

AMBITIOUS PROGRAM TOOK FOUR YEARS

he first phase of the Cl mas Decorating program got city's electric department. underway four years ago when it was approved by a committee representing a number of civic groups of the city. At that time, without soliciting funds from merchants, \$800 was raised to purchase eight of the fixtures. A year later the city council voted to purchase an additional 34 of the same type decorations which brought the total to 42. INSTALLATION BY CITY CREWS

The city crews have been responsible for installing the fixtures including the electrical hookups before the holiday season and also taking them down after the holidays and storing them in their original cartons for the next year. The fixtures are stored at the City Hall.

All of the fixtures that are not mounted on utility poles are mounted on steel poles that have been constructed so that they can be taken down after the holidays and also placed in storage. This eliminates a number of poles from the streets during the balance of the year.

INVESTMENT FOR CITIZENS

In addition to the fixtures being purchased by the city all of the cost of pole construction, installation and electric wiring has also been taken care of by the city utilities departments.

This represents a sizable expediture and investment in the neighborhood of \$10,000. It is something that benefits all the residents of the city and reflects a major step forward in the overall progressive attitude and spirit of the citizens of Goldth-

> Added to this experiment is the fact that train service has also been curtailed. Mail service is not handled over long distances with the efficiency which the railroads once provided. Truck-hauled mail has provided additional service in recent years to places and people who had not had the deserved service until this type of transportation was provided. The abandonment of once-used rail facilities, however, has been the cause of some slowdowns. Mail which cannot be dispatched from the collecting point simply waits until there is room for it, which

The Congress has voted to create a Government - owned corporation with the authority to impose a \$40 Billion indebtdness on the Government for handling our mails. There is little doubt that the price of postage will be increased and, of course, it remains to be seen whether the services will be improved. Those of us who voted against this measure wanted more answers than were

may be a matter of days

The vast majority of people employed in the whole Post Office operation are dedicated and want to do the best possible job. The fact that in the supervisory area it is about impossible to get rid of the inefficient, the strikers and goof-offers is another impediment to the service. One working in this capacity has an extra responsibility since he is being paid with taxpayers money. This will probably be the case in the new setup but it is hoped that there may be some provision for getting rid of the deadwood.

There is no need to look for blame but with all the money spent on the postal service, the deficit of which is staggering, there is little excuse for not having better service, whether under the present system or by the new organization.







The project for the month of December for the FHA is to bring Christmas cards to send to the Tuberculosis Hospital in Sanatorium, Texas.




