

The marked increase in South Texas screwworm infestations, where 91 per cent of the State's August cases were recorded, prompted the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) to establish roadblocks on all major highways south of a boundary exeast from Laredo to

Freer and on to Corpus Christi. "Active and concerned participation in this effort by all segments of the livestock industry seems to be preventing manspread of screwworm infestations to other areas," says Dr. Hudson Jones, Assis-Administrative Officer of

'It is essential that samples of all suspected screwworm cases be submitted to the Screwworm Eradication Program at Mission so personnel there can accurately work to combat the emphasizes Jones. menace,' Veterinarians, livestock inspectors, County Agents and others nave sample identification kits for this purpose.

Brooks County, with 336 cases August and 176 in the first week of September, is hardest hit of all South Texas counties. reports Meadows. Other hardhit South Texas Counties are Kenedy with 183 during August and 34 the first week of September; Jim Hogg with 146 in August and 58 the first week of September. Also recording numerous cases were Starr, 96; Hidalgo, 84; Kleberg, 23; Duval and Willacy, each 19; Jim Wells, 6; and Live Oak, 5.

Most Coastal Bend counties were remarkably clear in August with one case of screwworms reported respectively in Gonzales and Caldwell counties. Elsewhere in the Lone Star State, Haskell County marked four cases in August with two noted in adjoining Stonewall County. McLennan, Bosque and Scurry Counties each recorded one case.
