Twenty-five boys took their physicals for the Junior High team. When school starts six or seven more are expected to join the team.

Johnson said in commenting on the season schedule for the Eagles, "It's going to be a real tough season, because there are no weak teams in the new district."

The Eagles will open their season this year on Friday, September 8, with their traditional battle against the AA San Saba Armadillos. The game will be played on Eagle Field at 8 p.m.

Mrs. Lee Tabor Named Artist Of The Month

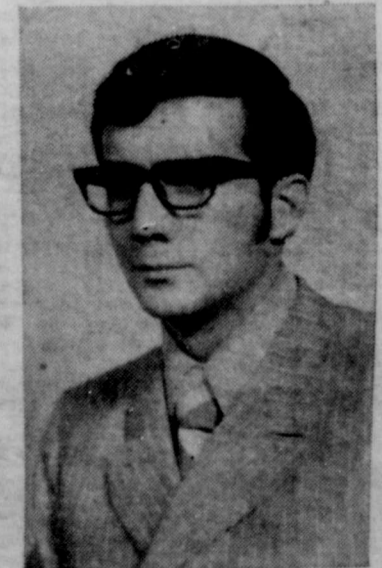
Mrs. Lee Tabor was chosen as the Artist of the Month by the Andrews Art Guild with her landscape in oils.

PUBLIC NOTICE
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
NUMBER 13 ON THE BALLOT (HJR 82)
General Election November 7, 1972

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That Article III, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding a new Section 65 to read as follows: "Section 65. Wherever the Constitution authorizes an agency instrumentality, or subdivision of the State to issue bonds and specifies the maximum rate of interest which may be paid on such bonds issued pursuant to such constitutional authority, such bonds may bear interest at rates not to exceed a weighted average annual interest rate of 6%.

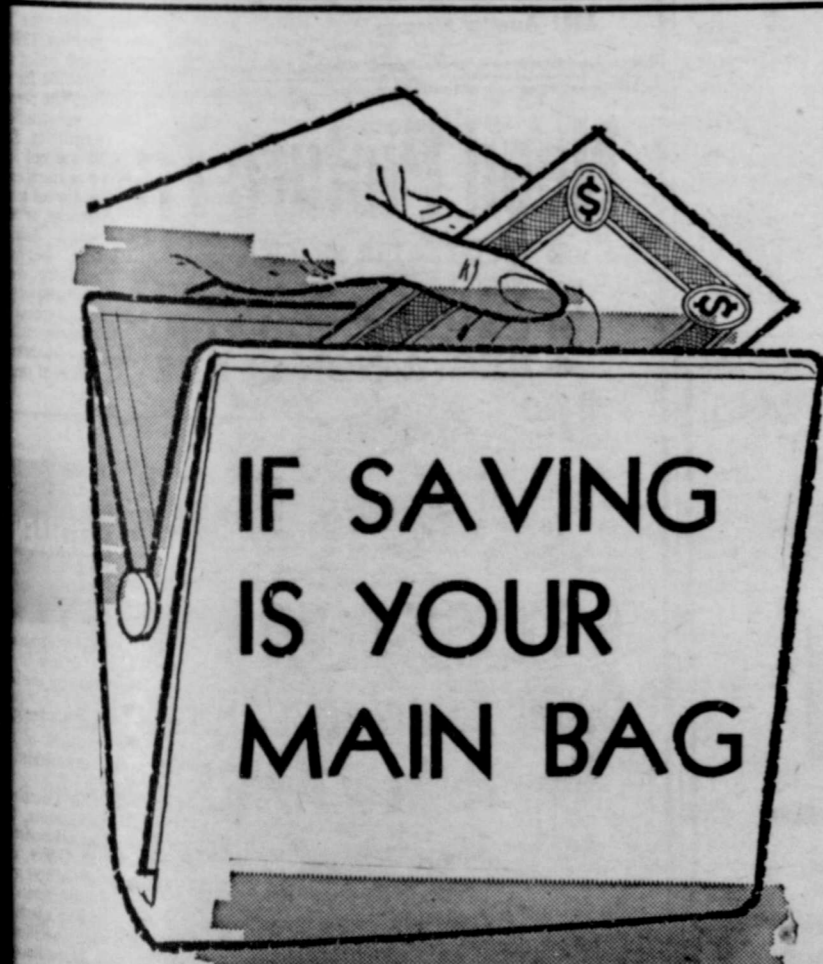

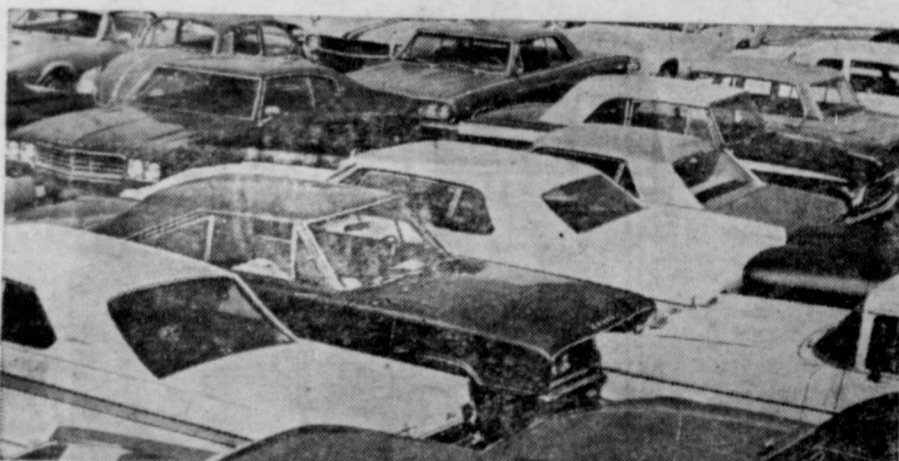

With cucumbers in plentiful supply, now is the time to make a supply of pickles for the coming year. For variety, try Dilled Okra or Sweet Mixed Pickles, as well as the usual dill, sweet, and sour cucumber pickles.

DILLED OKRA
3 lbs. uncut and washed young okra pods
6 small hot red peppers
Cloves of garlic
1/2 cup salt
Large heads of dill and stems or 1/2 teaspoon dill seed per pint
1 quart water
1 pint white vinegar
Pack okra into hot pint jars with a pod of pepper, clove of garlic and head of dill or dill seed in each jar.
Make brine of water, vinegar, and salt; heat to boiling. Pour over okra. Close jars. Process in boiling water bath 20 minutes. Start to count processing time as soon as water returns to boiling after placing jars in water bath. Makes 6 pints. These are especially good with barbecue.

SWEET MIXED PICKLES
2 quarts coulfower flowerets, about 2 medium heads
2 medium green peppers, cut into 1/4 inch strips
2 medium sweet red peppers, cut into 1/4 inch strips
2 1/2 cups white vinegar
1 1/2 cups water
1 1/2 cups sugar
3 tablespoons salt
1 1/2 pounds, 9 medium onions, peeled and quartered
1 tablespoon mustard seed
1 tablespoon celery seed
1/4 teaspoon turmeric
Wash coulfower; break into flowerets. Cook in small amount of unsalted boiling water 5 minutes. Drain; wash and prepare remaining vegetables. Combine remaining ingredients; heat to boiling. Add vegetables and boil uncovered 2 minutes. Pack into hot jars. Close. Process in boiling water bath 5 minutes. Start to count processing time when water in canner returns to boiling. Makes 5-6 pints.
Both of these would be good for colorful gifts from your kitchen at Christmas time or any other time during the year. They are also very attractive when a relish tray is needed.

groups about alcoholism. Mr. Allison Joyce, the Regional Services Director of the Central Texas Council On Alcoholism, presented a program to the local Lions Club and also to the local teachers in their In-service Training. His presentations have helped focus my attention on the problem of alcoholism, and I want to share with you some facts that I have learned.

Alcoholism is a treatable disease and the alcoholic is a sick person. Alcoholism is the greatest single mental health problem in America, ranking with cancer and heart disease as the major health problems in America. Once we recognize this fact it should change our attitude toward the alcoholic from one of ridicule to one of concern and compassion.

Seventy percent of the adult population uses alcoholic beverages, and one out of every fifteen of these persons develops alcoholism. That means that there are 6.5 million alcoholics in the United States. Alcoholism ranks second as the cause of suicide in the United States. More than fifty percent of juvenile delinquency cases are associated with alcoholism. Thirty seven percent of welfare recipients are involved with alcoholism. In more than fifty percent of divorce cases, excessive use of alcohol is a major factor. Once we see the reality of these facts we can not treat the problem with apathy.

Physicians say that the life-span of the untreated alcoholic is approximately 12 years less than the nonalcoholic. At least fifty percent of all traffic accidents resulting in fatalities are alcohol-related. But there is hope, and early recognition of alcoholism enhances the probability of recovery. Although three-fourths of the alcoholics will die untreated, fifty to seventy percent of the employed alcoholics who abstain from alcohol and receive treatment recover and lead normal lives. The disease can be arrested at any stage when treated appropriately.

I feel that I speak for the ministers of Mills County when I say that we want to help. Our attitude is one of love and concern for those that are fighting this disease.
