Faulkner, Watson Defeat Incumbents In Saturday Democratic Primary

Mills County voters went to the polls last Saturday and resoundingly elected a new county judge and commissioner.

Incumbent county judge Cecil

Edger was defeated by Herbert S. Faulkner by a total vote of 986 to 430 and in the Commissioner, Precinct 2 race Lewis D. "Jeff" Watson defeated long-

time commissioner Fred Wall 933 to 445.

These two races were the only contested positions on the ballot for Mills County. The new court will be sworn in next January. Mills County voters followed most state wide and district wide trends in voting. Congressman W. R. "Dab" Posey, who defeated challenger Conrad Johnson, and rancher-Governor Dolph Briscoe was, as predicted, an easy victor over a slate of three challengers.

Of special interest to most voters was the pari-mutual wagering referendum on the ballot. Local voters nixed the proposition by a 769 to 377 vote margin.

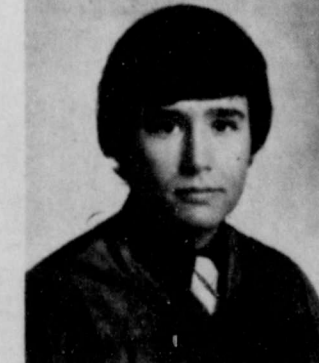

Miss Maude Barnett became his bride and the couple started their family during the 41 years the couple remained in this part of the state. The family moved to Lubbock in 1926 and the family continued their farming interests in the Panhandle, raising primarily cotton and maize. Mr. Roberson remained on the farm, located approximately 5 miles northwest

The Texas Association for Mental Health is a volunteer organization working to improve the quality of mental health services in Texas. In 1957, the Association successfully worked for the passage of the community mental health center law. This law has resulted in the development of mental health centers which provide treatment, consultation and research in a community based setting throughout Texas.

The Mental Health Association has also had a direct role in updating laws to protect the rights of the mentally ill, in obtaining the money necessary to provide treatment for emotionally disturbed children, and in providing referral services for those in need.

This year the Association is placing special emphasis on the needs of children and youth and upon the continued transfer of mental health service from the state hospital to facilities in the community.

The Mental Health Association receives no public funds. It's income is derived from community drives throughout Texas. Mrs. Grady Hancock is serving as community coordinator for the drive in Mullin.
