From the **County Agent**

By Danny Long Mills Co. Extension Agent

The brownish looking color you have been noticing in your oats is probably rust. This is generally a common condition in oat growing regions of the world. It may not be too fami-liar in Mills County, but it is one of the most destructive of all oat diseases year in and year out. It occurrs almost everywhere that oats are grown but is most serious under unusually humid conditions.

Crown rust, as it is more correctly called, results in reduced yields, lower test weight and increased lodging. The severety of the disease varies greatly from year to year, depending on the amount of readily available susceptible varities and favorable weather conditions. The disease, a fungus by classification, is spread by airborne spores. In the Deep South the sease is maintained through winter grown oats. The rust will then move north.

The three principal control measures for crown rust are the use of resistant varities, eradication of the allternate host plants, and early planting. Early maturing oat varieties generaly seem to suffer less than late maturing varieties.

Experiments have shown that certain fungicides will control crown rust, however, the cost is so extreme that it is not economically practical.

Five Area Students Food Stamp Program Proves Quite Effective

United States Department of Agriculture indicate that the food stamp program is an effective means for using America's ag-ricultural abundance and providing better nutrition for lowincome households.

Findings in certain test areas

indicate that: There was a increase in the amount and value of food consumed by households under the food stamp program. About 80 percent of this increased consumption was of fruits and vegetables, meats, poultry, fresh milk and eggs. All these foods bring farmers their best returns.

There was no major shift to luxury foods. For example, recipients ate more meat but not the higher-priced cuts.

Low-income households that receive food stamps had better diets than low-income households that did not receive food stamps. But even with food stamps, these participants ate less than the

non-needy.

In the test areas, food stamps represented about 10 percent of the retail food sales, and farmers' profits increased from

Prepare something special, such as cranberry jelly. How simple it is to make with cranberry juice, which is in abundant supply now.

To make six half-pints, mix cups cranberry juice cocktail with one 2 - 1/4 ounce package of powdered fruit pectin in a large kettle. Begin to cook, and stir until boiling. At that point, immediately stir in 4 cups of sugar. Then bring the mixture to a full rolling boil, and boil it hard for two minutes, stirring constantly.

Next, remove the mixture from the heat and stir in 1/4 cup of lemon juice. Skim off the foam as

the jelly begins to cool, and pour into hot sterilized jars and seal. It is a good idea to put a towel or rack under the jars as you pour to avoid possible breakage due to sudden temperature change. A quarter - inch of melted paraffin poured on top makes

an excellent seal. That's all there is to it. Your homemade jelly is now ready for cousin Gertrude, or your own
