Since 1955, four referendums have been called after passage of the Wool Act. Farr states that sheep owners gave "overpayments which are in whelming support to their promotion program in all of the past votes.'

The referendum vote is to be conducted through county Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) feeders are eligible to vote who have owned sheep or lambs, six month of age or older, for any one period of at least 30 days since January 1, 1971. Ballots will be mailed to producers and feeders by June 7 and must be returned to county ASCS offices not later than June 18, Farr emphasized.
