City Council Calls Bond Election To Finance Sewer Construction

The Goldthwaite City Council unanimously passed an ordinance calling for an election to give the city permission to sell \$130,000 worth of bonds to erect a new sewer plant and system for Goldthwaite.

The council met in a special called session Monday night to consider the proposal.

The election will be July 8 and will be on the same day as the election to see whether the citizens of Goldthwaite want a 1% City Sales and Use Tax.

Both items, the sewer bonds and sales tax are necessary to the growth of the city, the council concurred.

The \$130,000 worth of bonds, if the proposition passes, will be paid back in under 40 years, the ordinance says.

The proposed sewer plant and additional sewer lines will greatly increase Goldthwaite's capacity to handle sewage, City Manager W. C. Barnett said. The present system is at peak capacity at the present time.

The motion to call the election was made by Councilman Hollis Wiggins and seconded by Donald Padgett.

The sewer bond ordinance is listed completely on page 6 of this week's Eagle. The sales tax ordinance is listed on page 4.

Former Mills Co. Resident To Compete In Skeet Shoot

James R. (Big Jim) Sanderson, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Sanderson, took top trophies in the Dallas Gun Club's Metro Skeet Shoot. He competed with shooters from several different states. He tied with seven other shooters in the big gun event and calmly mowed them down in a sudden death shoot-off. All seven had broken a perfect 100 clay targets.

Sanderson will travel to Rochester, New York in late July and compete in the World Championship Skeet Shoot. He will compete in Champion of Champions event using 4.10 gauge, 28 gauge, and 12 gauge. Then in the 12 gauge event, 250 targets, for the championship.

He was born in Goldthwaite and attended school here as a young boy. He is married to the former Joan Landsdown of Sidney, Australia.

Eighteen Schools To Participate In 14th Annual FFA Invitational Rodeo

Goldthwaite's 14th annual Invitational Rodeo, which is sponsored by the local FFA Chapter, opens tonight and will be staged Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, June 15, 16 & 17.

Thursday afternoon (today), a big street parade will be at 5 o'clock. The parade will begin at the elementary school grounds. All schools invited to participate in the rodeo are urged to have as many horseback riders in the parade as possible.

FFA Advisor and vocational agriculture teacher, Thurman Head, and Jack Edington, President of the Mills County Rodeo Association, promise three nights of exciting action for rodeo fans.

Each night the performance will get underway at 8:00 p. m. in the FFA Rodeo Arena, north of the elementary school here.

Business firms and civic groups are invited to participate in the parade with floats and other suitable entries, according to announcements made by Edington and Head. The members of the FFA Chapter will appreciate the support of everyone taking part in order to help make this a successful rodeo. Events for the three nights of the rodeo include: breakaway roping, calf riding, goat sacking, bull riding, wild horse race, calf roping, barrel races and ribbon roping.

Goldthwaite, host for the event, has invited eighteen schools to participate in the rodeo. They are: Brownwood, Lometa, Zephyr, San Saba, Gustine, Hamilton, Blanket, Comanche, East, Pottsville, Early, Bangs, Star, Priddy, Mullin, Richland Springs, Lampasas and Rochelle.

Ribbons will be presented to the first five places each night and trophies will be given to the three top teams. Overall winners in each event will be awarded individual trophies.

Boys and girls who are enrolled in the seventh grade and under are eligible for the grade school events.

Contestants for high school events must have been enrolled in the 8th-12th grades inclusive during the 1971-72 school year.

Participating schools are encouraged to have as many horseback riders as possible in the parade and in each night's grand entry.

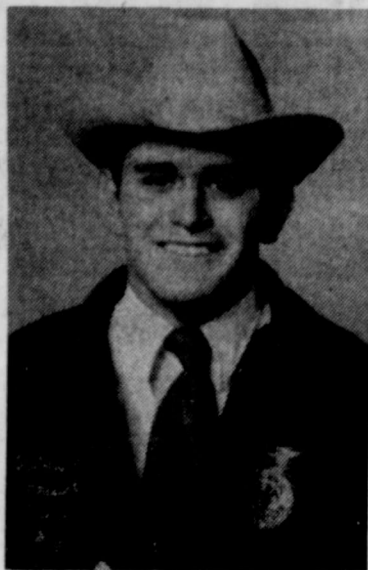

July Draft Call Announced By Col. Glantz

AUSTIN — The July Draft Call has been announced by Colonel Melvin N. Glantz, the State Director of Selective Service for Texas. Men in the 1972 First Priority Selection Group with lottery number 50 or lower will be issued induction orders with reporting dates in July.

The Priority Selection Group is made up of men born in calendar year 1952 and of men who lose a deferment during calendar year 1972.

During April and May, induction orders went up to lottery number 015; during June to 035; and now for July, to 050.

Men with lottery numbers of 90 or lower will be ordered for pre-induction physical examinations during July if they have not yet been examined. The physical examinations are administered to men in the 1972 First Priority Selection Group, also.

Thirty days notice will be given on all induction orders.

There is no quota for Texas; however, Colonel Glantz said he expects 400 men to be inducted in Texas.

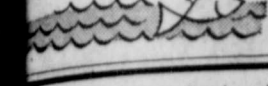

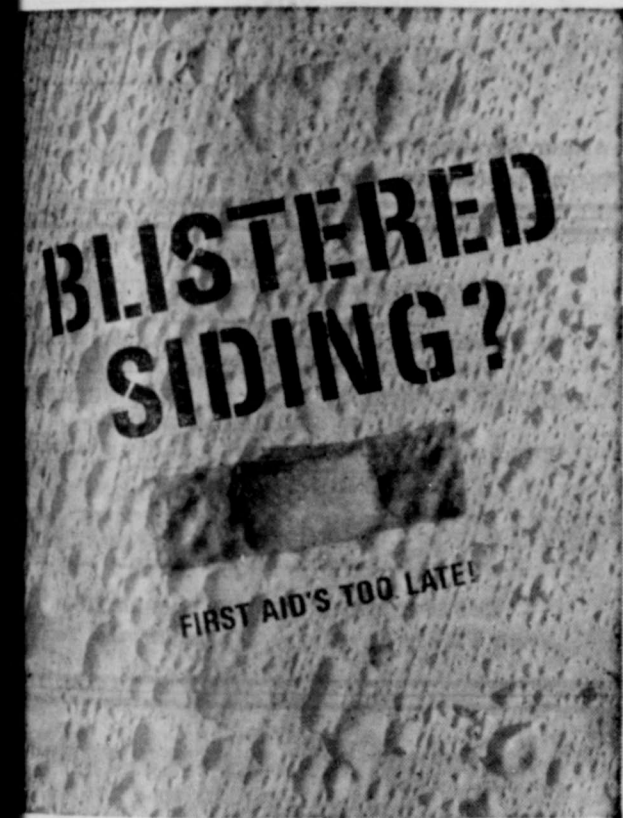

In the study of the First Epistle of John, I find the following outstanding facts: It will do us all good to read, not only this but all of the Epistles in the New Testament. Read to find the great doctrines found therein.

This Epistle is a solemn warning to the Christians of that day that they cannot hold views of Christ that are untrue and have true fellowship with God through Christ. John's position is a reputation of the superficial and illogical notion that it makes no difference what we believe as long as we are in earnest, the utter unsoundness of such a theory is apparent on the face of it. We cannot believe what is false, and, influence by it, live a life that is true, anymore than we can believe that a ten o'clock bus leaves at eleven o'clock and not miss that bus.

In his Epistles to the churches of the same region Ignatius declared that "The fundamental error of these false teachers was their denial of the fact that Christ truly suffered, truly rose again, asserting Him to be a mere phantom which flitted across the stage of the world, and

not perfect man as well as perfect God."

It is not possible for one to deny the sufferings of Christ and seek pardon of sin through the sacrifice of the Lamb of God. It is not possible to deny the resurrection of Christ and enjoy the blessings of Christianity that is grounded in the fact of its risen Lord. You cannot deny that God revealed Himself through the incarnate Christ, the mediator between God and man, and have fellowship through such mediation. It makes a vast difference what you believe to be the truth: Your conduct will be governed by your beliefs, and the assumed "sincerity" will not save you from the consequences of false ideas.

Someone has written these words that every one of us should have engraved in our hearts and lives: "I expect to pass through this life but once. . . . If, therefore there be any kindness I can show, or any good thing I can do to my fellow human beings let me do it now. Let me not defer it, or neglect it, for I shall not pass this way again."

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and advisable to call the election hereinafter ordered; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that a case of emergency or urgent public necessity exists which requires the holding of the meeting at which this Ordinance is passed, such emergency or urgent public necessity being that the proceeds from the sale of the proposed bonds are required as soon as possible and without delay for the necessary and urgently needed public improvements; and that said meeting was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by Vernon's Ann. Civ. St. art. 6252-17, as amended.

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Goldthwaite:

1. That an election shall be held on JULY 8, 1972, in said City at the following designated polling place:

CITY HALL
GOLDTHWAITE, TEXAS

Said City shall constitute a single election precinct for said election, and the following election officers are hereby appointed to hold said election:

Presiding Judge, Mrs. H. E. Holland;

Alternate Presiding Judge: Mrs. F. K. Jones.

2. That the Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two qualified election clerks to serve and assist in conducting said election; provided that if the Presiding Judge actually serves as expected, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of such clerks.

3. The City Secretary of said City, Glynn Collier, shall be the clerk for absentee voting for said election; and the regular office of the City Secretary at the City Hall, Goldthwaite, Texas, is hereby designated as the place at which absentee voting shall be conducted for said election. For the period absentee voting is permitted by law, the hours designated for absentee voting shall be the official office hours of the City Secretary; and the aforesaid clerk shall keep said absentee voting place open during such hours for absentee voting.

4. That by approving and signing this Ordinance the Mayor of said City officially confirms his appointment of the aforesaid election officers to serve at said election; and by passing this Ordinance the governing body of said City approves and concurs in the appointment of the aforesaid election officers.

5. That said election shall be held and conducted in effect as two separate but simultaneous elections, to-wit: one election at which only the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in the City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be entitled to vote, and another election at which all other resident, qualified electors of the City shall be entitled to vote.

The votes cast at each of said separate but simultaneous elections shall be recorded, returned, and canvassed separately. It is hereby declared that the purpose of holding the election in such manner is to ascertain arithmetically, with respect to a submitted PROPOSITION, (a) the aggregate votes cast at the election for and against the PROPOSITION by resident, qualified electors of the City, and also (b) the aggregate votes cast at the election for and against the PROPOSITION by resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in the City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation. Each elector shall be entitled to vote once, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

6. That notice of said election shall be given by posting a substantial copy of this Ordinance at the City Hall and at two other places in said City, not less than 15 days prior to the date set for said election; and a substantial copy of this Ordinance also shall be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in said City, the date of

the first publication to be not less than 14 days prior to the date set for said election.
7. That at said election the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with law:

PROPOSITION

Shall the City Council of said City be authorized to issue the bonds of said City, in one or more series or issues, in the aggregate principal amount of \$130,000, with the bonds of each of such series or issue, respectively, to mature serially within not to exceed 40 years from their date, and to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council, for the purpose of improving and extending said City's Sewer System; and shall said City Council be authorized to levy and cause to be assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity?

8. That the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code, so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITION, which shall be set forth in substantially the following form, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN CITY OF GOLDTHWAITE, TEXAS, ON THE QUESTION OF THE ADOPTION OF ONE PERCENT (1%) LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX WITHIN THE CITY; DESIGNATING THE DAY OF THE ELECTION AND THE POLLING PLACE; APPOINTING ELECTION OFFICIALS THEREFOR; PROVIDING THAT ALL DULY QUALIFIED RESIDENT ELECTORS SHALL BE QUALIFIED TO VOTE; PRESCRIBING FORM OF BALLOT; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF ELECTION; CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO SAID ELECTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
WHEREAS, Article 1066c, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes (Acts 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 36, Page 62) authorizes the governing body of any city, town or village in Texas to call an election for the purpose of adopting a local sales and use tax within such city, town or village; Now Therefore, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDTHWAITE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That a special election shall be held in and throughout the City of Goldthwaite, Texas, on the 8th day of July, 1972, at which election there shall be submitted to the resident qualified voters of said City of Goldthwaite, Texas, for their action thereupon, the following propositions:

"FOR adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city."
"AGAINST adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city."

Section 2. That said election shall be held at one polling place for all qualified voters of said City of Goldthwaite, and the polling place and presiding officers of said election shall be, to-wit:

Polling Place shall be at the City Hall of the City of Goldthwaite, Texas, located at 1218 Fisher Street in said Goldthwaite, Texas.

Presiding Officers: Mrs. H. E. Holland, Presiding Judge; Mrs. J. Miller, P. E. Gardner, Mrs. E. A. Gardner, Horace H. Lewis, Leonard Doughty, J. Edgin and E. B. Anderson, Alternate Presiding Judge.

The Presiding Judge at such election shall appoint Dale Allen and Mrs. Ed Bruce clerks.

Section 3. That said election shall be held in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and all duly qualified resident electors of the City of Goldthwaite, Texas shall be qualified to vote.

Section 4. That the ballots of said election shall conform to the requirements of Section 2, Subsection G, of Article 1066c, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes (Acts 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 26, Page 62), and to the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Election Code of the State of Texas, as amended, and the language to be printed thereon shall include the following:

OFFICIAL BALLOT
INSTRUCTIONS: Place an "X" in the square beside the statement indicating the way you wish to vote.

FOR adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city.

AGAINST adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city.

Section 5. That election judges and clerks are directed to comply with Article 6.06, Election Code of the State of Texas, as amended (Section 2 of House Bill 181, Acts of 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 452, Pages 1026, 1028), which provides that a square shall be placed beside each proposition in which the voter is instructed to place an "X" or other clear mark to indicate the way he wishes to vote, but which also provides that failure of a voter to mark his ballot in strict conformity with the directions on the ballot shall not invalidate the ballot and the ballot shall be counted if the intention of the voter is clearly ascertainable, except where the law expressly prohibits the counting of the ballot. It is specially provided that the election officers shall not refuse to count a ballot because of the voter's having marked his ballot by scratching out the statement of proposition for which he does not wish to vote.

Section 6. That notice of the election hereby ordered and called shall be given: (a) by publication on the same day of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within said City of Goldthwaite, Texas, the date of the first publication to be at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date set herein for such election, and (b) by posting of such notice at the polling place in the election precinct of the City of Goldthwaite, Texas, not less than twenty (20) days prior to the date set herein for such election. It is hereby found and determined that the Goldthwaite Eagle is a newspaper published within the City of Goldthwaite, Texas, and is a newspaper of general circulation within said City of Goldthwaite, Texas.

Section 7. The fact that the City of Goldthwaite, Texas, is badly in need of the revenue contemplated to be provided by

the adoption of the one percent (1%) local sales and use tax herein called for, and which adopted will be to the best interest and general welfare of said City, creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the rule requiring notices to be read at more than one meeting of the City Council before final passage be suspended, and said rule is hereby suspended, and that this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect immediately upon and after its passage at meeting, and it is so ordered. Passed, Approved and Attested, this 5th day of June, A. D. 1972.

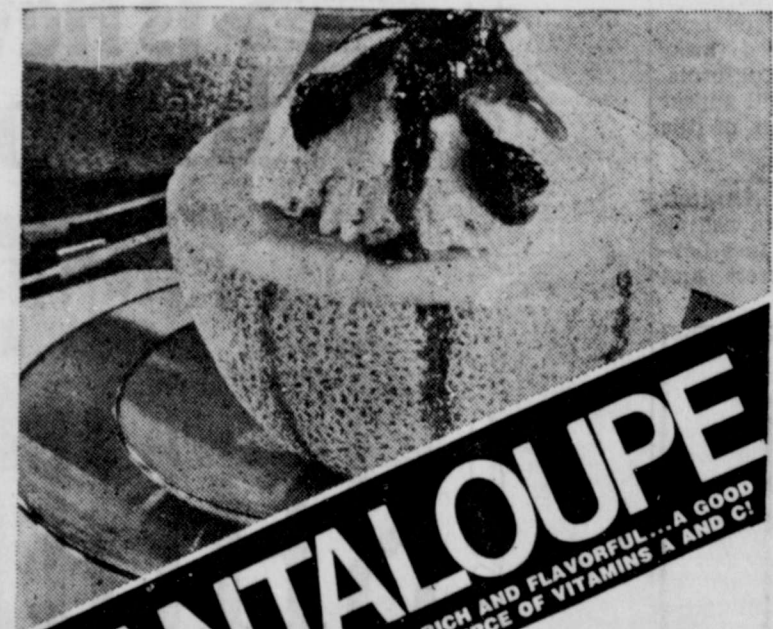

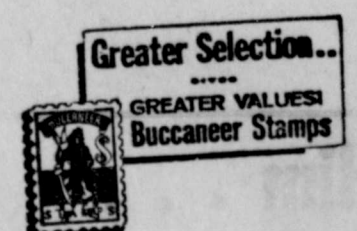

Most people don't give serious thought to the relationship of foods to dental health. The National Institute of

Health reports that a proper diet coupled with good oral hygiene and professional care helps you maintain healthy teeth for a lifetime - and avoid oral problems as well.

Specifically what does this mean? First, eat well balanced meals including adequate daily servings of the basic foods - milk and other dairy products, meats, fruits, vegetables, bread and cereals.

Try to limit your eating of sweets and avoid in-between meal snacks of sweet fruits, candies, cookies and soft drinks since these were found to increase decay in teeth. If you must eat sweets, eat them during the day.

Third, drink flouridated water.

According to the Texas Nutrition Survey of 4,497 individuals, the overall condition of teeth and gums of those surveyed was quite poor. This indicates that many Texans could benefit from good nutrition practices that help build good teeth and healthy gums in the first place, and then help keep them.

So remember to eat a well balanced diet and avoid too many exposures of the teeth to foods harmful to the teeth. And now that the children are at home for the summer, do guard against harmful between-meals snacks.

A "red alert" is being sounded throughout the state as screw-worms continue to assault livestock and other animals. Mills County has recorded three cases as of last Friday with a possibility of more confirmed cases after this went to press. It is vital that all animals be inspected closely and regularly so that infestations can be pinpointed and treated with sterile flies.

Weather conditions were favorable for heavy screwworm buildups last winter in Northern Mexico as well as in parts of the Southwest. Some infestations were also spread by transporting infested livestock last fall, and the insect spent the mild winter in new quarters.

More than 5,300 screwworm cases have been confirmed in Texas this spring, the earliest and heaviest outbreak in the history of the Screwworm Eradication Program.

Although sterile fly production at the Mission Lab is running at its peak—200 million a week—treatment with these flies is not enough to stop the screwworm. All livestock producers and owners of other animals such as dogs and cats need to follow certain precautions:

- Inspect animals regularly and treat all wounds.
- If possible, delay castration, dehorning, and other surgery until fall.
- Spray animals before shipping.
- Use caution when shipping from highly infested areas.
- Send samples of all worm cases to Screwworm Laboratory, Box 969, Mission, Texas. Sample vials are available from my office or Ronnie Davis, Animal Health Inspector.

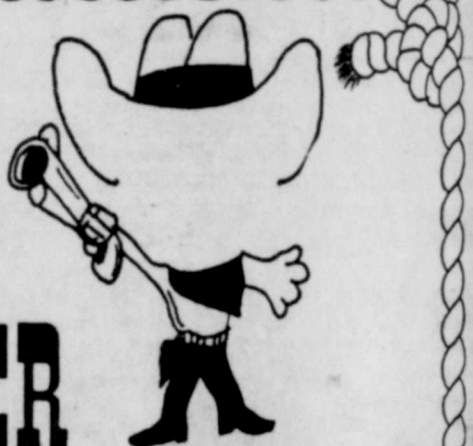

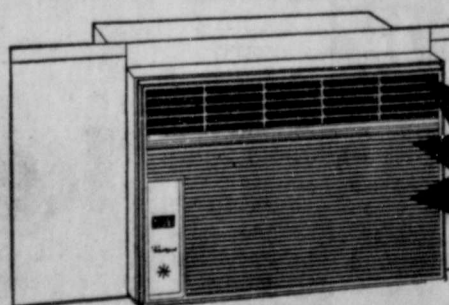
