He was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He was not attended at birth by a doctor. He and his mother never saw a hospital.

He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. He asked for water and he was given vinegar to drink. While he was dying, his executioners gambled for his clothing, the only property he had on earth. When he was dead, he was laid in a borrowed grave, the gift of a friend's pity.

Nineteen centuries have come and gone, and today he is the central figure of the human race and the leader of mankind's progress. All the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed, all the parliaments that ever sat, all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man as much as that ...





We hope * * * GIFT IDEAS Making Potpourris and Pom-• Lenel anders for gifts is an idea that should be filed away for next Clairol year under Christmas gifts you can make yourself. The following information came from an interesting article by William Perfumes D. Adams, Harris County Ornamental Horticulturist. It is a little late to make a potpourri Billfolds this year, but pomanders can be made any time. Here are the ingredients for both. Sets A potpourri is defined in Webster's Dictionary as: "A mixture, as of spiced flower pet-

als in a jar, used to scent a room." Fragrant leaves can be used equally as well as flower petals; however, so don't ignore leaves of the lemon-verbena. scented geraniums, rosemary, mint, and thyme just because you have no rose petals.

To make a potpurri, begin by drying petals or leaves on sheets of newspaper in a dark. dry room (this takes a week or 10 days). For one quart of dried petals or leaves add one ounce of orrisroot. This should be sprinkled between layers of the plant material. In addition. about 1/2 teaspoon of spices, such as cloves, allspice, orange or lemon peel (grated and dried), cinnamon, sassafras. coriander, and mace can also be added. Keep these ingredients in a covered earthenware container until ready to use. Then by removing the cover and stirring the contents you can relive a summer evening in the rose garden.

If you don't have the patience to wait for the plant materials to dry thoroughly, you can make a "wet potpourri" by slightly drying the plant materials (2-3 days) and sprinkling salt between the layers using the same ingredients as suggested above. Let this stand for several weeks before stir-







Natural Beauty Seen In Mills County Chappell Hill

By CHARLES F. STUDER **District** Conservationist

"I lift mine eyes unto the hills from which cometh my farm this year grazing on Win-Testament, might well reflect present conditions in the Brown-Mills Soil and Water Conservation District. This condition is a result of resource conservation measures being applied through the Great Plains Conservation Program, watershed protection, and flood prevention programs of the Soil Conservation Service. These things have happened because land users have applied conservation measures to their land. They believe that beside being profitable, these measures enhance the land for beauty, recreation, and wildlife.

The words of the son "America The Beautiful" comes to mind as you pass through this Soil and Water Conservation District. Natural springs are flowing, oak leaves are turning red on the trees, and deer are running in the draws and along the streams.

District Director Hubert Meyer produced a "Sea of Grass" on his farm this year even under unfavorable moisture conditions present earlier in the year. This beautiful countryside is five miles north of Goldthwaite. Meyer obtained the "Sea of Grass" by converting an old needlegrass pasture to an improved Kleingrass pasture. Large oak trees were left for beauty and shade.

Eddie Dryman, who stock farms northeast of Goldthwaite, has observed several deer on his

strength," as stated in the Old tergreen Harding grass. Prior to the planting of this improved cool season bunchgrass, deer were seen only occasionally as day they passed through his place.
