## Farm Program Signup Increasing March 10 Deadline Draws Near

Farmers are coming in to the Mills County ASCS to sign up in the 1972 program, wheat, and cotton. With 125 enrolled to date and another 125 to 150 expected before the March 10 closing of the sign-up period.

New farm program options opened by the U. S. Department of Agriculture in January and February after early announcement of the program last fall. New options for additional set-aside acreage at higher payment rates for corn, grain sorghum, and wheat were added. Detailed information on these options and provisions of the 1972 set-aside farm programs are available from the County ASCS Office.

"Probably most producers now have been acquainted with the details of these new options, have studied them, and are now beginning to come back in to the ASCS Office to sign up," English said.

With perhaps another 150 farmers in Mills County still planning to sign up in the 1972 farm set-aside programs between now and March 10, the best chance of avoiding waiting in line is to come in to the ASCS Office as soon as possible.

"Judging from past experience, the largest number come in during final days of the enrollment period, and so the way to beat the rush is to come in now," English added.

He reminded producers that it is convenient to request early set-aside inspection and measurement service, provided at cost, when they sign up. "Of course, anyone who has already signed up for the 1972 farm programs, but who overlooked requesting set-aside inspection and measurement service, can get his request in at any time. The earlier a request is made, the earlier the set-aside inspection and measurement service will be performed," English said.


### FINANCIAL REPORT ON G'WAITE-MASON BI-DISTRICT GAME

## Head Start Program To Be Sponsored At Goldthwaite Again This Year

The Goldthwaite Independent School District will have a Head Start program again this year according to an announcement by Supt. Gilbert Davis.

The program is sponsored entirely from the Federal Government and not from any local taxes. This would include any student that would be interested from Goldthwaite, Mullin or Star. Priddy has a program of its own.

Anyone interested in their children attending this Head Start Program should contact the superintendent's office for

the necessary forms to enroll students. The student should be age five or six. They are prepared for starting to school next year or the year thereafter.

Anyone interested in teaching, being a teacher's aid, cook or nurse should contact the Superintendent's office for applications. A committee will recommend these people to the local school board. This committee will also set up standards and qualifications for the school.

Supt. Davis urges those with applications to get them to his office as soon as possible.

## Construction Of Four Floodwater Structures To Be Bid On March 22

The Mills County Commissioners' Court and Directors of the Brown-Mills Soil and Water Conservation District, co-sponsors of the Brown-Mullin Creek Watershed, were notified by Charles Studer that notices were recently sent out to prospective bidders for the construction of four floodwater retaining structures on Sites 1, 3, 6 and 7 of the Brown-Mullin Creek Watershed.

This watershed is located in Mills County. Sealed bids will be opened at 10 a. m. for Sites 1 and 3 and at 2 p. m. for Sites 6 and 7 on March 22, 1972 at the

SCS State office on South Main Street in Temple. Sites 1 and 3 are on the M. E. Wylie and A. G. Wasserman ranches located some two miles north of Mullin. Sites 6 and 7 are on the Don and Kent Geeslin Farms located three to five miles north of Goldthwaite. The estimated price range for the four FP structures is \$212,500 to \$283,500. A twenty-two year old Mexican National was apprehended last Thursday afternoon by law enforcement officers, after he was located by airplane near San Saba Peak. The man, Abel



A New Zealand government field officer was in Goldthwaite and Mills County last week surveying our methods of raising Angora Goats.

James F. Wickens, who is employed by the New Zealand department of Lands and Surveys, visited the area to gather facts on the mohair business. He was accompanied by David Watters of Goldthwaite, who is the secretary of the Texas Angora Goat Raisers' Association.

Mr. Wickens, who is combining holiday with the study, attended the San Antonio Live-

stock Show and Rodeo and noted Texas' many cattle breeds.

New Zealand does not have a large Angora Goat program and the government is trying to see if the mohair business would be feasible in New Zealand.

Mr. Wickens surveyed the goat business of Australia last year and he reports the growing of mohair could be very profitable to New Zealand ranches.

Present-Day Candidates Don't  
Know What Campaigning Is About

(Editor's Note: A 1922 newspaper clipping from J. B. Wigley's scrapbook which was discovered by his daughter, Mrs. Bertha Weathers was brought in this week. It concerned a candidate of 1886 and was headlined "John S. Chesser Gives His Experience As A Candidate In 1886". See if it parallels any with the political campaigns of 1972.)

Below is the article as it appeared:

"Away back in the misty days of 1886, John S. Chesser was a candidate for county clerk of Mills county, subject to the action of some party he doesn't remember which. Those were the 'good old days' of long ago, and then, there were but few people residing in the county. There are some few here now who were here then, but very few and their heads are white as driven snow. J. S. had just graduated from the leading college in this section of the state, which was located at Williams Ranch. He was in his twenties, handsome, he thought, and knew but little of the ways that were dark and tricks that were vain that went with the political game. He had a burning desire to serve his country in some honorable way he knew no better way than to be a trusty keeper of the county records, hence he became a candidate for county clerk. He recently related the experiences of that campaign to his friends, 'Dud' Karnes, who is now a candidate for a county office:

"'Dud', thus spoke the venerable gentleman of 86, 'my experience as a candidate might be of some importance to you and if you would like to know it I will be pleased to hand it out to you. 'Go ahead', says Mr. Karnes. 'All right', I will proceed, but first give me a chew tobacco and then I will begin," said Mr. Chesser, as he wiped his mouth with his coat sleeve.

"As stated before, it was in '86 that I made the race for county clerk of Mills county. In those days there were but few people residing here and most of them lived far apart, only in some instances. That was the days before the automobile and we made the campaign by riding Spanish ponies,' continued J. S. as he reached forward to make a deposit in the cuspidor, but missed it several inches and it fell heavily upon the concrete floor of the courthouse. 'It would require weeks of hard riding to get over the county and some days I would ride all day and never come in contact with a voter. But the election

finally came on and here is the results of the campaign: First, came the loss of 2371 hours of sleep thinking about the election, spent two weeks in bed and three weeks on crutches and lost considerable hair in a personal encounter with an opponent, donated three beeves, seven shoats and nine goats to county barbecues, gave away one dozen pair of suspenders, thirteen calico dresses, two cases chewing gum, one box Cili-max chewing tobacco, spent \$2919 in cash, kissed 514 babies, put up 15 stoves, kindled 63 fires, walked 2343 miles, shook hands with 9532 people, told 7130 lies, talked enough to make 6526 columns in print, attended 16 revivals, joined the church 7 times, Baptized 3 times, contributed \$9.14 to foreign missions, made love to 27 widows, hugged 23 old maids, got dog bit 19 times and was defeated by 165 votes."

### Goldthwaite Public Schools

Payroll during the year totals \$217,175 which is paid to 50 members of the faculty and employees.

Annual budget for the Goldthwaite school system this year is \$323,282. This does not include lunchroom operations.

There are 26 teachers and administrators in the school system.

The school system operates seven buses and one private carrier driving approximately 102,000 miles per year.

Estimated value of school buildings, land and equipment and all physical facilities of the district would run in the neighborhood of \$750,000. These include Elementary School, High School, Gymnasium, Stadium, Agriculture Building, Storage Building, High School Lunchroom, and approximately 80 acres of land.

Total enrollment for the 1971-72 year has now reached 442 pupils for both high school, junior high and elementary school.

Goldthwaite Schools operate two modern lunchrooms serving an average of 340 meals daily and total expected for the year of 62,000.

# THE MILLS MINISTER

The so-called "generation gap" is not new. But between many modern youth and their elders there is something more than the traditional generation gap. The youth are questioning the system itself. I feel that

there are two things that will go a long way toward closing this gap. They are communication and an understanding spirit.

To the adults I would say, "Try to understand our youth." The younger generation objects to the hypocrisy of the adult world. Adults, they say, give lip

service to personal virtues which they do not practice. They try to impose upon the younger generation certain standards of sexual purity in a world in which adults largely ignore those standards. They preach the virtues of honesty and integrity, while engaging in business which survives by means of deception. They verbally the principles of democracy and Christianity, but they operate on the basis of economic determinism. They talk about the importance of law and order but observe only those laws which are profitable for them to observe. The youth are challenging values and raising questions about things which adults have considered self-evident. Adults talk about truth and youth say, "who is to

say what is true?" I, for one, support this questioning, but differ on the methods used in raising these questions. Most often we are defensive about our beliefs. When anyone questions our beliefs, we try to support them rather than try to find out if they are really correct. So many of the beliefs of this generation have been challenged that adults tend to over-react. It is time therefore, for Christians to concern themselves with more than appearances and concern themselves with fundamental issues and their application in life. I believe that these fundamental issues find their answer in the Holy Scriptures. To the youth I would say, "Try these suggestions on communication with parents drawn

up by a minister in Neenah, Wisconsin."  
1. Don't be afraid to speak their language. Try using strange sounding phrases like, "I'll help," and "yes, I'd be glad to."

4. Encourage your parents to talk about their problems. Try to keep in mind that to them things like earning a living seem important.  
5. Be tolerant of their ap-

pearance. When your Dad gets a haircut, don't feel personally humiliated. Remember, it's important to him to look like his peers.  
6. Most important of all: If they do something you consider wrong, let them know it's their behavior you dislike, not themselves. Remember parents need to feel they are loved. TRY THESE, THEY MAY WORK.


