Eagles Roll Past Mustangs, 23-13; Meet Mason Cowpunchers Friday

Goldthwaite Eagles proved that they can come from behind as they dumped the Marble Falls Mustangs 23-13 in non-district football action here on Eagle Field last Friday.

The visiting Mustangs smelled trouble from the opening kick-off as the ball hit an Eagle player, bounced off, and was recovered by Goldthwaite's Reggie Robbins on the Mustangs' 45 yard line.

Quarterback Johnny Johnson hit Bennie Humphries with a nine-yard TD pass in the first

period to give the Golden Eagles a 6-0 lead. The conversion try went wide.

Mustang quarterback Steve Jones scampered eight yards in the second quarter to tie the game 6-6 at halftime.

After intermission neither team could muster a score in the third period.

However, in the final period of play the Eagles sent the Mustangs into a state of shock. Johnson booted a 17-yard three pointer early in the fourth to give Goldthwaite a 9-6 lead. Then he scored on a five-yard run and hit Humphries on a two-point conversion.

The Eagles' scoring was rounded out as halfback Reggie Robbins took the ball 35 yards for a TD with only 35 seconds left in the game. The extra point was blocked.

With only five seconds left on the clock Mustang quarterback Jones hit Stuart Nannally on a 93 yard TD pass. The PAT was good, but short of a victory over the Eagles as the score at the end of the game stood 23-13.

This win over the Mustangs brings Goldthwaite's record to 3-1 so far for the season.
