Central Texas Telephone Co-operatives, Inc. has been informed this week that it has been awarded a \$1,703,000 loan by Rural Electrification Administration.

The announcement issued simultaneously from both Texas Senators, John Tower and Lloyd Bentsen and from Congressman W. T. "Bob" Poage and Omar Burleson.

The announcement concerned a loan at 5 per cent interest, that will permit the Goldthwaite based rural service utility to do several things:

1. To complete the upgrading throughout the systems, which covers 11 Central Texas Counties, to one and four party lines.
 2. To finance facilities to provide communications service to approximately 410 new subscribers.
 3. To finance the construction of 136 miles of new telephone lines, and install new pole facilities.
 4. To construct new dial central office buildings in the Locker and Voca Exchanges.
- Counties served by Central Texas are Mills, Brown, Comanche, McCulloch, San Saba, Concho, Llano, Tom Green, Coryell, Hamilton and Lampasas.
- Exchanges are Bend, Big Valley, Cherokee, Doole, Eola, Evant, Locker, Lohn, Melvin, Mercury, Mullin, Priddy, Rochelle, Star and Voca.
- The Co-op had previously been

accessible to loans at only 2 per cent interest through the Rural Electrification Administration. Recent cutbacks in funding stopped the 2 per cent money.

The Co-op, which still has to accept the loan, is managed by Ray Summy of Goldthwaite and Victor Limmer of Priddy is the president of the cooperative.

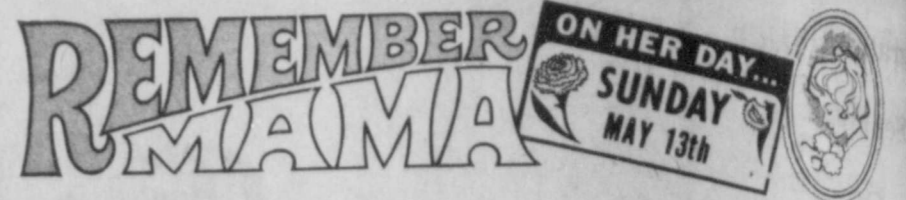

Mrs. Till (Pearlie) Jenkins is entering the hospital in Brownwood this week where she will have surgery.



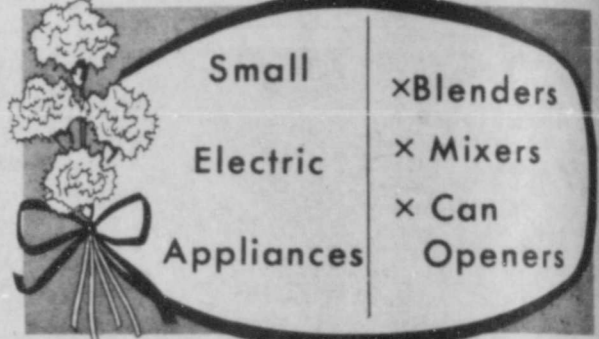

Attention Beef Cattle Producers: A Beef Cattle Pregnancy Determination Workshop will be conducted Monday night, May 14, 8 p.m. at the American Legion Hall in Goldthwaite. All livestock producers are invited and encouraged to attend this very beneficial workshop. There is no charge for the workshop.

The workshop is being sponsored by the Extension Service with Dr. John Beverly, Animal Reproduction Specialist for the Extension Service, in charge of the program. Information cov-

ered will be very beneficial to beef cattle producers on the techniques of palpation of cows. This workshop is worth your time.

Screwworm cases in Texas are on the rise. As of May 1, 89 cases have been confirmed in the state this year. Twenty-one cases have popped up in the last 2 weeks.

Of special notice to our area, a screwworm case was confirmed in San Saba County on April 27. This could possibly be a sign of things to come. Livestock producers should be on the alert and send samples of any worm case.

During this month of May, some 24,000 Texas farmers will receive a crop acreage questionnaire from the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

These reports are important and should be filled out and mailed in to insure an accurate sampling of Texas Agriculture.

Pecan nut casebearer spraying time is just around the corner. The approximate time if around the latter part of this month. Insecticides recommended for casebearers are sevin, malathion, Guthion, or Zolone. It would be advisable to add in your casebearer spray Zinc Sulfate for pecan rosette; and also the chemical Du-Ter for control of Scab, powdery mildew, and vein spot.

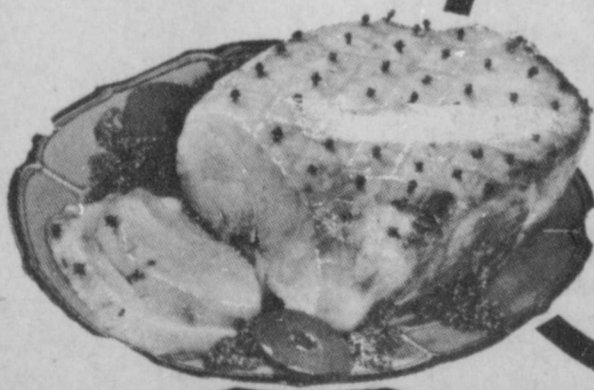
