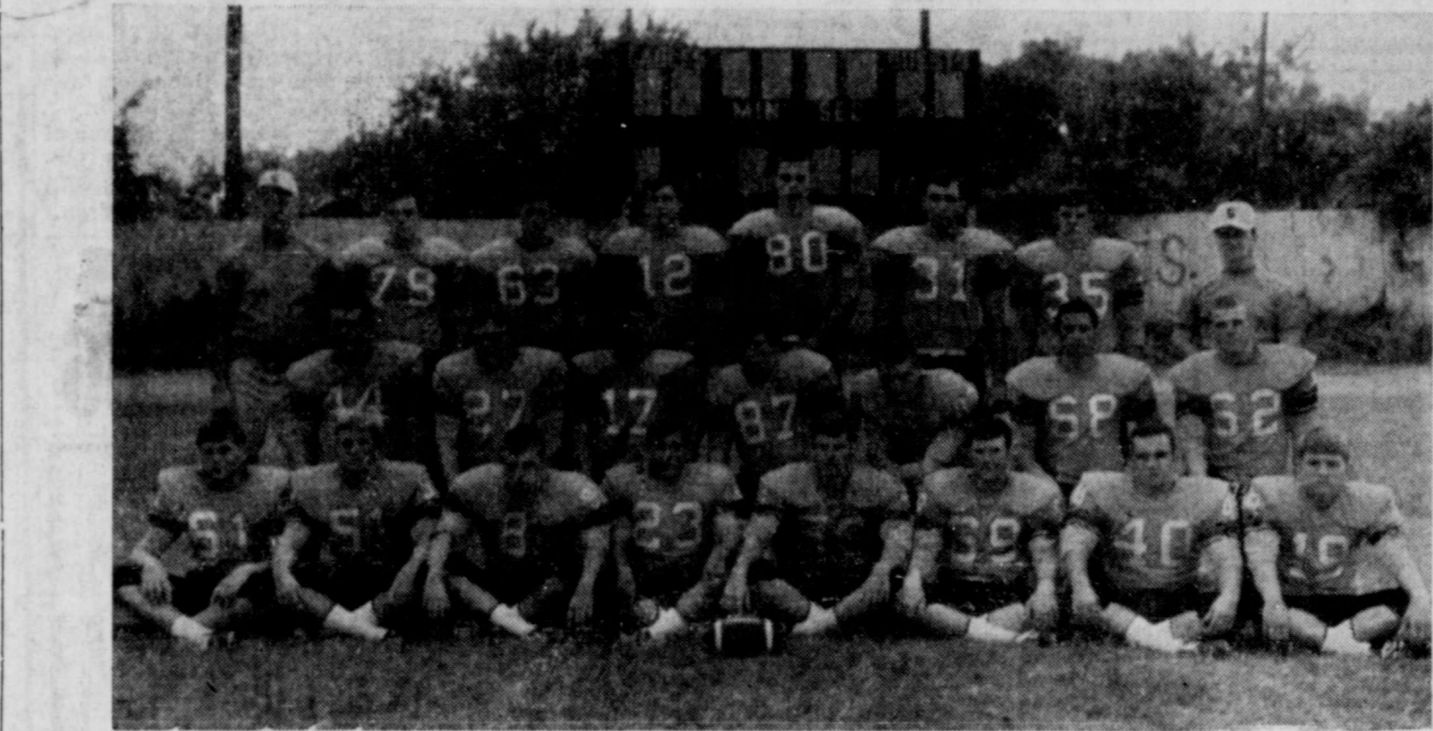
Reservations For Homecoming Dinner In Slowly

Eagles Take District 10-A Crown From De Leon By Score Of 28-27

The GHS Golden Eagles slipped by the De Leon Bearcats Friday night with a score of 28-27 to capture the District 10-A football championship crown.

The Eagles clinched the championship from the De Leon Bearcats and the right to meet Sonora in Bi-District play this Friday night at San Angelo.

Goldthwaite will carry a 9-1 season record into Bi-District play Friday night, while leaving the De Leon Bearcats with a season record of 7-3.

Kennon McLean opened the scoring for the Eagles as he took the kickoff 97-yards down the right sideline untouched for six points. Quarterback Johnny Johnson kicked the seventh point for the Eagles placing them on the scoreboard 7-0.

De Leon came back to score on a one yard run by Ronnie Agüero and an extra point kicked by Herman Hardin to tie the game at the end of the first quarter.

The Bearcats scored again on another one yard run by Agüero and Hardin booted the extra point.

During the second quarter Fullback Sam Watson stepped across from the one yard line for an Eagle score. Johnson made the extra point.

Scott McLean was within five yards of the end zone to recover a Bearcat fumble and added another six points to the Eagles' score. Johnson's kick put Goldthwaite over the hurdle by a 21-14 margin.

In the final six minutes of the second quarter three touchdowns hit the scoreboards.

After the half, De Leon's Agüero put the Bearcats back into the race by running eight yards for a score. The PAT failed however.

Minutes later Agüero skipped 35 yards for still another goale. Hardin kicked the extra point which left the Eagles trailing by one touchdown.

The Golden Eagles were determined to come home with the District 10-A championship title though, as Johnson put the Eagles back on the scoreboard with a 37-yard pass to Kennon McLean who was waiting in the end zone. Johnson then made the PAT good which was the determining factor for the important Eagle victory.

Johnny Johnson carried the ball 6 times for a total of 4 yards; Sam Watson 17 times for 46 yards; Joe Dan Hardgrave 5 times for 47 yards; and Joe Hudson 4 times for 2 yards.

Mills County Hunters Join Forces As Deer Season Opens Saturday

A large number of Mills County hunters joined other hunters from all over Texas Saturday morning as they headed for the hills and brush to open the 1970 deer, quail and turkey season.

Early reports reaching the Eagle office would indicate that this season will be a successful one for most hunters in this area, even though it started off Saturday morning at a somewhat slower pace.

Many hunters reported that deer were not moving about as much as they do normally on opening day because of the high winds.

L. B. Burnham was the first one to check in his kill Saturday morning which was a six point buck. Mr. Burnham checked in at Mills County Locker Plant at 11:00 a. m.

This checkin at the locker plant was considerably later than those coming in early in past seasons. There again the weather played a big part. It was cold enough for hunters not to be too concerned about getting their deer into the locker for cold storage.

Joe S. Langford, owner of Mills County Locker, stated that not as many deer were checked in on Saturday, but, by Monday

afternoon over 100 were checked in. This is the same number checked at the Locker by Monday noon last year. Langford said that 99 per cent of the deer checked in at the locker were Mills County deer.

Mills County is becoming more and more a deer county with kills reported for the first two days from the area as far west and north as the Brown County Line and east as far as Center City and Star.

A number of deer have been reported this year in sections of the county where a few years ago it was unheard of to see deer before or during the hunting season.

Two turkeys also had been checked in at the locker plant by Monday noon, according to Langford.

JOE BROWN GETS FIRST BUCK

Joe Brown, eight year old son of Mr. and Mrs. K. C. Brown of Dallas, bagged his first deer this year which his family feels has made him a confirmed hunter.

Joe is the grandson of Mr. and Mrs. O. O. Smith, of Goldthwaite. He was hunting with his father and killed a spike buck at 7 a. m. Saturday morning on the Smith Ranch at Okalla, in Burnet County.

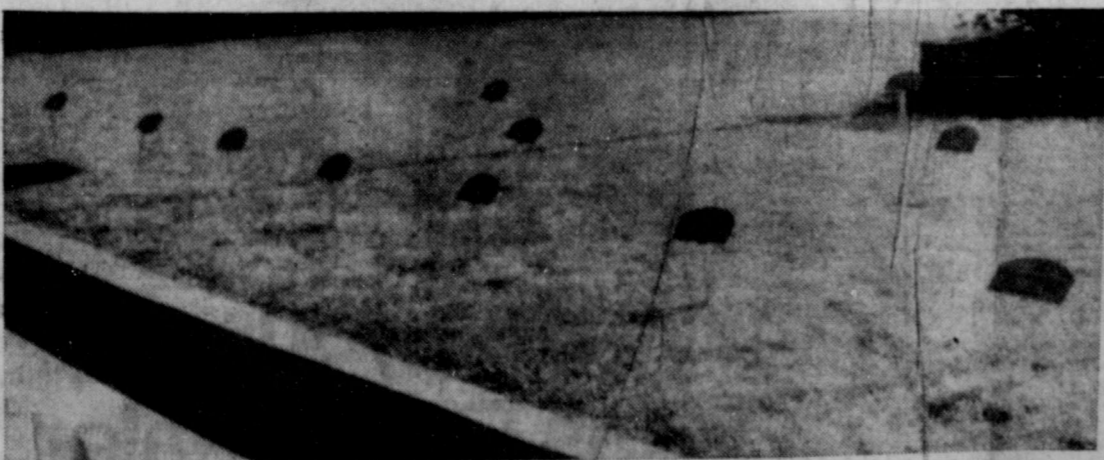
General chairman for the Santa Claus Day festivities will be Charles Conrad. Other committee members who will help carry out the various functions for the day will be announced in the paper next week.

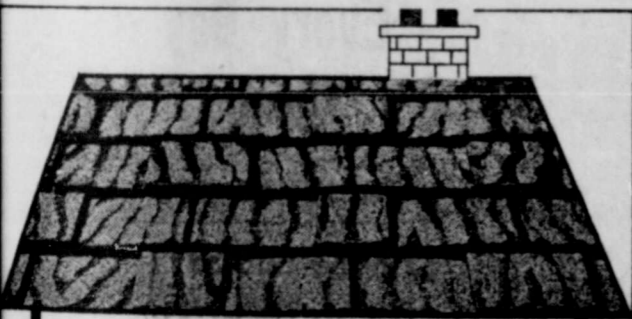

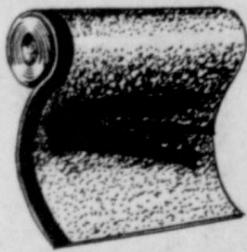
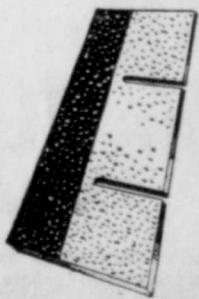

Members of the Ridge Predatory Animal Control Club met on November 10 in the Ebony Community Center. Main objective of the meeting was to set up a bounty program, according to announcement by Evalyn Reid, secretary-treasurer of the club.

Members agreed to pay \$25.00 for each coyote killed and \$15.00 for each bobcat.

These predators must be killed within the area of the Ridge P. A. C. and must be verified by a qualified landowner.

Qualified landowners are those who are members of the Ridge Predatory Animal Control Club.

This offer will be valid from November 14, 1970, through December 31, 1970.

Anyone eligible to collect a bounty should notify the land-

owner where the kill is made.

The landowner will then notify the Ridge P. A. C. and the bounty will be paid promptly, according to the announcement.

All hunters are encouraged to watch for these predators as damage in recent months has been extensive.

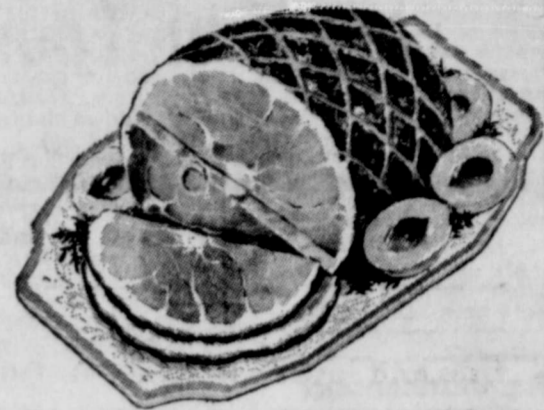

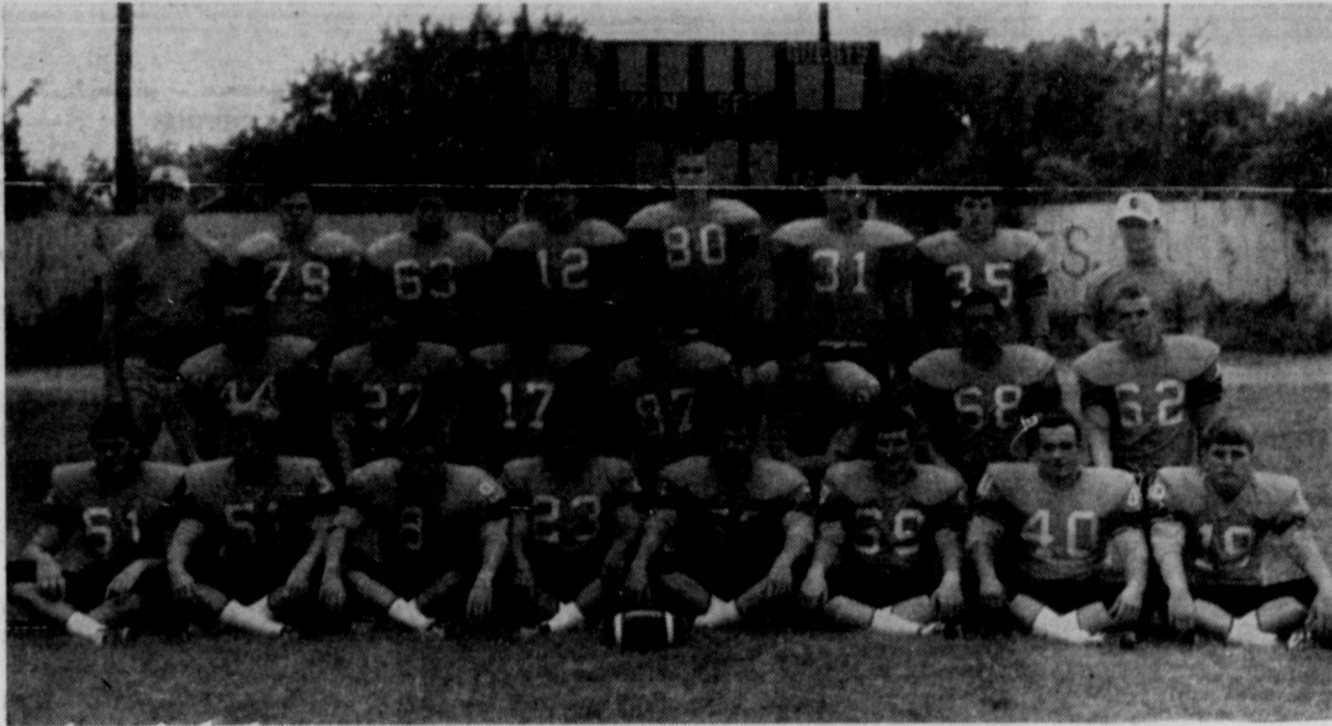

Frost Killed Plants Should Not Be Grazed Until Thoroughly Dry

Frost and freezing weather are now here and with it comes changes in plant growth. When the growth of all members of the Sorghum family, including Johnsongrass, sudan, milo, forage sorghums and all hybrids, is stopped by frost, they sometimes develop a high prussic acid content and become a hazard to grazing livestock, reminds County Agent George Reese.

Certain chemical changes oc-

cur in the frost-wilted plants and are responsible for the prussic acid development, explains the county agent. The poison acts quickly and can kill an animal within a very short time after the damaged plant is eaten. Whether a poisoned animal can be saved usually depends upon how soon a veterinarian can get to it, he notes.

Frosted Johnsongrass or sorghum should not be grazed un-

til the damaged plants are as dry as good quality hay or for at least a week after the frost. If the crop was ready to cut for hay before the frost, it may be cut immediately provided adequate time is allowed. Silage made from frosted plants is safe as soon as the ensilage process is complete.

Young plants or second growth suckers are more likely to cause trouble than older plants nearing maturity, says the county agent. Too, the more luxuriant the growth, the more likely the plants will be dangerous if their growth is interrupted.

Additional information is available from the local veterinarian and county agent relating to grazing and/or harvesting and storing frost wilted plants.

"Blue-Ribbon" Committee Is Named To Evaluate Job Of State Lawmakers

With the next legislative session just two months off, a blue-ribbon speaker's committee has set out to evaluate the jobs of state lawmakers and how they can better perform their duties.

First meeting of the 150-member panel named by Speaker Gus Mutscher and headed by Waggoner Carr, former attorney general, was held at the capitol last week.

One of the first things Mutscher suggested was a study of

the work load heaped on officials who draw only \$400 a month base pay. Committee is expected to come up with a recommendation and support for legislators' pay raises.

Mutscher asked the group to give special attention also to legislative facilities, ethics and internal security.

He further suggested a look at steps now taken to assure protection for orderly conduct of the state's business at the capitol and "physical protection" of state officials, employees and the public.

Mutscher said both houses of the legislature will hold a pre-session conference at Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs at the University of Texas.

Carr ruled out the study of such matters as annual legislative sessions and abuses by joint conference committees, since the committee was named by the House speaker and was not confirmed by the Senate. "Timing of sessions and joint conference committees are matters of concern to both houses," he noted.

Four sub-committees were named and immediately began work. Sub-panels will work in areas of duties, responsibilities and compensation; ethics and standards of conduct; physical facilities and internal security.

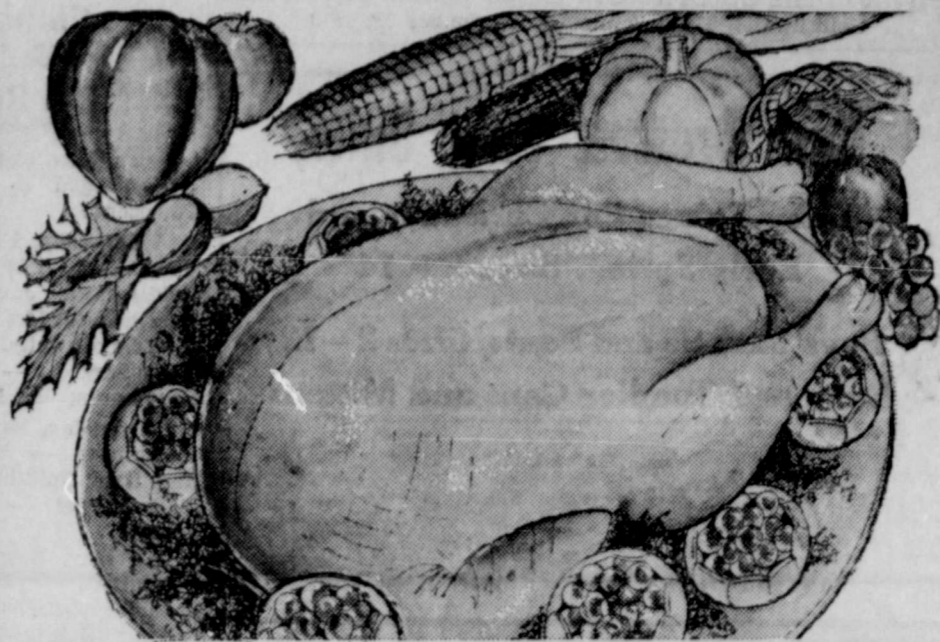

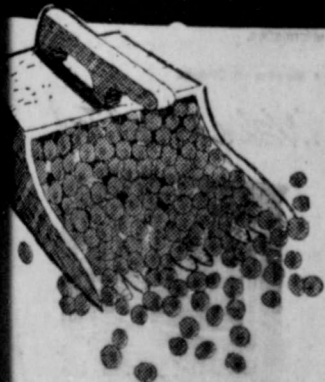
