## Community Center Plans Begun; Enthusiastic Crowd Attends Meeting

Approximately 55 enthusiastic Mills County citizens attended the first community center planning program held last Thursday night in Goldthwaite.

W. P. Duren gave a report con-

cerning a center built 10 years ago in Ozona and mentioned that it was financed by a community-wide bond issue.

A steering committee was named to further develop plans

for a community center.

Duren was named chairman and other members are Tom Cody Graves, Cecil Egger, Blake English, Hawley Jernigan, Del Barnett, Cornelia Boykin and Clyde Cockrum.

The committee was charged with investigation of financing, location, building plans and size of the community center.

Goldthwaite Mayor Ray Duren volunteered the donation of 2-3 acres of land on Highway 183 just south of the highway in the north part of town to be used for a community center location if the committee so desires.

The acreage is part of a 20-acre tract owned in the vicinity by Duren.

## Improvements For Library Discussed At Board Meeting

The Library Board met at 9:30 Tuesday morning, September 25, at the Jennie Trent Dew Library. The meeting was open to the

public, and about thirty interested citizens gathered to discuss plans for improving the present library facilities. County Judge Cecil Egger disclosed that there is a \$3,000 fund available. Half of this fund is a gift of \$1,500 made by the Commissioners Court from the Revenue Sharing Fund. Mr. Warren Duren reported that the other \$1,500 comes from gifts made by people who are interested in the library.

Col. M. Y. Stokes, who has recently visited several small town libraries, presented some suggestions for improvements on this library. A list of these recommendations has been placed on the library bulletin board. Mr. Don Petty was appointed to investigate the cost and feasibility of several of these recommendations.

The Library Board will meet again at 9:30 next Tuesday morning, October 9, at the Jennie Trent Dew Library. The public is invited.

## Local Land Fill Operation Given Final Agency Approval

The city of Goldthwaite received official word last week that the Sanitary Land Fill Operation for the city has been approved by all participating agencies and government departments. The land fill should be in operation some time soon and the open dump grounds just east of Goldthwaite will be permanently

closed. The open dump grounds now in use will be cleared, then fenced before it is sold by sealed bids in the near future.

The 23-acre tract at the southern tip of the present dump ground was approved to be leased to W. A. Cline at a rate equal to the price paid for the other 30 acres. The lease will be paid fully in advance for a 50-year lease. The 2.3 acres gives Cline access to property he operates east of the dump ground.

Forrest Jernigan of Goldthwaite has been contacted to begin excavation work at the new sanitary land fill site.

The proposed sewer line extension and sewer line improvements okayed by the city some time ago was reviewed. It was pointed out that of 135 applications pending, the local project was 109 on the priority basis. The priority is based mostly on population status.

Mayor Ray Duren and City Manager Don Petty attended another Lower Colorado River Authority meeting in Austin last week and heard that four new generating plants need to be constructed in the next twelve years to continue to provide adequate elec-

tric service to its customers.

City Manager Petty reported that about 60 per cent of the street lights have been turned on and others will be turned on if customers wish.

Mayor Duren reported on the library board meeting held last week and the council unanimously approved a grant of approximately \$200 to be used by the library in its expansion program.

Councilmen Lester Geeslin, Anle Morgan, Jim Smith, Donald Padgett were present at the meeting. Also attending were Mayor Duren, City Manager Don Petty and City Secretary Lynn Collier. Councilman Hollis Wiggins was absent from the meeting.

There are churches in a financial bind because of the lack of attendance. Of the larger religious bodies in the United States only a few showed an increase of any size. The programs of the churches in the country today are on the decline. The pure and simple fact is that deep down people do not really care about God, and the church.

Christianity is not a "part-time job." The fact is that it is the Christian's duty to his Lord to be a full time, dedicated "card carrying" Christian. In the Bible, which most accept as the inspired word of God, Jesus tells us many times that all he wants is our all. To us that should mean something. This is not to say everyone must be preachers of Church, musicians or be a paid staff member at a church, but it does mean that each Christian should take Jesus to work with him every day and let someone know of your commitment to Jesus Christ. ## Sterile Fly Releases, Animal Husbandry Help Eradicate Screwworms

MISSION, Sept. 13 — "Except the bottom 13 counties of the state where the ear tick is a problem, we're having a good year," comments Dr. M. Meadows, veterinarian-in-charge of the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Screwworm Eradication Program.

September and October are normally the months of greatest livestock during August compared to 18,341 for the same month of 1972. Meadows credits this year's comparative good fortune to success of the sterile fly release technique, and to good, careful, animal husbandry by all involved with the livestock industry.

Some 200-million sterile screwworm flies are produced at the Mission plant each week. Female screwworm flies mate only once during their lifetimes. Sterile male flies are released to mate with fertile, wild grown, females. Eggs produced by matings with sterile males do not hatch, thus eradicating the pest.

The marked increase in South Texas screwworm infestations, where 91 per cent of the State's August cases were recorded, prompted the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) to establish roadblocks on all major highways south of a boundary extending east from Laredo to Freer and on to Corpus Christi.

"Active and concerned participation in this effort by all segments of the livestock industry seems to be preventing man-caused spread of screwworm infestations to other areas," says Dr. Hudson Jones, Assistant Administrative Officer of TAHC.

"It is essential that samples of all suspected screwworm cases be submitted to the Screwworm Eradication Program at Mission so personnel there can accurately work to combat the menace," emphasizes Jones. Veterinarians, livestock inspectors, County Agents and others have sample identification kits for this purpose.

Brooks County, with 336 cases in August and 176 in the first week of September, is hardest hit of all South Texas counties, reports Meadows. Other hard-hit South Texas Counties are Kennedy with 183 during August and 34 the first week of September; Jim Hogg with 146 in August and 58 the first week of September. Also recording numerous cases were Starr, 96; Hidalgo, 84; Kleberg, 23; Duval and Willacy, each 19; Jim Wells, 6; and Live Oak, 5.

Most Coastal Bend counties were remarkably clear in August with one case of screwworms reported respectively in Gonzales and Caldwell counties. Elsewhere in the Lone Star State, Haskell County marked four cases in August with two noted in adjoining Stonewall County. McLennan, Bosque and Scurry Counties each recorded one case.

A birthday dinner was given in honor of Mr. Greg Kincheloe's 84th birthday at Center City Sunday. Many were present for a delicious meal of barbecued goat, chicken and dressing and all the trimmings and a large white birthday cake baked by his granddaughter, Mrs. Roland Kincheloe.
