





tanks, if you have fish in your tanks and want to keep them You may lose them due to lack of oxygen in the water if you don't act quick. On very still hot days, the water is not agitated enough to supply the fish with oxygen that they need. Sam Owens has lost many of his fish because of oxygen deficiency even though he has aerated his tank water with a pump. The water needs to be pumped several feet into the air before dropping back into the tank or agitated in some other manner so as to put oxygen into the water.




