Wrap the turkey slices in freezer paper or foil, label and freeze immediately. Follow the same procedure with diced cooked turkey that you plan to use in turkey salad and soups.

1/2 cup molasses 1/3 cup warm water 2 teaspoons soda

Have ready for SAUCE: 1 cup sugar 1/2 cup cream

1/2 cup butter, melted 1 teaspoon vanilla

Combine flour, baking powder, and salt. Sift together. Add cranberries. Mix molasses, water, shortening, and soda, and add to cranberry mixture. Spoon into well greased one-quart mold or cylindirical can. Cover mold with parchment paper, aluminum foil or several layers of heavy waxed paper, and tie loosely in place. Place in steamer, or on top of a tricet or wire rack in a large covered kettle or roasting pan. Add water to just below top of rack. Cover pan, remove mold from pan and let stand a few minutes or set in cold water a few seconds before unmolding
