## Water Under The Bridge

Thursday's election calls for everybody's participation. Four of the most important political races will be decided. Please read the accompanying story to see where you are to vote in the runoff.

Some of the other races are: for lieutenant governor, Bill Hobby and Wayne W. Connally; and for Comptroller of Public Accounts, Robert S. Calvert and James (Jim) Wilson. County Democratic chairman T. C. Graves announced that there will be only five (5) boxes in Mills County where voters may cast their ballots. They are Box 19, Goldthwaite (downstairs, courthouse); Box 16, Ridge (schoolhouse); Box 10, Priddy (schoolhouse); Box 8, Mullin (community center); and Box 4, Center City (United Methodist Church Youth Center).

## Important Demo Run-off Election Set For Saturday

An extra large turnout is anticipated for Saturday's Democratic run-off election. Nominations for four state wide offices will be decided by the voters of Texas.

On the ballot will be, for United States Senator Ralph Yarborough and Barefoot Sanders;

for governor, Dolph Briscoe and Mrs. Frances (Sissy) Farenthold; for lieutenant governor, Bill Hobby and Wayne W. Connally; and for Comptroller of Public Accounts, Robert S. Calvert and James (Jim) Wilson.

The Goldthwaite box will include the former boxes 1 and 19, Goldthwaite; 11, Big Valley; and Box 7, Caradan. All will vote at the courthouse in Goldthwaite.

The only other change is the consolidation of the Star, number 6, and Center City, box number 4, boxes. Both will vote in Center City at the Youth Center.

The consolidation in the four categories was brought about because none of the candidates polled more than 50 percent of the votes cast at the May 6 Democratic Primary Election. Polls open at 8 a.m.

## Maintenance Fund Drive Begins As Park Committee Plans For 1972

The annual maintenance fund drive for Mills County Park is now underway, according to an announcement by W. P. Duren, chairman of the park committee.

Committee members held their annual meeting last week in the community room of the Mills County State Bank when plans for the 1972 appeal were outlined and the ball started rolling for the new year.

Members of the committee are Charles Conradt, Houston Duren, W. P. Duren, Ed Thornton, Lewis T. Hudson, Harold Yarborough and Lee Roy Stacy. Committee members are now ready to receive contributions from all who are interested in the welfare of the Park.

The committee needs a minimum of \$1,200.00 for the caretaker alone to provide park maintenance. The City plays an important part in the park project each year with respect to

roads and other details of upkeep. City Manager W. C. Barnett reported that the city spent a considerable amount in addition to the \$1,200 that is raised by the committee for maintenance.

The goal was reached last year with no personal solicitation on the part of the committee and reflected again the splendid countywide interest in the park. Some contributions came from outside Mills County.

The park is in beautiful shape following recent rains and is being used and enjoyed by many local residents, civic groups, clubs, and family reunions, as well as strangers traveling thru Goldthwaite.

An official appeal from the committee for financial support for the project for 1972 appears on another page of this week's Eagle.

The committee hopes to en-

list at least 100 persons to contribute \$12.00 each, or more, per year for park maintenance.

Last year, a good many raised their donation. A number gave \$25.00 or more which helped out the drive over the top. Committee members feel that this will again hold true this year.

The park committee hopes that interested persons will again respond with their donations as they have in the past so that a mail campaign of personal contact work will not be necessary to insure park upkeep for this season.

Past support is appreciated by committee members who now are ready to receive this year's contributions. Chairman Duren pointed out in making this announcement for a whirlwind campaign.
