One of the largest sale of goats to come off one ranch in Mills County in many years—if not the largest in all history—was made when W. P. McCullough sold off his ranch north of Goldthwaite 2,750 head of goats to the Raegelein Provision Company in San Antonio.

The cheeriest days of the year are coming — Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Eve and Day. Visiting and entertaining, special foods, decorations and thoughtful gifts are things all of us want to have a part in.

We want to turn out delectable dishes and decorations, enjoy every bit of company, conversation, children's activities, and still manage to look radiant and relaxed. How can we do it? The trick is to "Think Christmas" long before the spirit of the season is at hand. There is so much that can be done in advance.

Get through the planning stage right now. Make calendar sheets for November and December with large blocks for each day from now 'til Christmas. Then write all the "things to do." Such work sheets help to keep the schedule of cleaning, cooking, shopping, card writing, and decorating rolling smoothly.

Decide what parties and activities will be part of your family's celebrating. Except for the holidays themselves, the exact dates can be tentative. Check recipes and plan menus for these events. Look for some do-ahead - and - freeze ideas to lighten party day kitchen duties.

Plan one or two "bulk" cooking days when you can cook a number of meal mainstays in advance. This "pantry" will provide interesting and quick dinners when time is running short. Collective cooking has other advantage. It is time saving. Just one clean-up is needed.

With menus planned, it is easy to decide what serving pieces will be needed. These, along with good china, crystal, and silver can be set aside for washing and polishing and can be put in protective wrapping for the first holiday event. Organizing menus and recipes well ahead allows you to plan one or two big grocery shopping trips for staple and non-perishable items. This is a real time saver too.

Statement to the Public and the Customers of Brownwood Cattle Auction, Inc. of Brownwood, Texas

For several years Brownwood Cattle Auction, Inc. has conducted an auction ring in Brownwood, Texas under the sole ownership of Wayne May. On last Sunday, November 7, 1971, and under a Washington date line, an article appeared in many papers in this area to the effect that Brownwood Cattle Auction, Inc. had been charged with various violations by the Department of Agriculture and that there was a shortage in its trust or custodial account. To set the record straight the company desires to make the following statement:

(1) There is no substantial substance to these allegations. For your information, the Department of Agriculture classifies as a shortage any cattle not paid for in 48 hours and under certain circumstances, due to certain blood testing and pregnancy testing and of the cattle sold, sales cannot be finalized within this period. We have collected every dollar owed for cattle sold by us in our auction ring and our records so reflect.

(2) The company has been authorized by Mr. Fred Pierson, auditor for the United States Department of Agriculture in its area office, 819 Taylor Street, Room 7A15, Fort Worth, Texas, 76102, telephone number Area Code 817, 334-3286, to state that there is no deficit or shortage in any of its custodial accounts and this may be verified by either calling or writing Mr. Pierson at the above address and number.

(3) The company has never failed to pay for any livestock purchased and all checks issued by it have been honored, and these facts may be verified by calling or writing First National Bank in Brownwood, Texas.

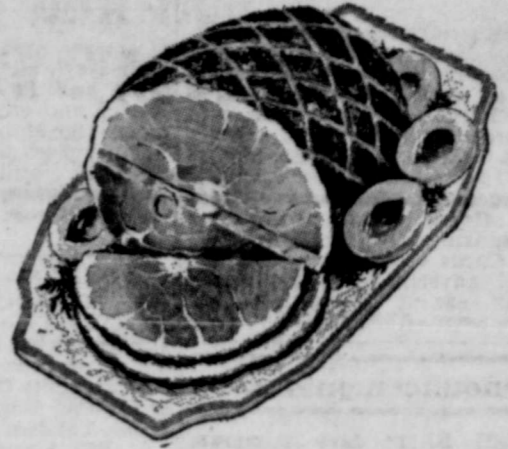

Crisp, Cool November Days Encourage Big Hunting Season

Dove season brought a gleam to the eyes of hunters, but it is November which puts that

extra bounce in their step, sends them into the hills and valleys and into marshes and timbered country for deer, javelina, duck, geese, quail and turkey

Previews of the season have already been obtained by bow hunters, who took advantage of the special archery season which began in October.

In addition to the hunting season, most real fishermen are keeping their gear in shape for the excellent fishing which continues through the fall and winter in Texas.

What you have in Texas now

—in addition to the exhilarating thrill of being out in the open hunting, camping and fishing—is the chance for accidents. Good health and hunting safety go together, says Texas State Department of Health officials.

While most hunters look on themselves as Daniel Boones, far too many should never leave their television sets and comfortable arm chairs. They are the people who are out of shape, out of practice in handling their rifles and shotguns, and out of touch with good safety habits.

Safety in the field is a vital part of any hunting trip, and it takes some thought and planning to make sure that your trip doesn't end in tragedy. How many people do you know who carry loaded guns in their cars,

climb into their blinds with guns loaded, or walk around with the safety of their rifles or shotguns off and a shell in the chamber, point their weapons at others, and bring their loaded guns into the camp-house.

Caution is something which all persons should exercise thru out every day of the year, but extra precautions against injury—and perhaps death—should be taken when you're outside of your natural element.

Safety authorities strongly recommend the use of blaze orange clothing as a safeguard against becoming a statistic. Too many hunters are mistaken for game by over-anxious, careless hunters.

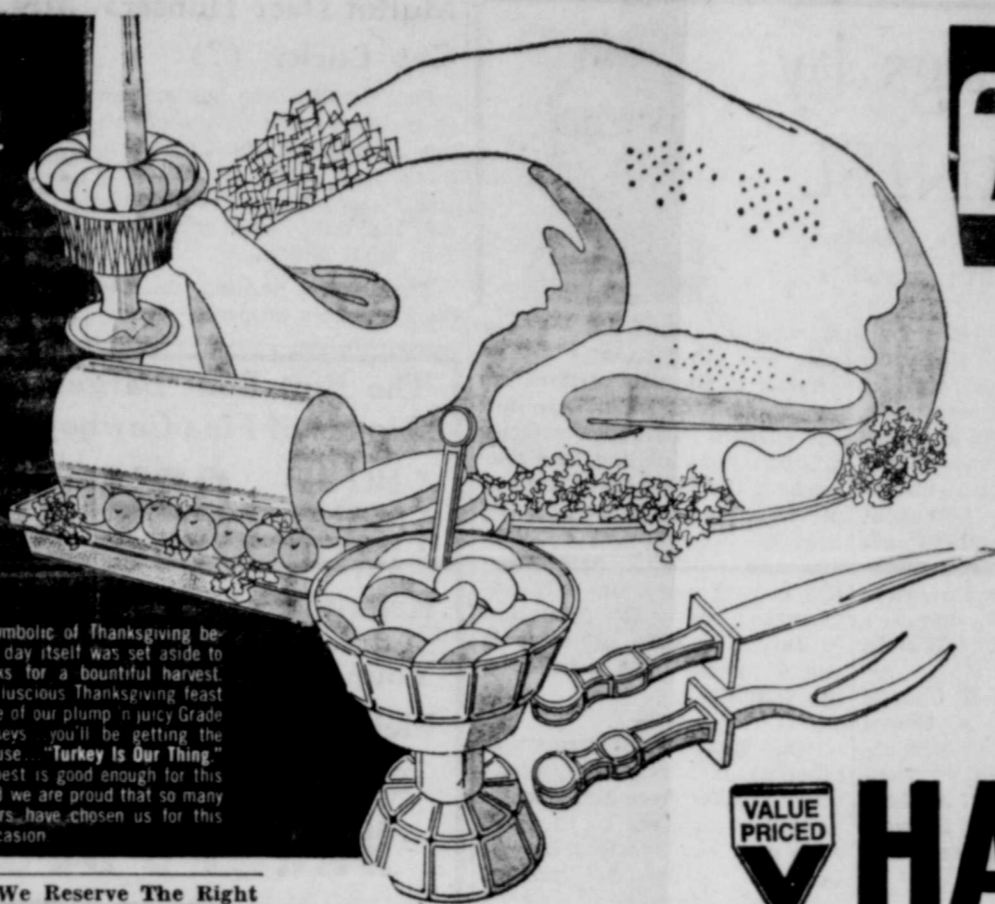

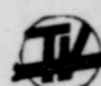
