The 1970 census counted 4,179 white persons in Mills County, lation was white.

The census showed 225 children under 5 years; 787 in ages 5 through 17; 2,129 people 18 through 64; and 1,071 who were 65 and older. The population 14 years and over included 2,370 married people, 437 who were widowed, 88 divorced, and 591 never married.

Mills County's 1970 population was classified as 100 per cent

There were 1,615 households, with 4,083 persons, including 366 one-person households. In addition 129 persons were living in group quarters.

The 1970 census counted 1,979 housing units in Mills County, 1,236 of them occupied by owners, 379 occupied by tenants. and 364 vacant. These included vacant units for seasonal use. The proportion occupied by owners in 1970 was 62.5 per cent compared with 63.4 per cent

Among year-round dwelling units there were 1,872 single family houses, 77 housing units in multi-unit buildings, ,and 18 mobile homes or trailers. 




