Nixon-Agnew Win In Landslide Victory

Local Voters Agree



President Richard Nixon

Voters in Mills County went to the polls in the general election Tuesday and soundly re-elected Republican President Richard M. Nixon and Vice-President Spiro Agnew over McGovern-Schriver and Jenness-Pulley, Democratic and American Party candidates, respectively.

Nixon-Agnew polled 1089 Mills County votes against 388 for McGovern-Schriver and none for Jenness-Pulley.

In the governor's race Democrat Dolph Briscoe received 1018 votes to 417 for Republican Hank Grover, 18 for Muniz and 1 vote for Leonard.

Bill Hobby polled 1139 county votes for Lt. Governor while his opponents Canales polled 4 and Alewitz polled 3.

Republican candidate John Tower polled 849 Mills County votes in the U. S. Senator race to Barefoot Sanders 612, Amaya's one vote and Leonard none.

McCaslands, Loves To Represent Mills County At State FB Meeting

Mills County Farm Bureau will be represented by 3 voting delegates at the Texas Farm Bureau annual convention to be held November 12-15 in Houston.

They are Mr. and Mrs. DeWayne McCasland and Glen Love. Also attending the 39th annual TFB meet from this county will be Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Harper and Elaine and Mrs. Glen Love. They will be among the some 1,500 persons from the 206 organized county Farm Bureaus in the state expected to attend the event.

Altogether, there will be some 900 voting delegates from county Farm Bureaus who will formulate Texas Farm Bureau policies for 1973 and recommendations to the American Farm Bureau Federation on national issues, based on resolutions from county conventions over the state. Dolph Briscoe of Uvalde, Democratic gubernatorial nominee, will be the principal guest speaker at the convention. Others on the agenda to speak include Minister R. J. Weber of Zionsville near Brenham who will deliver the sermon at the vesper service that will open the convention. Also Texas Farm President, J. T. Woodson, TFB Executive Director Warren Newberry, and Marvin McLellan of Lexington, Miss., who will be the banquet speaker.

Other highlights of the convention will be the annual TFB queen contest with 12 contestants representing that many districts. Elaine Harper will represent District VII in the Queen's Contest. Also there will be a young people's Discussion Meet and Talent Find, and special conferences, with outstanding speakers, relating to a number of commodities and other matters of interest to Farm Bureau members.

According to a report received from County Bond Chairman W. P. Duren, sales of Series E and H United States Savings Bonds in Mills County during September totaled \$2,233. Sales for the nine-month period were \$38,413 for 64 percent of the 1972 goal of \$60,000.

Sales in Texas during the month were \$16,357,152 compared to \$15,465,128 during September 1971. The January-September sales totaled \$159,190,679 with 81 percent of the sales goal of \$197.5 million achieved. Nationwide, September purchases of Series E and H Bonds amounted to \$472 million

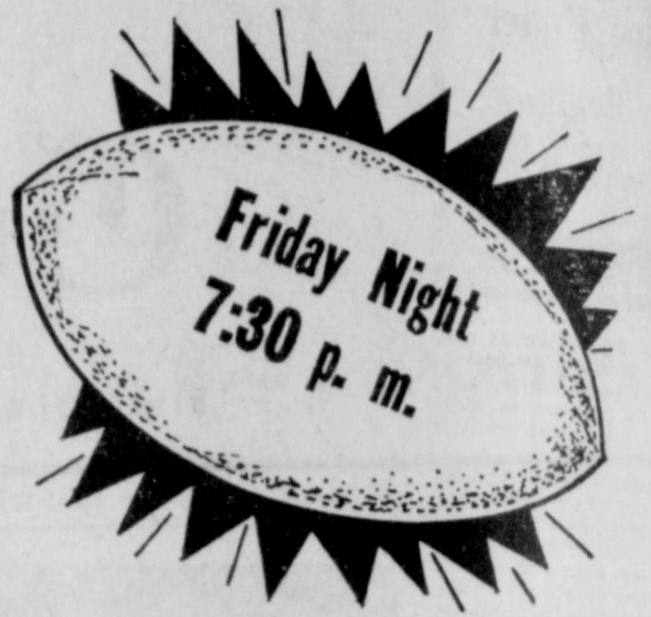
November 13-17 Proclaimed Clean-Up Week

Doings by DANIEL

A frost is just around the corner and with it comes a situation harmful to livestock - prussic acid poisoning.

Johnson grass, sudan, milo, forage sorghums and all hybrids sometimes develop a high prussic content and a hazard of grazing livestock when their growth is stopped by a frost. Chemical changes occur in the frost-wilted plants and are responsible for the prussic acid development.

Death to animals which have eaten these plants can come very quickly. An animal can be saved if treatment is administered very soon afterward. Plants of the above variety should not be grazed for at least a week after a frost. Hay which is ready to be cut should not be baled until it has cured out for a length of time. Young plants and suchers will have a higher incidence of prussic acid poisoning than matured and old plants. All producers should keep an eye out for this situation after a frost.

Ivy, found in many homes in the county and also outdoors, is sometimes damaged by leafspots caused by fungi and bacteria.

Bacterial leafspot and stem canker are more common on English ivy. The spots are light green and water soaked at first but later turn brown or black with reddish margins. The most common leafspot caused by fungus is *Amerosporium* leafspot. The fungus produces large tan or brown spots on the leaves. The spots may enlarge and cover most of the leaf surface.

To control leafspots on ivy, avoid wetting the foliage when watering the plant. If the infection is light and only a few leaves are spotted, pick these leaves and destroy them.

After all diseased material is removed, make one or two applications of a copper based fungicide. Follow the rates recommended on the fungicide label. Repeat the spray applications again next spring when new growth appears.
