Council Annexes Acreage; Approves RC&D Projects

The Goldthwaite City Council unanimously approved the annexation of 20.88 acres of land lo-cated at the North "Y" Tuesday night at its regular meeting

The area, just south of the Santa Fe underpass on Highway 183 is owned by the Ivy family. No plans for the acreage was mentioned by the councilmen. The council also sent a re-commendation to the area Re-

source Conservation and Development Project for projects it feels is worthy of support.

The RC&D Project is a co-operative effort by the U. S. Department of Agriculture and local agencies. \$5,000,000 is ex-

pected to be used in a six county area of Mills, San Saba, Hamilton, Coryell, Bell and Milam.


