Mr. Hudson passed away Thursday, November 26, 1970 at 5:15 a. m. in the Childress Hospital in Goldthwaite. Born January 27, 1892 in Mills County, he was the son of the late Lewis Hudson and Mary Nancy Puckett Hudson. Mr. Hudson had been a registered pharmacist for 52 years. He bought the drug store in Goldthwaite which he operated in 1921. On December 27, 1925 he married Ima Townsend in Lampasas. He was also a member of the Presbyterian Church.

Mr. Hudson was a retired druggist and a veteran of World War I. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge AF&AM, the Kiwanis International, and also a member of the Texas Pharmaceutical Association.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Ima Hudson of Goldthwaite; one son, Lewis T. Hudson of Goldthwaite; two sisters, Mrs. Chloe Huddleston of Goldthwaite, and Mrs. Elizabeth Sykes of Winters;

Mike Conratt Has Kicked His Way Into Baylor Football Record Books

WACO—Mike Conratt has kicked his way into the Baylor football record books this fall and in the process, erased the name of one of the school's immortals from the pages.

Conratt booted his seventh field goal of the season against SMU Saturday, November 21, and the feat was historic. The all-time Baylor record was six, established by Hall-of-Famer Wesley Bradshaw way back in 1921, and tied by two other placement experts, Bob Purvis in 1965 and Terry Cozby in 1967. Conratt has only missed twice this year, his first as a kicker, and he entered the Rice game with a perfect 11-for-11 on extra points.

Not bad for a former Goldthwaite High School quarterback and end who played on the 1968 basketball team that not only won the first district championship at the school but went undefeated for the season as well.

Conratt, whose father (Charles Conratt) ran track at Tarle-

ton State College, lined up with the kicking tryouts this fall, and immediately gained the eye of Coach Bill Beall. He got his big chance against Army and came through with the game-winning field goal and one extra point. Since then, it's become almost automatic.

The next plateau is the all-time Baylor career record for field goals, 12 by Cozby in 1967-69. With two years remaining

The Texas Animal Health Commission plans to do the testing with two crews and they started on December 1st.

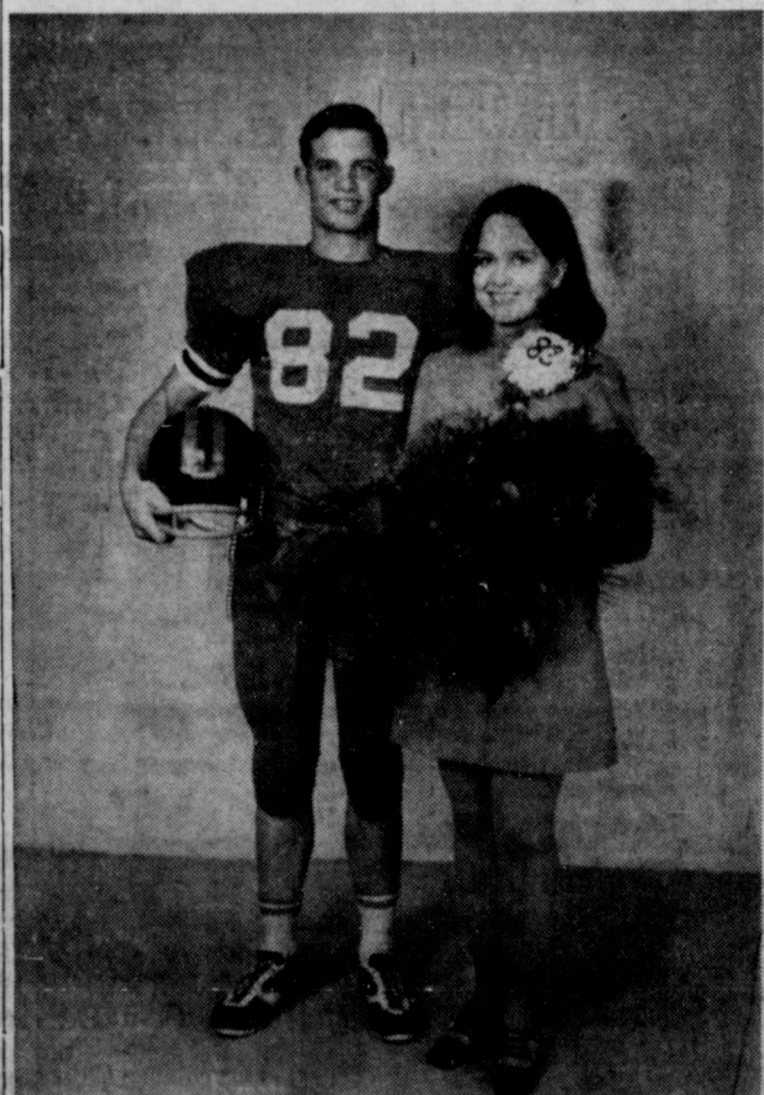
Cattle producers may call the County Agent's office, 648-2650, in Goldthwaite, if they would like to have their herds retested.

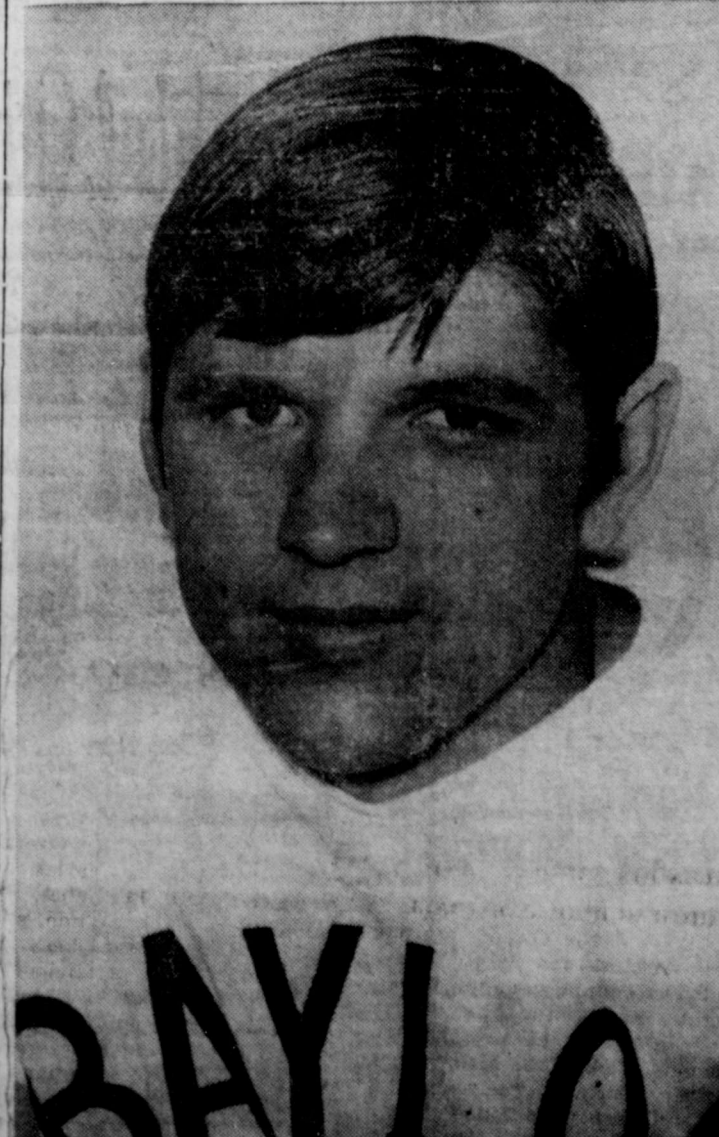
Christmas Lighting Contest To Be Judged December 21 And 22

Cong. Burleson Announces Summer Job Examination By Civil Service

Those who are interested in the summer jobs covered may apply to take the written test on or before three filing dates—December 4, 1970, January 8, 1971 and February 3, 1971. Representative Burleson stressed that applications for the written test postmarked after February 3, 1971, will not be accepted. If you miss the last test, you can not be considered for jobs filled by this application and for maximum consideration, you should apply as soon as possible.

The Congressman noted that applicants rated eligible in 1970 need not take the written test again unless they wish to improve their scores. They will automatically receive a special form by December 1 to update their qualifications and indicate their availability for employ-

Texas Education Agency Officials Set Priority Goals For Two Years

By VERN SANFORD

AUSTIN, Tex.—Heads of the Texas Education Agency have set priority goals for public schools during the next two years. They estimate additional state and local costs at more than \$362 million.

Highest priority must be assigned to implementing those major educational acts of the 1969 Legislature, says Dr. J. W. Edgar, Commissioner of Education.

He listed these acts as the 1969 salary compensation (long-range teacher pay raise) plan, a kindergarten program for five-year-olds, comprehensive special education programs, expansion of technical-vocational programs and refinement of the teacher retirement act. Programs are projected over a three-to-seven-year period.

As desirable as new or accelerated programs may be, says Edgar, the State Board of Education feels more experience is needed with the 1969 acts and more opportunity should be allowed to invest available resources in presently-authorized goals.

"Next priority," says the Commissioner, "goes to carrying out recommendations of a committee studying changes in school to equalizing funds assigned as

the local share of foundation costs."

More than \$2 billion will be spent for public elementary and secondary education this year. Estimate for next year is \$2.6 billion.

About 2,728,000 pupils now are enrolled, and 2,760,000 will be in classes next year.

Cost of existing programs for finance formulas, with a view next year alone will increase

\$156 million, while new programs will require an estimated \$25 million more.

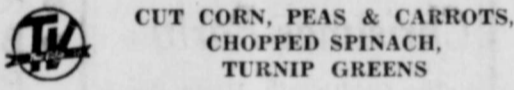
