While attending Tech he also coached in the elementary school for three years and served one year as assistant backfield coach for Roosevelt High School and coached 9th grade.

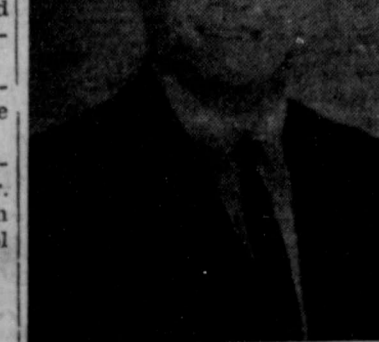
He missed playing only three football games from fifth grade through his senior year in high school. They were the first three games of his freshman year. He played football at Tech his freshman year until he received a knee injury.

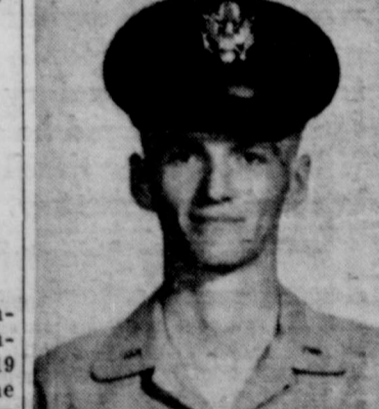

## Dove Season Opens Wednesday

The annual dove season for 1971 in the North Zone of Texas will open this coming Wednesday, September 1, and will run through October 30.

Shooting hours for mourning doves in the north zone, in which Mills County is located, will be 12 noon local time to sunset.

Bag limits for mourning doves will be 10 per day and 20 in possession.

Use of rifles is prohibited by both federal and state laws.

Benny R. Schriver, Game Management Officer for Mills County, reminded hunters this week that shooting from public roads and hunting from motor vehicles on public or private lands is prohibited by law.

He asks that all hunters practice safety first and to show consideration for their hosts, the landowners.

**GUNS MUST BE PLUGGED FOR HUNTING DOVES**  
AUSTIN — A reminder from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department: the recent law change allowing use of "unplugged" shotguns for non-migratory game birds and animals in Texas does not apply to either white-winged doves or mourning doves. Both are migratory birds, so the three-shot limit applies, just as it does to ducks, geese, woodcocks, jacksnipes, rails and gallinules.

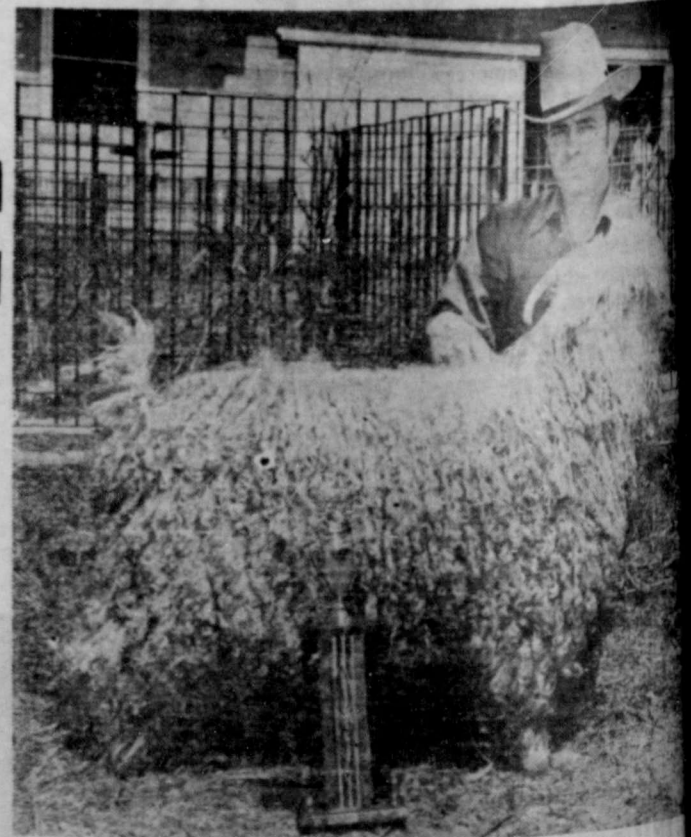

## USDA Offers Conservation Drouth Assistance

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Congressman Omar Burleson has announced that the U. S. Department of Agriculture is offering emergency conservation assistance in 17 additional counties in Texas to help repair damage caused by severe drouth conditions. The counties are Brazos, Brown, Burleson, Collin, Comanche, Cooke, Coryell, Denton, Mills, Nolan, Reagan, Robertson, Taylor, Tom Green, Washington, Williamson, and Wise. They bring to 118 the number of Texas counties eligible for this assistance.

This action was coordinated with the President's Interagency Drouth Committee.

The Department also announced that an additional \$250,000 has been allocated to the Texas Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee for use in sharing with farmers the cost of carrying out practices to combat drouth. This brings to \$7,560,000 the funds allocated during 1971 in Texas for drilling wells, building pipelines, and carrying out other measures to provide water for livestock and to permit grazing where pasture forage exists.

Emergency conservation assistance is designed to enable the Secretary of Agriculture to alleviate conditions resulting from a natural disaster and to restore agricultural lands to productive capacity.

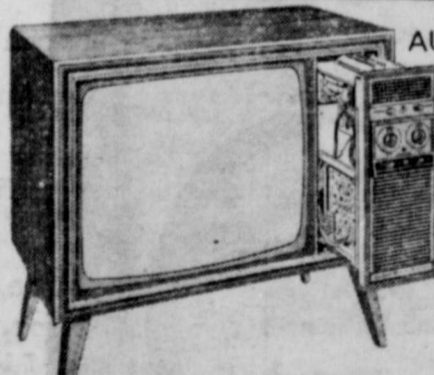

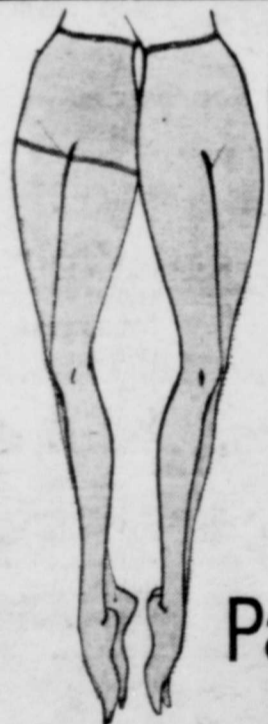
