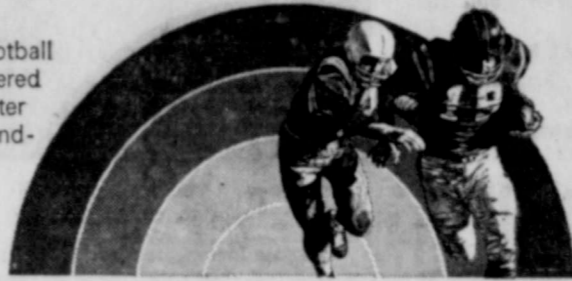

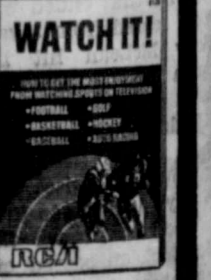

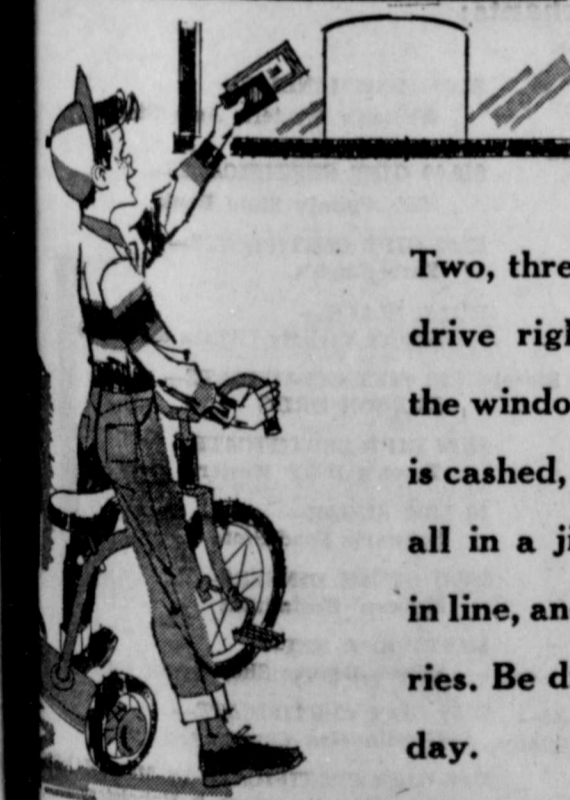

County Agricultural Agent

Screwworms may be in Mills County, folks. Several years ago the screwworms took away a big majority of our profits in the livestock industry every year, but through hard work and effort by producers and researchers, we have had several years of relief from the screwworm. However, we got lazy and quit taking precautions against them. Now, they are threatening another bad outbreak.

Known screwworm cases have been reported at San Saba, Bend, Lampasas, Lometa, and Adamsville all of which are at our back door in Mills County. Producers should take strict precaution in all dehorning, castration, docking, and other open wounds. Livestock should be sprayed for flies with any good stock spray such as Co-Ral, Sevin, Malathion, Methoxychlor, Toxaphene, or any other recommended spray.

A sample of any detected worm cases should be collected and sent off to be analyzed for screwworm identification. Vials for collecting worms and mailing can be obtained from the County Agent, feed dealers, or Ronnie Davis, Animal Health Commission agent in Goldthwaite. After a sample has been collected, the wound should be cleaned and doctored with some type of wound treatment such as Lindane smear, Co-Ral 5% dust, Korlan smear, or any other recommended treatment.

The Mills County 4-H Adult Leaders Association will hold their regular monthly meeting with a barbecue being their main topic of concern. The barbecue will be held Saturday, October 2, at 7:30 p. m. at the Park in Goldthwaite.
