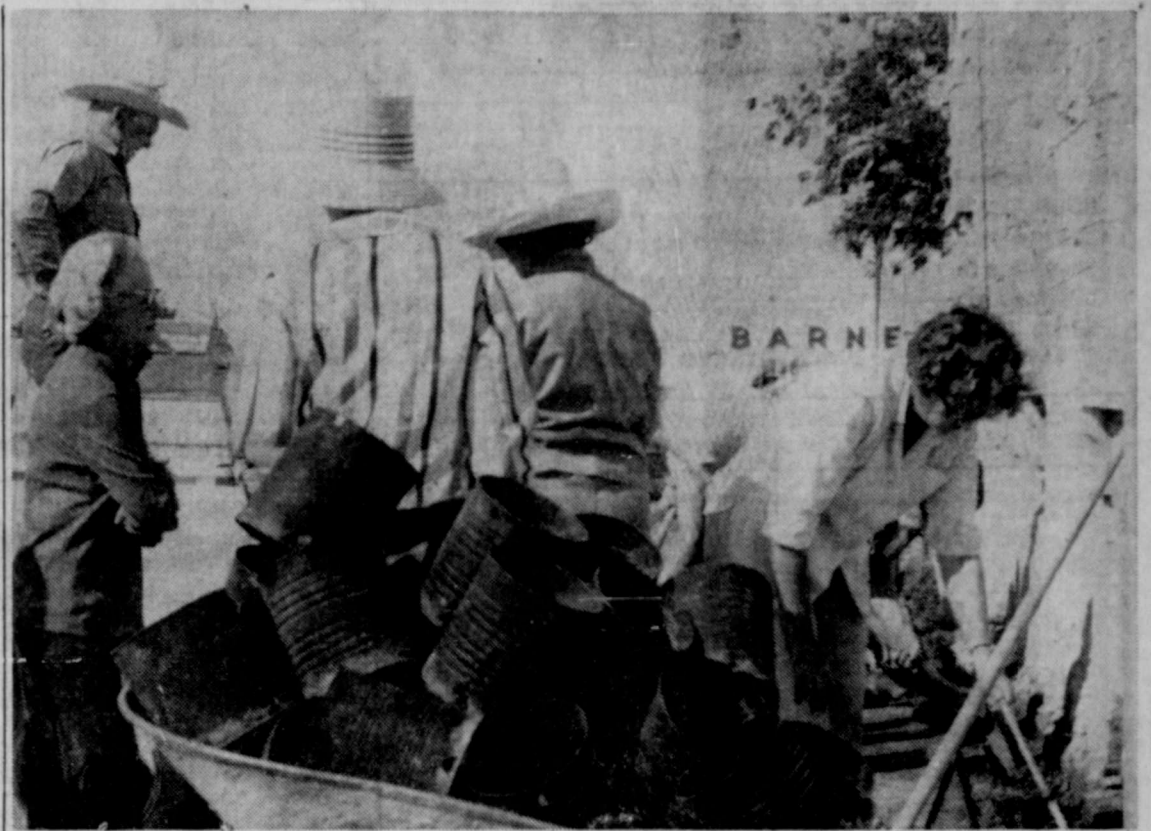

## History Repeats Itself In Local Garden Club Landscaping Project

It has been said that history repeats itself. This axiom is being proved once again in Goldthwaite.

In 1938 the Goldthwaite Garden Club began the task of landscaping the Courthouse, and now in 1972 the Garden Club has begun the task of re-landscaping this historic building. During 1968, with Mrs. Walton Daniel as president of the club and Mrs. Roy Wilkins as chairman of the landscaping committee, in conjunction with the commissioners court the group began the immense task of updating the planting. Mr. Hal Stringer, a landscape architect of Waco was hired to advise and draw a plan to be used. Upon surveying the courthouse square it was found that the south side of the courthouse was four feet lower than the south curb.

It was felt that top priority should be given the building of a retaining wall to change the direction of flow of rain water. This was done. And an additional drain line was laid to carry the water away from the building.

This week the women of the Garden Club planted 8 dwarf yapon around the south and the east side of the jail. As soon as further concrete has been poured the landscaping in the section of the courthouse square will be completed.

As an observance of Arbor Day the Garden Club planted the first of a large group of crepe myrtles which will be used in the completed landscape.

Now let's go back to 1939. Miss Abbie Ervin was the president of the Goldthwaite Garden Club then, when this group first undertook the first beautification project.

They interested Mr. Micky Stevens, of Lometa, in their dream. He secured Mr. J. M. Lee, a wool buyer, of San Angelo, whose hobby was landscaping. Mr. Lee drew the plans which the ladies followed.

Varied were the methods used to raise money for that task, bake sales were held, talent shows produced, a country store held on the courthouse lawn, where cakes, fresh and canned produce and even home dressed chickens were sold. Toe sacks were collected to be traded to the nurseryman who sold the ladies the plot material.

The members of the Garden Club of today have also held bake sales, sold paintings, and hand made holiday table cloths among other methods of raising money needed to plant, re-grade, etc., this historic center of interest in our town.

A memorial fund has been set up. The monies donated to it will be used only for plant material as specified in the overall plan. It is felt by those who originated the plan that this would be an ideal way to pay tribute to any person, and may be done either by an individual or a group. Anyone wishing to donate may do so by contacting Mrs. Alta Frizzell, treasurer of the club or any Garden Club member. A colored sketch of the courthouse square as it will look when completed may be seen in the office of the county judge, Cecil Egger, in the courthouse.

Mrs. Woodrow Boykin, president of the club stated, "We hope that all the citizens and organizations of Mills County will get together with us in completing the immense job ahead of us, that of landscaping the courthouse. So that it will be an added beauty spot of our town, county and Texas."

Livestock producers should keep a look out for any possible cases of screwworms. All types of wounds in livestock should be properly treated with medicine to prevent an outbreak of screwworms again.

When any type of wound is found with worms present, a sample of these worms should be collected and sent off for confirmation of screwworms. Sample vials are available at my office to send these worm samples in. To keep an outbreak from starting, all producers should watch their livestock closely and send in these samples.

Many diseases effect our livestock industry of today. One, however, is a very severe problem which causes the loss of millions of dollars each year without being noticed immediately. Brucellosis is a contagious disease caused by bacteria. This germ is not hardy and cannot survive long outside the body of an animal under Texas' climatic conditions. The germ spreads from animal to animal through contaminated water and feed and through direct contact with infected animals with discharge from their reproductive tract. Only in swine is the disease transmitted by breeding.

Cattle infected with brucellosis lose 20 per cent of their milk producing ability. They calve on the average of once every 18 months, rather than once a year. In addition, the abortions, sterility and difficult breeders increase the need for replacements by 30 per cent. Animals that abort or give birth to dead or weak offspring should be Brucellosis tested. More information on testing cattle can be obtained from a veterinarian, Texas Animal Health Commission (Ronnie Davis of Goldthwaite), or my office.

Farmers and other rural residents in Mills County should examine the Farm Credit Act of 1971 if they plan to borrow money in 1972. This act authorizes several new loan programs and up-dates others now in existence.

The law is designed to allow the Farm Credit System to alter its programs to meet the changing and rapidly growing needs of the farmer and the rural community.

Under the new law federal land banks are allowed to loan up to 85 per cent of the appraised value of farm real estate. This will be of benefit to beginning farmers who previously

were only allowed 65 per cent of the value.

Custom operators are also given a boost as the law permits federal land banks and production credit associations to finance persons who provide on-farm service to farmers. This may make the services of the custom operators more accessible to the farmer.

Loans may be made by land banks for non-farm housing in rural areas. For such loans a rural area is defined as a town or city having 2,500 inhabitants or less. Improvements-for non-farm homes may also be financed by production credit associations.

Until the new regulations are put into effect sometime this spring, the Farm Credit System will continue to operate under existing programs. Further interpretations of the law should be available in the near future.

**"HE IS RISEN"**

"He is risen" - Perhaps no other three words ever spoken have had as much influence on mankind as these three. These two events, the Crucifixion and the Resurrection were joined in a gospel of hope, assurance, and redemption. Six times in the first three chapters of the Book of Acts the fact of the Risen Christ is mentioned. In the fifteenth chapter of First Corinthians, verses 12 to 17, St. Paul states very clearly the importance of the Resurrection in the Christian faith. The message of the angel to the women who came to the tomb of Jesus on that first Easter morning was central in his preaching and faith. It was the focus point around which all else gathered. It was the unifying faith which bound together the early Christians into a dynamic and victorious church.

His words to Martha follow in the death of her brother, "He that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live", became more and more meaningful. They were indeed words of assurance and inspiration.

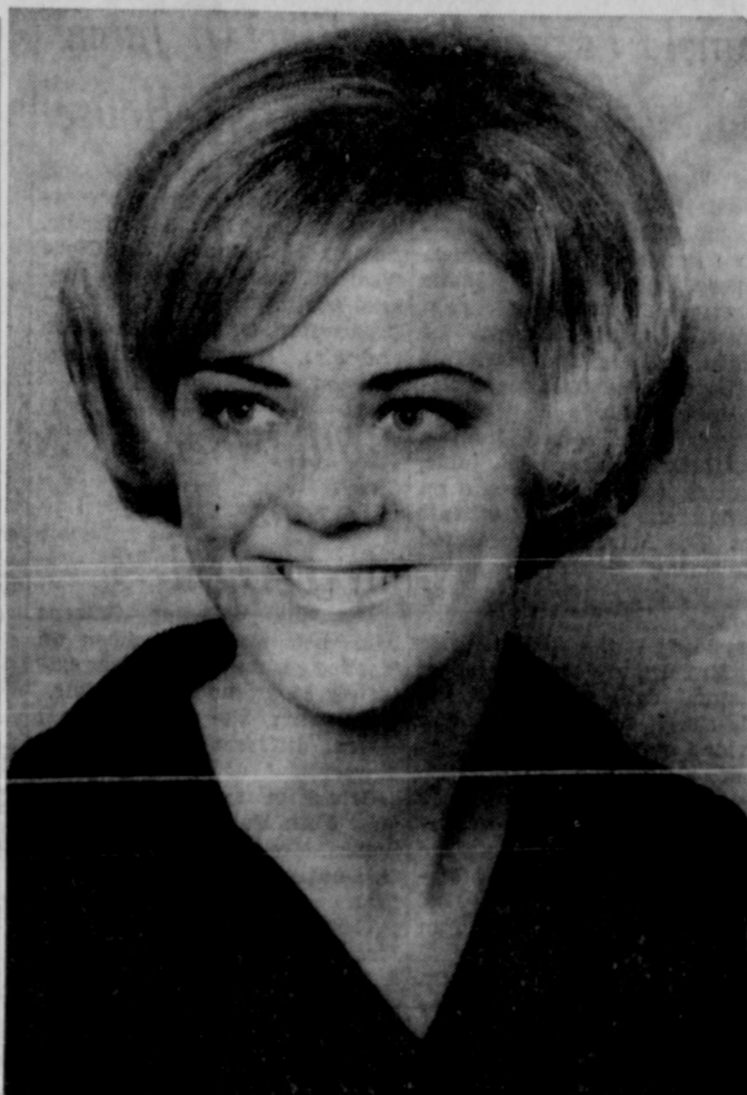
