





The percentage will be that required to raise the national average price treats chairman. received by all producers from shorn wool up to the announced incentive price of 72 cents a lb. For example, payments on 1970 marketings, which began in April, were made at the rate of 102.8 percent of the dollar return each producer received

from the sale of shorn wool. This percentage was based on the difference between the incentive price of 72 cents and the national average grower price of 35.5 cents a pound. Mohair payments will be calculated in a manner similar to wool.

Payments to producers on the 1972 calendar year marketings will be made beginning in April 1973. Applications for such payments must be filed not later than January 31, 1973.
