In Brownwood**

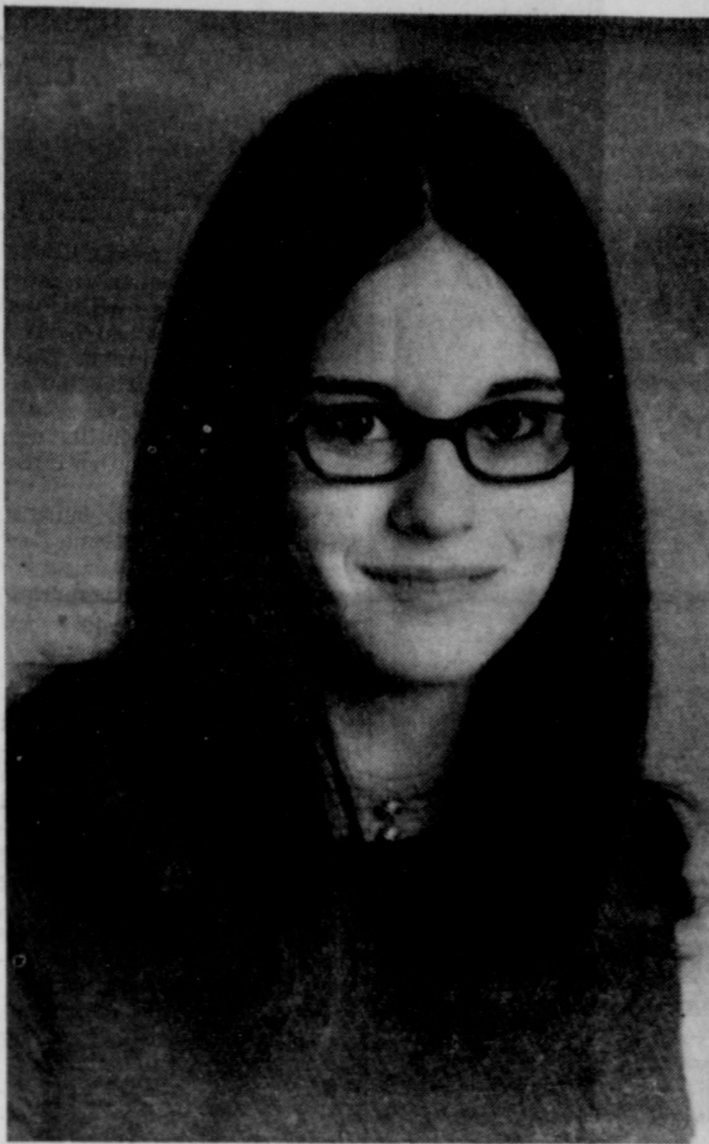

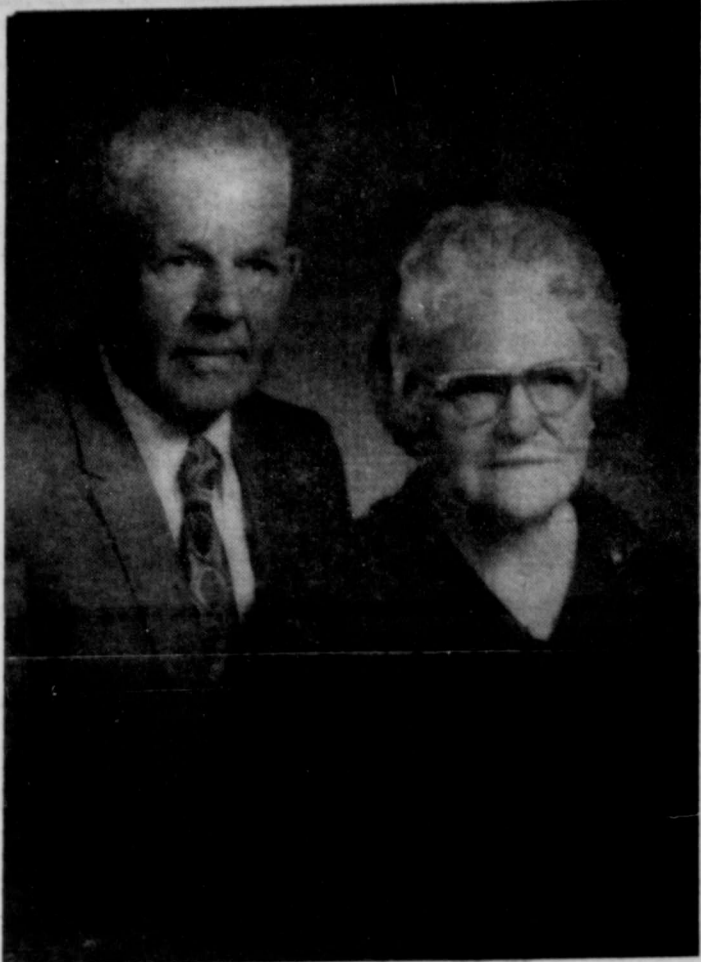

Legislature Fails To Pass Strong Driver License Bill

Gov. Preston Smith this week expressed disappointment that the Legislature failed to pass a driver license bill which would have strongly tightened court treatment of drunk drivers and chronic violators, and indicated he may submit the measure to the lawmakers during the coming special session.

Speaking in Austin during the third annual Public Support Conference on Traffic Safety, the Governor said, "we simply cannot tolerate continued slaughter on Texas streets and highways."

Gov. Smith said a delegation of citizens from San Antonio

had asked him to submit the measure to the special session which he will call, probably next year. "We assured them that we would continue to give serious consideration to this situation," he said. "We have recommended legislative action on this in the past and will seek to obtain it in the future."

Subjects considered by the Legislature during a special session are limited to those given it by the Governor. The measure he had reference to would change provisions of the law which "allow continual lenient probation in driver license suspension."

News From Your

COUNTY HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT



Packaging and freezing poultry in the home is an excellent way to serve high quality, nutritious and economical food to your family year round. Much money can be saved by purchasing whole broilers on special at the market, then cutting and packaging them for the freezer.

A new Extension bulletin, "Freezing Poultry for Home Use" gives details on chicken cut-up and packaging and preparing poultry and cooked dishes for freezing.

Certain steps should be followed in packaging and freezing poultry to make the work easier and to insure high quality products. Cleanliness is an important key to successful freezing. Having the product ready-to-cook helps insure cleanliness, and makes freezing preparation much easier. Also, keep the cutting board, knives and all utensils clean throughout the preparation period.

Work at a relatively fast pace, and place the product in the freezer as soon as possible.

Set the thermostat at -20 degrees F., if possible, and definitely not higher than 0 degrees F. Use a thermometer.

Use plenty of free flowing water to thoroughly wash the birds prior to packaging. Use a moisture-vapor proof packaging material or container. Be sure to use a very sharp knife and a cutting board.

Select choice birds. Remember, it is impossible to improve the quality of product by freezing it. Instead, the goal of freezing is only to maintain high quality poultry. For best freezing, follow these tips: have freezer temperature as low as possible; space packages so they don't touch; avoid overloading the freezer; be sure all packages are sealed, and use a recommended freezer tape on all packages.

Remember, air in the package contributes to freezer burn and rancidity.

Besides freezing fresh poultry, you can also freeze turkey leftovers to be used later. In making pot pies, turkey casseroles or other combination dishes, cool food dishes immediately after cooking. Cooling stops the cooking process and helps preserve the natural food flavor, color and texture. To prevent vegetables and other ingredients from becoming too soft or having a warmed-over taste when reheated, slightly undercook the initial

product.

Several methods can be used for thawing frozen foods. Thawing time will depend on the package size as well as the method used. One technique is to place the package on a plate or pan in the refrigerator. Or place the frozen item on counter at room temperature. Thawing at room temperature requires less time, but the food must be checked more often than when defrosted in the refrigerator. If the package is truly moisture proof, the food may be placed in a bowl of cold water or under cool running tap water.

For best results with all defrosting methods, leave the food in its freezer packaging during the thawing period. Foods should also be cooked as soon as possible.

With a little planning, you can enjoy your special holiday turkey meal, then have interesting turkey dishes throughout the following weeks.

Each year, the average American consumes a 155.8 pound combination of wheat, rye, rice, corn, oats and barley.

There has been recent evidence in Mills County of homeowners having problems with stinging caterpillars. Asps, puss caterpillar, saddle-back caterpillar, and stinging caterpillars are common names applied to a specific group of moth larvae.

This group of larvae have venomous hair or spines which secrete a substance which burns the skin when one comes into contact with the larvae. The sting produced on the skin from larvae of this type is extremely painful but not fatal. Some persons are highly sensitive to insect venoms and illness, swelling, itching and extreme pain may be associated with this pest.

The larvae stage is the only development stage which results in the "stinging" problems. Larvae of this group feed on many shade trees and is common on citrus, hackberry, elm, plum, sycamore, oak and rosebushes.

In cases of stings by these caterpillars, immediate first aid should be given. Among the skin treatments that are suggested include ice packs, a solution of household ammonia and bicarbonate of soda. These treatments are only slightly effective and if symptoms are severe, a physician should be consulted.

These pests can be controlled with a 5% Sevin spray. Spray trees and bushes until run-off. There may be several generations per year, so respraying may be necessary.

The withdrawal time of diethylstilbestrol (DES) from livestock rations prior to slaughter has now been extended to seven days. Withdrawal time for

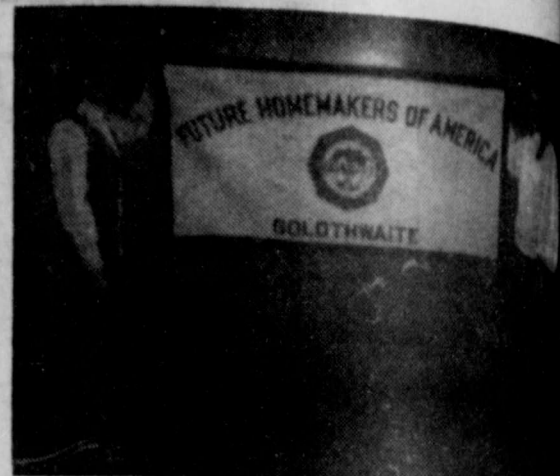
the growth promoting hormone had previously been 48 hours.

The extension of the withdrawal time stems from recent findings of DES residues in beef liver samples. However, no residues have been found in muscle tissue from these cattle. The use of DES is regulated by the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the Food and Drug Administration. DES residues are prohibited by law in meat for human consumption.

The hormone is used in many young animals to stimulate growth and is used as a feed additive in most feedlot operations. Feedlots have come under close scrutiny recently regarding the use of DES. Feedlot managers shipping cattle to slaughter must now certify that the animals have been withdrawn from DES for the prescribed length of time. Violations of this directive can result in legal action against beef cattle producers.

A note of interest from the ASCS office: additional funds for 1971 REAP (Rural Environment Assistance Program) have enabled the County ASCS Committee to raise the individual limitation from \$250 to \$400. Practices must be completed by December 15 and reported by December 31, 1971. If you have earned less than \$400 for REAP practices during 1971, you may apply for cost share assistance for control of brush, cross fences, stock tanks, and livestock wells and pipelines.

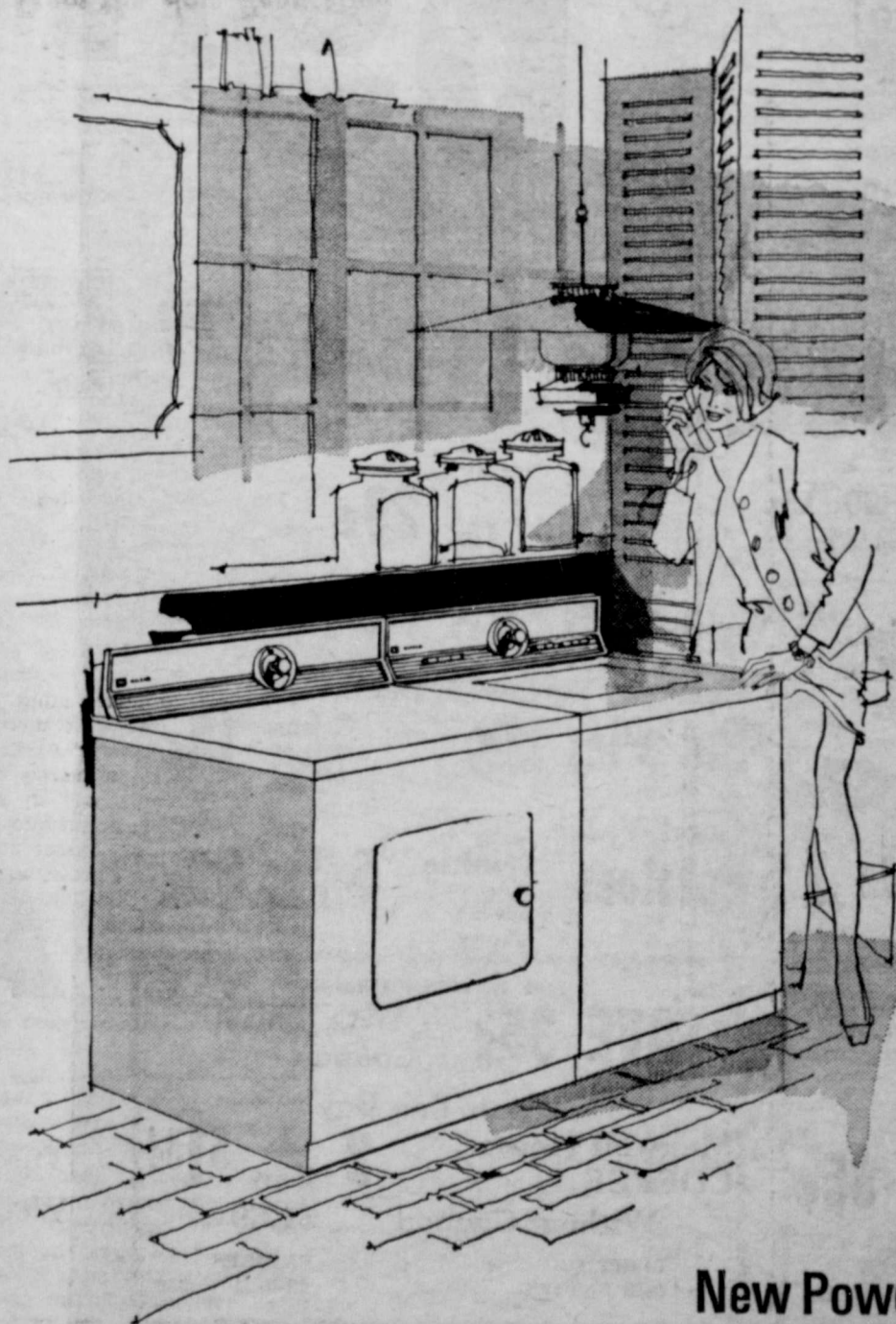

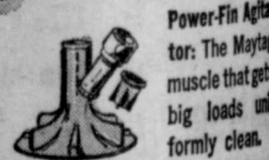
