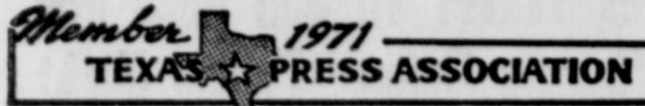

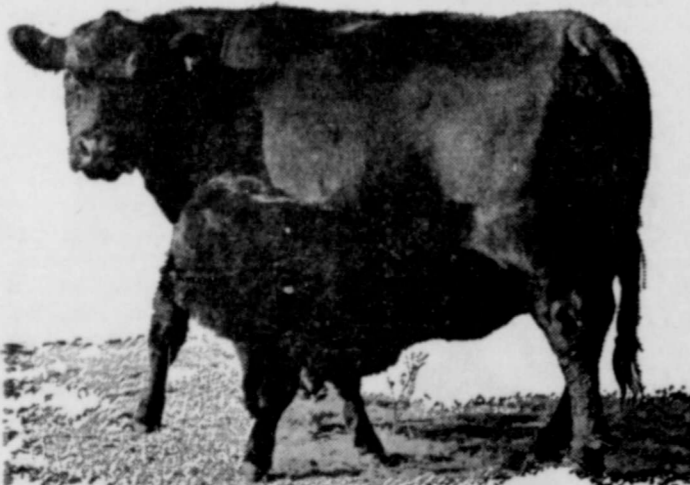

It is about time for 4-H members to begin work on some project. Foods and Nutrition is a favorite project and one that is soon to begin. This project helps 4-H members to develop leadership talents and to develop confidence in speaking to a group. They also develop skill in buying foods and in planning, preparation, and service of nutritious meals. Members also develop an enjoyment of food and food preparation.

Project groups are conducted for all age groups from 9 to 19. Each group studies nutrition and learns to cook several nutritious dishes. The culmination of the project is a County Food Show in which each member prepares a dish and displays it in an appropriate table setting. Taking part in the foods project helps members to gain experience in cooking and preparing for the foods division of the Mills County Livestock Show which is held in January of each year.

There will be a meeting of adult foods leaders on Thursday, September 16, at 7:30 p. m. in the office of the Home Demonstration Agent. This will be especially helpful to new leaders, but information given will be new to experienced leaders.

There is now a 4-H Club in Goldthwaite, as well as Mullin, Star, and Priddy. Each of these communities will have foods groups. Everyone is invited to take part in 4-H work. If you are not now a member, plan to attend the next meeting in your area and to select a project group.

For further information contact the organization leader of your 4-H Club or the County Home Demonstration Agent.

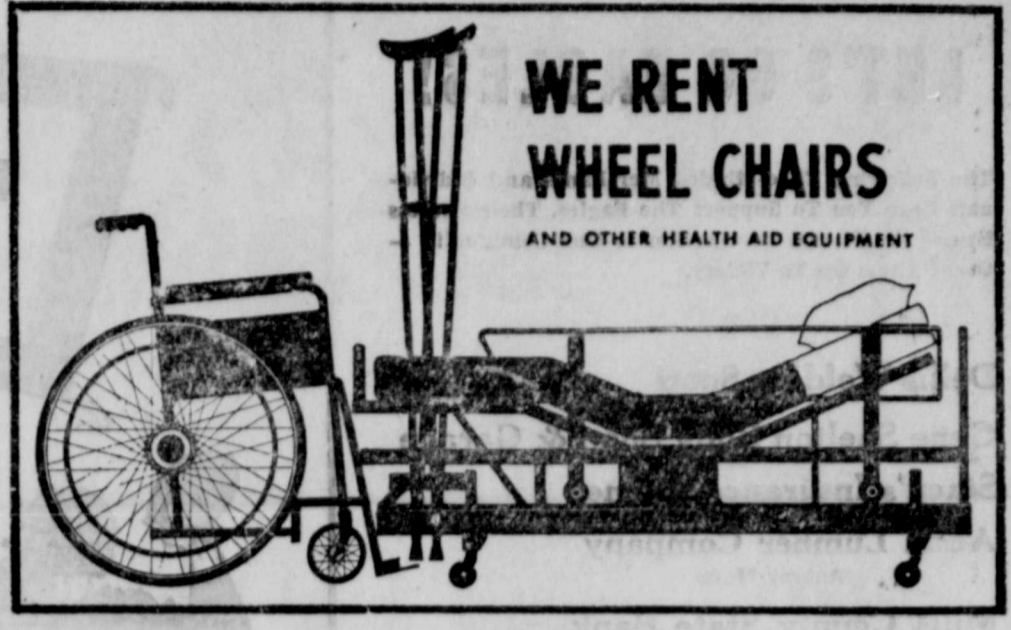
