Gold-Tex Rodeo Finals

Gold-Tex rodeo finals will begin Thursday (tonight) at the T. A. Rodeo Arena and will continue through Saturday night. This event is sponsored by the Mills County FFA Rodeo Association. Each night's performance will under way at 8 p. m.

Top cowgirls and cowboys from FFA Invitational Rodeos held in the Central Texas area during the 1974 season will be competing in the Gold-Tex Finals. Bareback bronc riding, tie-up calf roping, ribbon roping, bull riding, girls' barrel race, and bull riding are the events scheduled for the three nights' performances. An added attraction to this year's rodeo will be the Jackpot Steer Hoping during the night's performance. This will be held by the Mills County Steer Hoping Club.

This is considered one of the best rodeos of the year, and officials of the Mills County FFA Association invite each

and everyone to come out and enjoy the excitement.

A street parade will be held in conjunction with the rodeo Thursday (today) at 5 p. m. All cowgirls and cowboys are urged to participate in the parade.

Nine M-44 Predator Control Meetings Scheduled

Farmers and ranchers who missed the Mills County training meeting on use of the M-44 spring loaded ejector which uses sodium cyanide capsules will have an additional opportunity to qualify for the program.

Nine meetings will be conducted within the 44 counties of the experimental program area. Farmers and ranchers may attend any one of the meetings to be qualified.

Only those individuals who participate in a training meeting will be qualified to purchase and use the M-44 and sodium cyanide capsules in the pilot program. Each participant will be issued a certificate by the Texas Department of Agriculture at the conclusion of the meeting. The meeting will concern the safe use of the M-44 spring-loaded ejector which uses sodium cyanide capsules as a means of controlling predatory animals. The device has been approved by the Environmental Protection Agency for use in a 15-month experimental program in 44 counties in West, Central and South Texas. The Texas Department of Agriculture will direct the program. Cooperating agencies are the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and the Texas Rodent and Predatory Control Service.

The aim of the program is to determine the safest, least expensive and most effective means of controlling predators without harm to other wildlife and the environment. M-44 training meetings are scheduled for the following dates and locations:

School To Conduct Kindergarten

The Texas Legislature has approved for all schools in Texas to have a regular kindergarten. This is to prepare the students for the first grade. It will be a regular part of the school just as any other grade. However, attendance is not compulsory in kindergarten.

The Texas Legislature approved the kindergarten program for all Texas schools for the purpose of adjusting all students to regular school life, and so students would be better adjusted to each other. Therefore, they will do better work in school. The program will be for children who will be five years of age on Sept. 1, 1974 and not yet six years of age. The program will be for one-half day. Students will attend a morning session and will dismiss at noon. In 1978 the school will be for a full day.


This kindergarten is just like any other part of the school system. We would like for all to attend, so they will be better adjusted to the school and each other, and will be better prepared for the first grade.

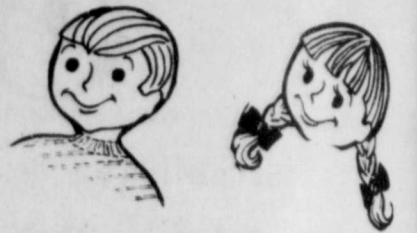

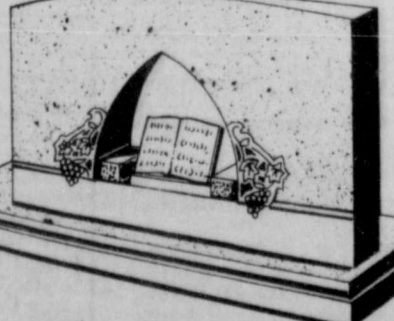

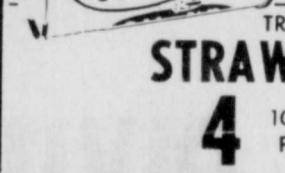
