County resolutions will be voted on and delegates to the State Convention will be elected.

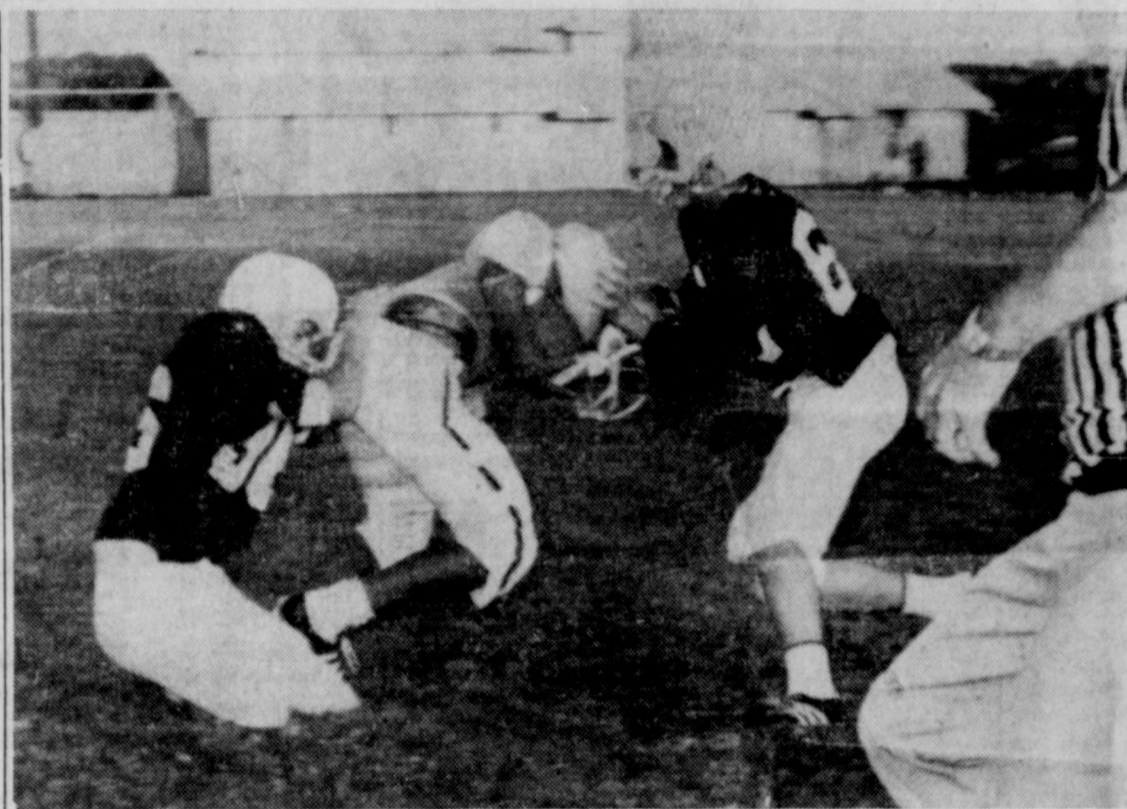
Ladies are asked to bring a dessert or salad dish. Barbecue, bread and drinks will be furnished by the County Farm Bureau.

### DANNY SUTHERLAND ATTENDS STATE FAIR

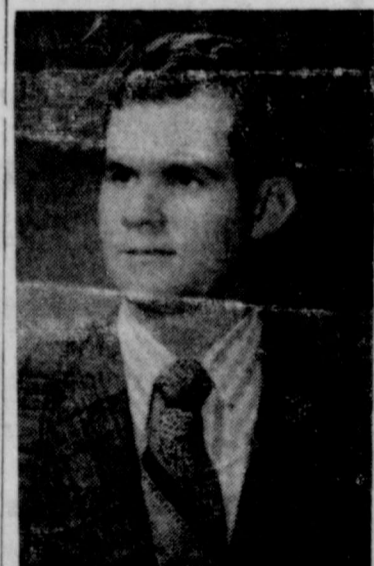

"The team needs the support and backing of all the Eagle fans in the community," stated Johnson.

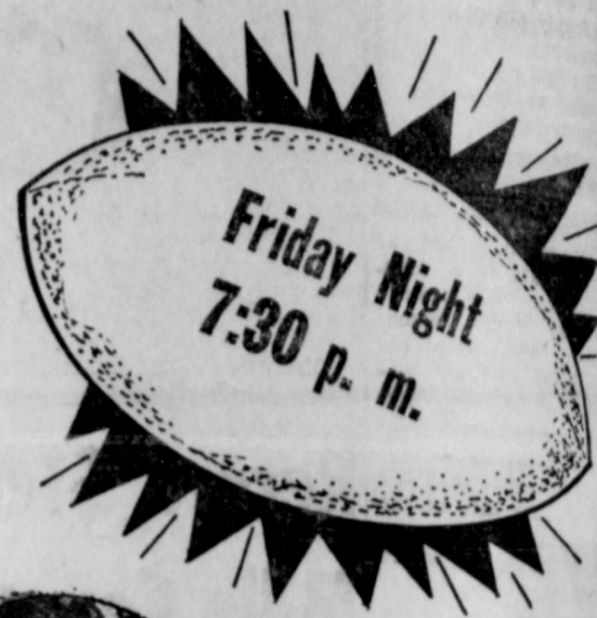

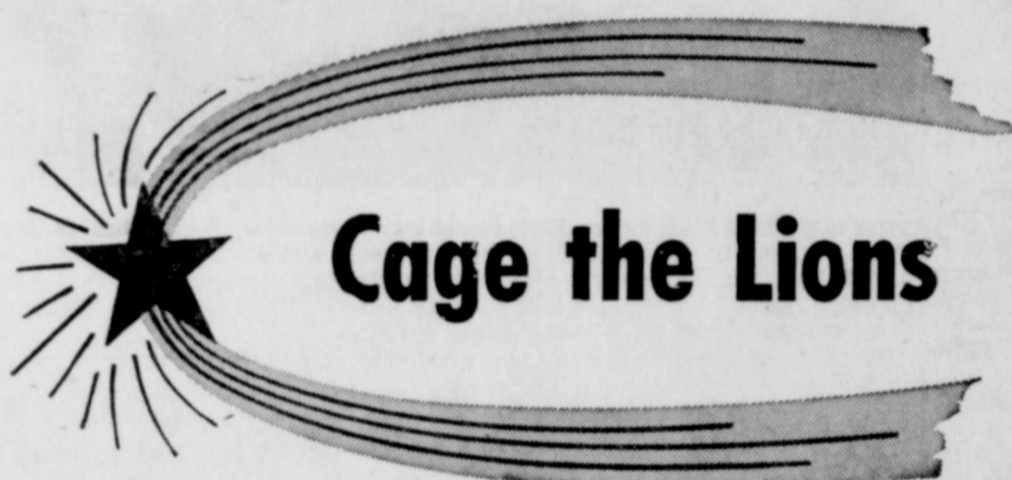

An event to look forward to: The Mills County 4-H Adult Leaders Association is planning an old-fashioned Box Supper Auction for November 4th. Every lady and girl will bring a box supper which will be auctioned off to the highest bidder. No one will know whose box they are purchasing. The couple in turn will eat the box together. The affair will be held at the park in Goldthwaite with the hope that all persons interested will attend and participate. This will be a very enjoyable event for the public.

Autumn is almost here and with it comes the headache of keeping the lawn free of fallen leaves. These leaves should be removed from the lawn, not only for appearance sake but also to prevent damage to the grass. But what to do with the leaves? Why not compost them and provide a ready source of composted soil for use in pre-

paring flower and shrub borders, potted plants and as a top dressing for the yard.

The simplest method of composting leaves or other vegetable matter is to build up alternate four-to-six inch layers of vegetable matter with two to four inches of good garden soil. Sprinkling a commercial fertilizer on each layer of vegetable matter will hasten decomposition. One-half pound or one cup full of 10-10-10, 10-6-4, 10-20-0, or the equivalent fertilizer mixture, per 10 square feet of vegetable matter layer is sufficient.

The compost pile should be 4 to 6 feet wide and of any desired length. The top layer should consist of soil and the surface of the pile should slope toward the center, forming a basin to hold water. The layers of leaves should be watered thoroughly as they are spread out. When the pile is completed, additional water should be added periodically to keep the material moist but not soggy.

The compost should be turned or mixed with a garden fork or shovel every 3 or 4 months. Within six months to a year, the compost should be ready for use.

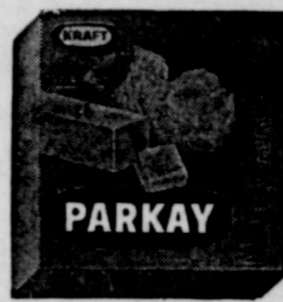

**Texas Highway Comm. Approves Building Program**

The Texas Highway Commission has approved a \$800,000 safety and betterment program on highways and farm to market roads in District 23 headquartered in Brownwood, according to District Engineer E. M. Pritchard.

The work in the Brownwood District is part of a \$40.4 million statewide safety and betterment program.

Pritchard said the farm to market road improvements include the widening of the south approach to the Santa Fe Railroad underpass on Austin Avenue in Brownwood, and the widening of Hords Creek and Live Oak Creek Bridges on FM 53 west of Coleman.

State highway safety and betterment projects include the widening of Central Avenue, US 377, in the City of Comanche from State Highway 36 in the west edge of Comanche east 2.8 miles.

In Eastland County the MK and T Railroad overpass in Cisco on US 80 is scheduled for removal since the railroad has been abandoned.

State Highway 71 in McCulloch County from US 87 south east 17.9 miles, is listed for widening and the surfacing of shoulders.

Two small bridges south of Goldthwaite on US 183 in Mills County are also planned to be widened under this program.

Pritchard added that the project in Mills County on US 183 provides for widening multiple box culverts approximately 3.4 miles and approximately 7.1 miles south of Goldthwaite.

The work is estimated to cost \$45,000.

Planning will begin immediately by Mills County Resident Engineer, Glenn G. Trotter.
