## Public Urged To Observe Rules On Passing School Bus When Stopped

School officials and local highway patrolmen this week issued an appeal for cooperation and support of the driving public in observing traffic rules that require vehicles to stop when approaching a school bus that is stopped to pick up or discharge students.

This appeal was issued after a mishap Monday morning involving a minor accident on U. S. Highway 84 east of Goldthwaite.

A twelve year old student received bruises and scratches when she was bumped and knocked down as she was crossing the highway to reach the school bus. The car driven by a Waco man attempted to stop but failed to do so in time.

Ronnie Rush, highway patrolman, reported that apparently she was not seriously injured but the mishap could have resulted in a serious accident. The school bus was stopped on the shoulder of the road and the car approaching from the rear, was going around the bus when the accident occurred.

Supt. Gilbert Davis reported Monday that local school bus drivers have reported a number of incidents lately where vehicles failed to stop before passing school buses that are stopped for pick up or delivery of students.

Sometimes the drivers reportedly pass the buses at a high rate of speed without any attempt to observe traffic regulations which require vehicles to stop and proceed at a slow rate of speed around the school bus.

School bus drivers report a number of these violations inside and outside the city limits of Goldthwaite.

Patrolman Rush stated Monday that he and his co-worker, Patrolman Dwain Cohn, will concentrate on checking traffic violations of this type in order to help correct the situation.

The mishap Monday morning was the first accident in Mills County this year involving a pick up or discharge of a student from a school bus.

### Fifty-Eight Buyers Pay \$8,235.60 In Spirited Bids For 99 Animals

Mills County 4-H and FFA boys and girls hit a virtual bonanza as a result of the auction sale of livestock following the 33rd annual Livestock Show held here on January 8 and 9.

Stock show boosters from Goldthwaite, Mullin, Priddy, Brownwood, San Saba, Lometa, and Lampasas did themselves proud when they paid a record price for the livestock sold at Goldthwaite at the Mills County stock show auction sale.

Ninety-nine animals that were sold brought a total of \$8,235.60. In addition to this the Livestock Raisers Association which sponsors the annual show contributed \$653.50 in prize money to the club members. This included the homemaking division.

In all the boys and girls who had exhibits in the show realized a record \$8,889.10 from the projects.

Layton Black, chairman of the sales committee, stated that it was a tremendous sale with an overwhelming response from buyers. The auction sale had been changed from afternoon until 5:30 p. m. Saturday evening. The later hour for the sale, which was held at the Mills County Commission Company facilities, afforded many boosters an opportunity to attend who in previous years were unable to take part in the bidding on stock in person.

The sales committee was elated over the results and the boys and girls who sold stock are still on "cloud nine."

Other members of the sales committee are Y. B. Johnson, Sig Jernigan, Don Geeslin, Joe S. Langford, and John Smith.

Forty-eight lambs sold for a total of \$2,703.95 with an average of \$56.33. Forty-six hogs sold for a total of \$4,026.70 with an average of \$87.53. Five calves sold for a total of \$1,504.95 with an average of \$300.99.

The top selling lamb, sold by Danny Whisenhant, weighed 105 pounds at \$1.10 per pound, for a total of \$115.50 to Stacy's Insurance Agency. The next four highest lambs sold were as follows, with exhibitors, weight, price, and buyers in that order: Sammy Smith, 95 lbs., at \$2c, \$76.90, L. B. Burnham; Craig Smith, 115 lbs., at 80c, \$92.00, Don Geeslin Farms; Jimmy King, 110 lbs., at 80c, \$88.00, Mills County State Bank; and Alfird Bunting, 100 lbs., at 80c, \$80.00, W. O. Kemp — Gulf Distributor.

## School Officials Need Nose Count Of Six Year Olds

School officials in Mills County will need a nose count of all six year olds who will be eligible to start attending public schools this coming fall.

County School Superintendent Cecil Egger announced this week that changes were made the past year and the all-school census will not be taken this year as it has in the past.

Under the new regulations the full census will be taken only every five years he stated. The next all school census will be in 1975 since a full count was made last year, 1970.

However, in order to make plans for the new year, officials of the four Mills County schools will need to have a nose count of the six year olds that expect to start school this fall.

All parents who have children who will be six years old September 1, 1971, are requested to report to school superintendent in their respective district, Goldthwaite, Mullin, Priddy or Star.

With this information plans can be formulated for preschool day activities for those who will be attending school as first graders for the new year.

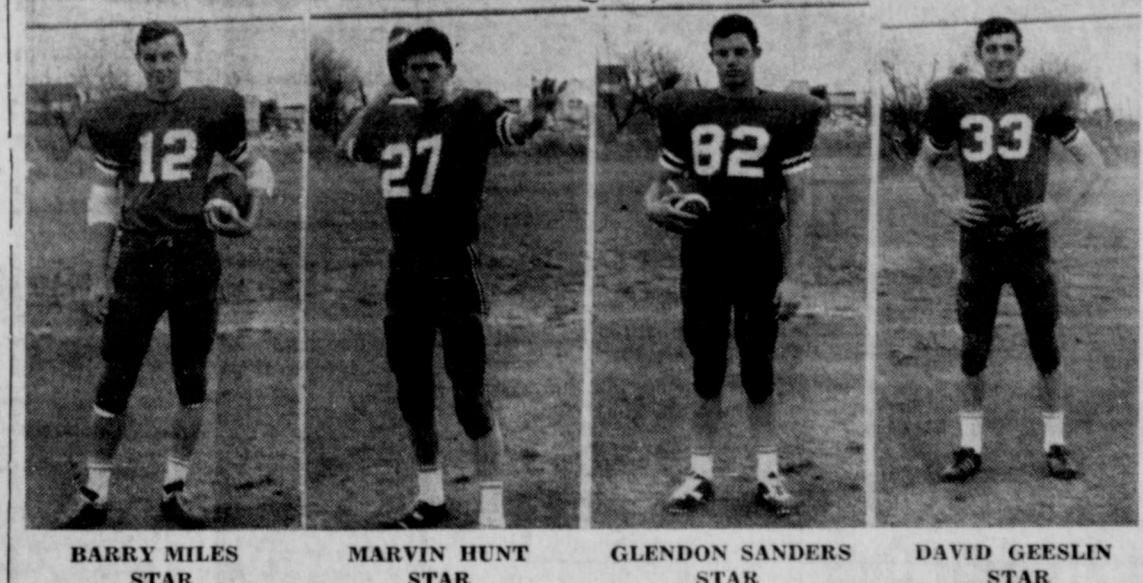
## County Voter Registrations Moving Slowly

Voter registration in Mills County is moving along rather slowly at this time with only 10 days to go before the deadline.

H. G. Brooks, Sheriff, Tax Assessor - Collector, announced that 1,623 county residents had registered by last Friday. This is out of a possible 2,500 that could be expected to register in the county.

Last year, 2,318 residents registered while two years ago the registered list was down to only 2,056.

Residents are reminded again to register before the last few days to avoid the rush which is sure to hit the tax office before the closing deadline on January 31.

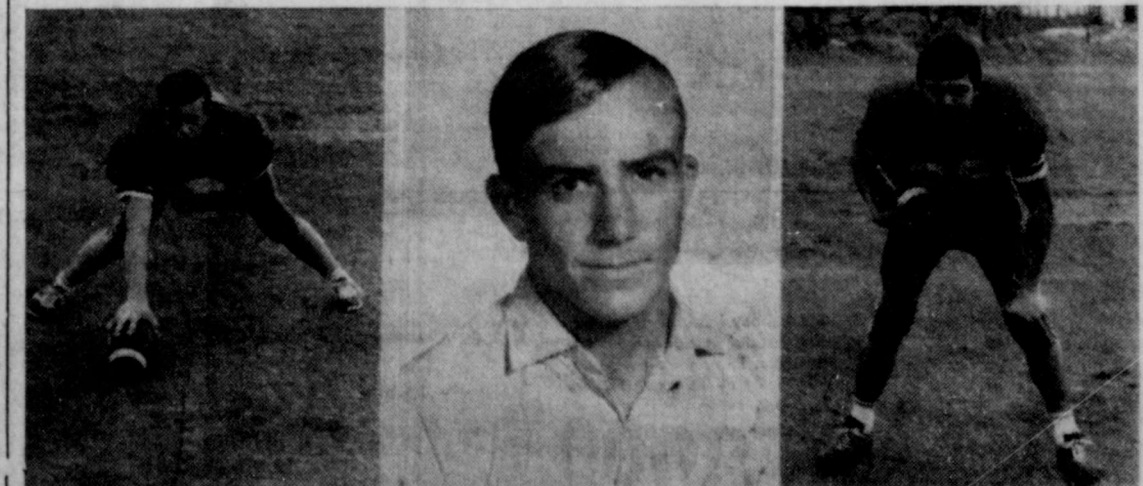

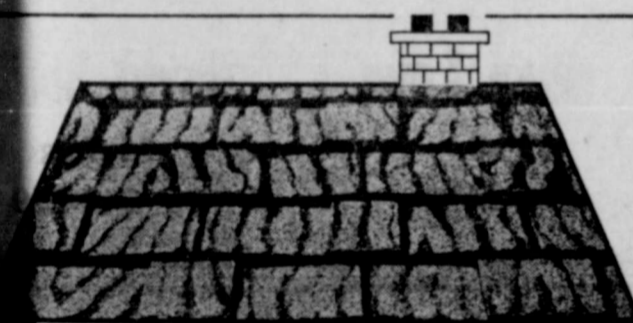

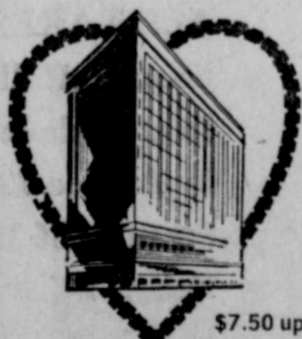

Graveside services were held at 3:30 p. m. Friday at Zephyr Cemetery under the direction of Davis-Morris Funeral Home of Brownwood.

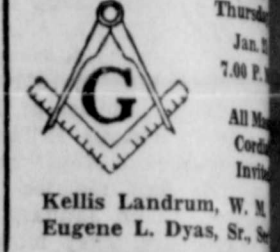

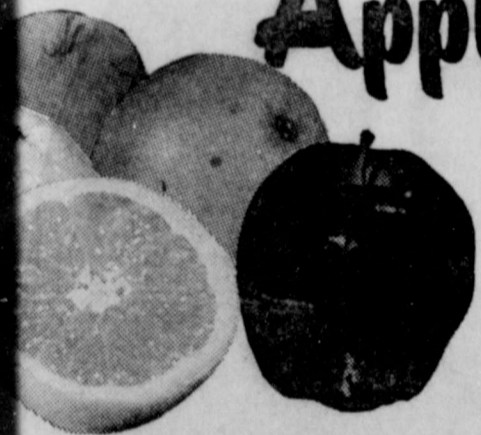

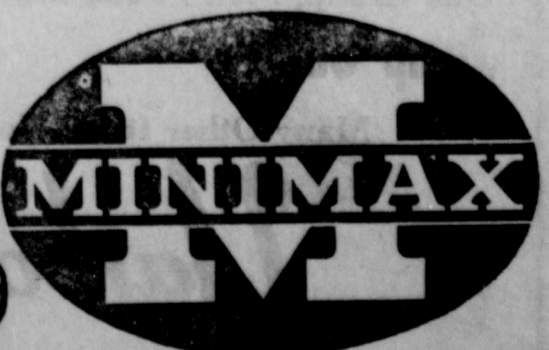
