Why is there no beef in stores when pastures are full of cattle? - Simply this - all retail stores, processing plants, and distributors' prices were frozen on March 28. Our store had been using 700-800 lb. fed calves that cost 43° to 44° on foot at that time, and processing them at the local locker plant. Since that time, these same cattle have gone to 57¢ to 59¢ on foot. Since our retail meat price is frozen we cannot stand to lose \$125.00 per head on beef.

This letter is not written to scare anyone but to inform you why we do not always have the items you want. We ask for your patience, your understanding, and your co-operation when we limit amounts so more people get a small share of items that are short. When people buy extra or "hoard" items that are short, it means someone goes without. Food has been a bargain in our county for many years due to surpluses but we must realize this is over and the people who produce beef, wheat, vegetables and all food items must make a profit or they cannot produce, which causes shortages and even higher prices.






