## Following Hearings Here

# Commission Okays Closing Of Local Santa Fe Depot

The Railroad Commission has recommended that the Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company discontinue its agency station at Goldthwaite, Texas and to establish Goldthwaite as a non-agency pre-pay station. The commission has authorized the retirement and dismantling of the depot building here.

The commission upon investigation of the matter and things involved, granted the company's proposition.

Hearings were held June 8, 1971, in Mills County courtroom and also on May 16, 1972. At both hearings Santa Fe Railroad Company tried to show that carload traffic by railway has been steadily decreasing and results in losses of revenue at Goldthwaite station was noted.

The company explained and proposed methods of handling freight using the force at Lometa to handle business at Goldthwaite.

State Senator Murray Watson, acting in defense called numerous witnesses to account for local persons wishing to keep the local depot in operation.

Witnesses who testified were Thomas Earl Winters, livestock raiser; Layton Black, associated with Don Geeslin Farms of Goldthwaite; J. D. Harper, farm machinery dealer; and numerous others.

The examiner for the railroad

commissioner concluded that the traffic at the station has decreased and evidence shows that the local agent, Hollis Wiggins, does not have enough work to properly utilize his talents and abilities. The proposed method of operating the Goldthwaite station as a non agency station has worked satisfactorily in other Texas towns.

He stated that efficiency would be improved without inconven-

ience to the public by establishing Goldthwaite as a non agency station.

He said in his opinion, the station building should not be retired and dismantled at this time; but should be kept in good repair by the railroad for a period of two years.

Purposed methods of handling freight in most instances will call for patrons calling the Lometa agency collect to have freight delivered or other business transacted.

## 'Real' Mountain Lion Killed Near Mullin

John R. "John" Smith of Mullin shot and killed a 100 pound young male cougar in Mills County last Friday night. Smith was hunting with several others, John Carl Smith, Stone Shipman, John Burrus, Johnny Burrus, Richard Shelton, Ed Smith and Vernon Warren, on the Silas Stevens place east of Zephyr when the kill was made.

The hunting party aided by about 19 hounds treed the animal and Smith made the kill

firing three shots with a 30-30 rifle.

Game Management Officer, Bennie Schriver of Goldthwaite said, "These cats usually roam the Big Bend Country of west Texas. It's just a freak of nature. There probably aren't any more in the area."

The animal reportedly was killing goats in the area and was attracted by a bait goat hung from a tree. The animal measured over six foot from nose to tail.



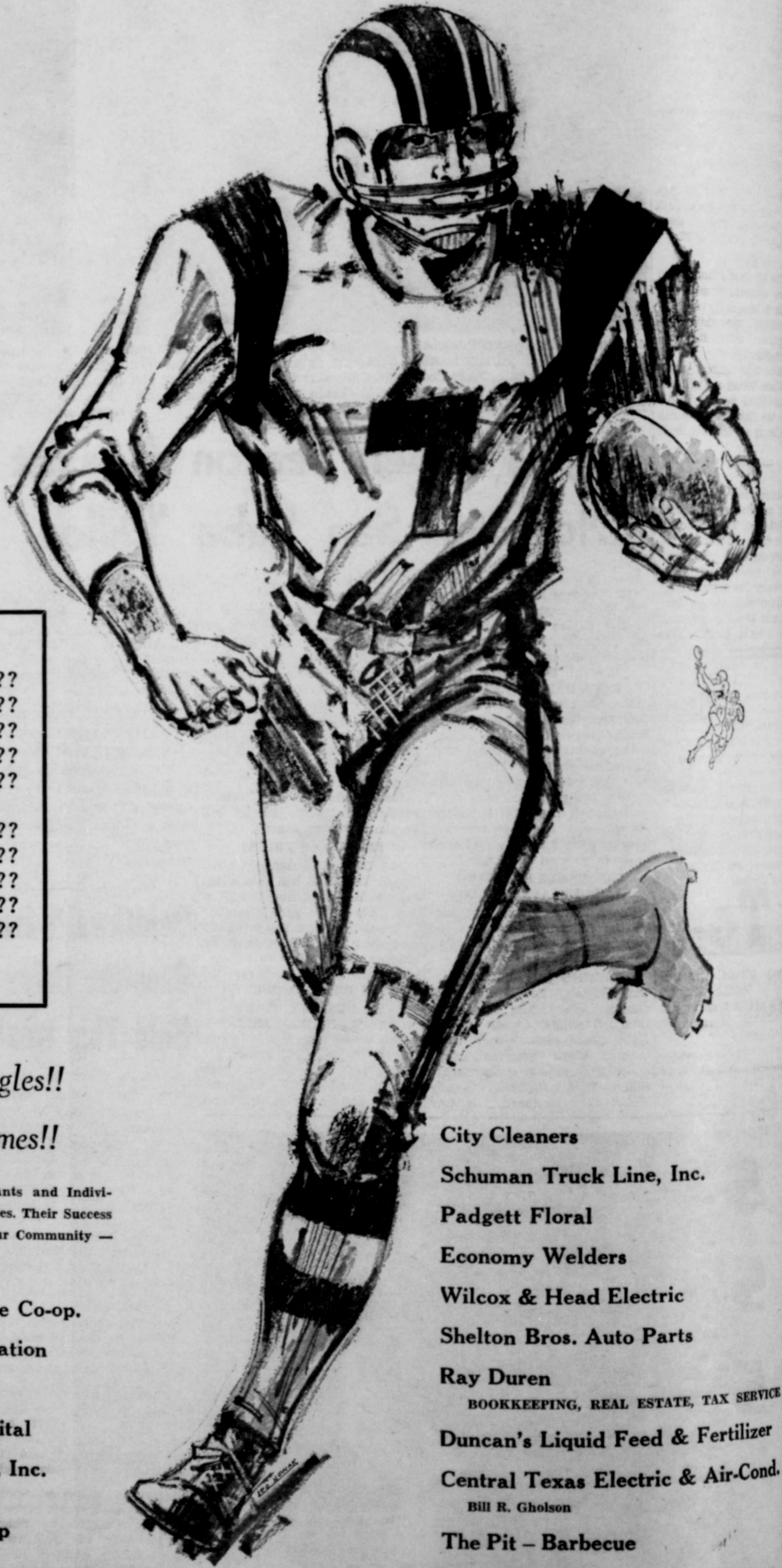

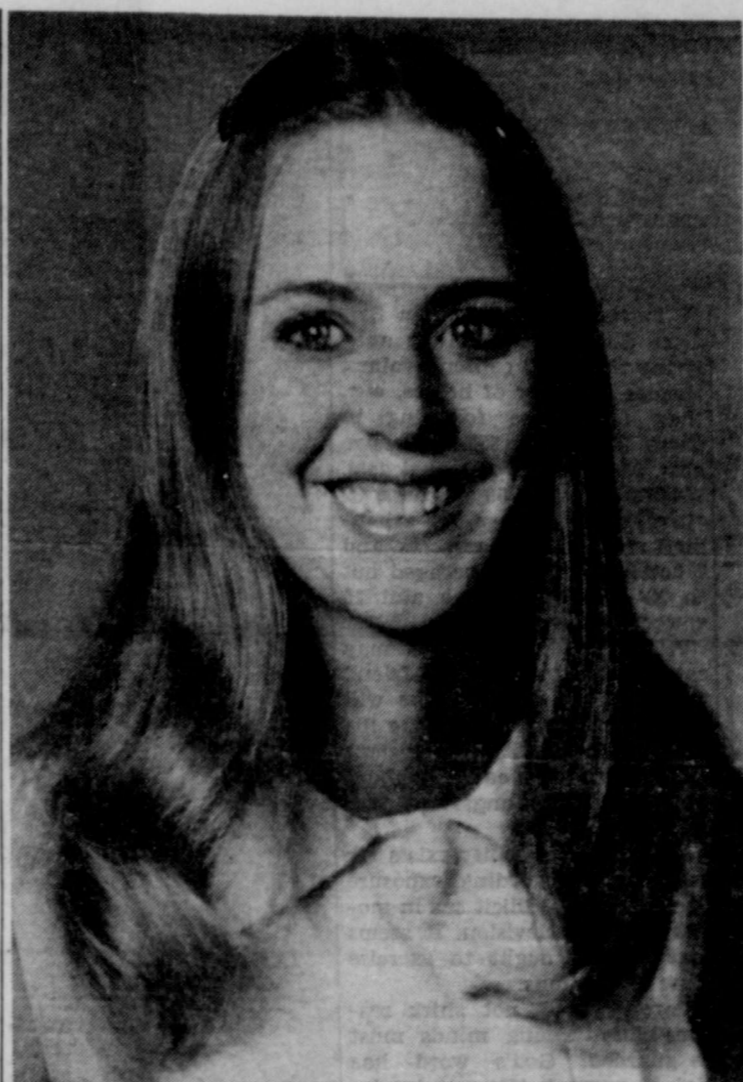
### Junior Class Elects Officers, Sponsors And Room Mothers

Joe Barnett, minister of the Broadway Church in Lubbock, Texas, in his weekly column, "Off the Cuff" wrote the following:

Recently, researchers sat thru

37 movies in one week in Salt Lake City. After carefully analyzing the films' content, values, themes, behavior of heroes, etc., they found the following in those 37 films: 833 aggressive acts, 566 displays of sexual acts, 168 nude scenes, 59 murders, 89 "justifiable" killings, 76 attempted murders, 11 massacres, and 6 bombings. It all averaged out to 23 acts of violence and 15 episodes of sex per film.

A normal, healthy child may catch a cold by visiting a friend who has one. Although he will not necessarily contract the illness, the possibility is sufficient for parents to be cautious about permitting the youngster to visit a sick playmate.

The same possibility exists for every child regarding exposure to violence and illicit sex in movies and on television. It seems that parents ought to exercise some restrictions.

Parents must not shirk responsibility. Young minds must be guarded. God's word has plainly warned, "Do not be deceived: Bad company ruins good morals," (1 Cor. 15:33). Parents must be willing to set limits for their children. The wrong kind of movie must be "off limits."

Also, CBS has announced that they will begin showing "X Rated" movies on the late show on TV. If they receive no protests they will be shown later at all hours of the day. May I suggest that all concerned citizens write a letter of PROTEST to the president of CBS: Dr. Frank Stanton, President, CBS Network, 51 W. 52nd St., New York, N. Y. 10010.

In conclusion, we should remember what the wise man Solomon once said, "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people," (Proverbs 14:34). The time has come for Christians to take a stand: to stand for what is right and good, and to stand against what is wrong.

The Mills County 4-H, FFA, and FHA Livestock Show has been around for many years and has helped many boys and girls. This year in January will be no different except this year the entire show is trying to broaden out the scope of the show to enable more of the youth of the county to participate. For example, the horse show division was reinstated, poultry division added, and also a rabbit division has been added.

The youth of the county is what all of us are working to involve. The Livestock Raisers Association is working very hard to improve and increase the number of boys and girls participating in the show. All of these additions and improvements require needed extra financial assistance to help our youth. The association needs the help of the people in Mills County to back our youth not only financially but also with an encouraging thanks. Any donations or pledges should be mailed to Charles Conradt, Treasurer of the Association.

Now is the time to spray shade trees for prevention of shade tree bores. Many trees are damaged heavily each year due to bores of some kind. A spray consisting of either diel-drin or lindane right now and again the last of May of each year will prevent bores from attacking shade trees or fruit trees. The trunks of the trees should be sprayed to the point of runoff.

Producers should take precaution when selecting insecticides at this time of year for spraying for flies on cattle. Some insecticides are systemic and can cause ill effects on cattle which were not treated or sprayed for grubs in the early summer. Systemic insecticides such as Co-Ral can kill already present in cattle. And at this time of year, a grub on its path through the animal's body could possibly be located in the gutlet when killed by the systemic insecticide. This action could then possibly cause the death of the animal.
