## Eagles Take Second District Defeat, Homecoming Friday Against Ranger

A three-touchdown explosion in the second quarter lifted Dublin to a 29-15 District 10-A high school football victory over the Goldthwaite Eagles last Friday night.

Goldthwaite now stands 3-3 for the year and 0-2 in loop play. David Miller cornered the first Goldthwaite touchdown with a quarterback sneak and Guenaro Siller added a two-point conversion to narrow the score to 21-8 at halftime.

The other Eagle touchdown came in the third quarter with Tim Spradley, who bulled one yard from his fullback slot for the marker. David Miller added the point from placement to give the final Goldthwaite point. Goldthwaite outpassed the Lions, 145 yards to 61, but a thundering Dublin ground game chewed up 314 yards to make the difference.

Friday night the boys showed a great deal of enthusiasm and

played what I thought was a pretty good game against their opponents," commented Head Coach Gene Aldridge.

"We lost three fumbles and had a couple of long passes thrown over us for TD's which really hurt our game. We moved the ball real well and at times our defense really made a good showing."

Guenaro Siller had a good night Friday by adding up 111 yards rushing.

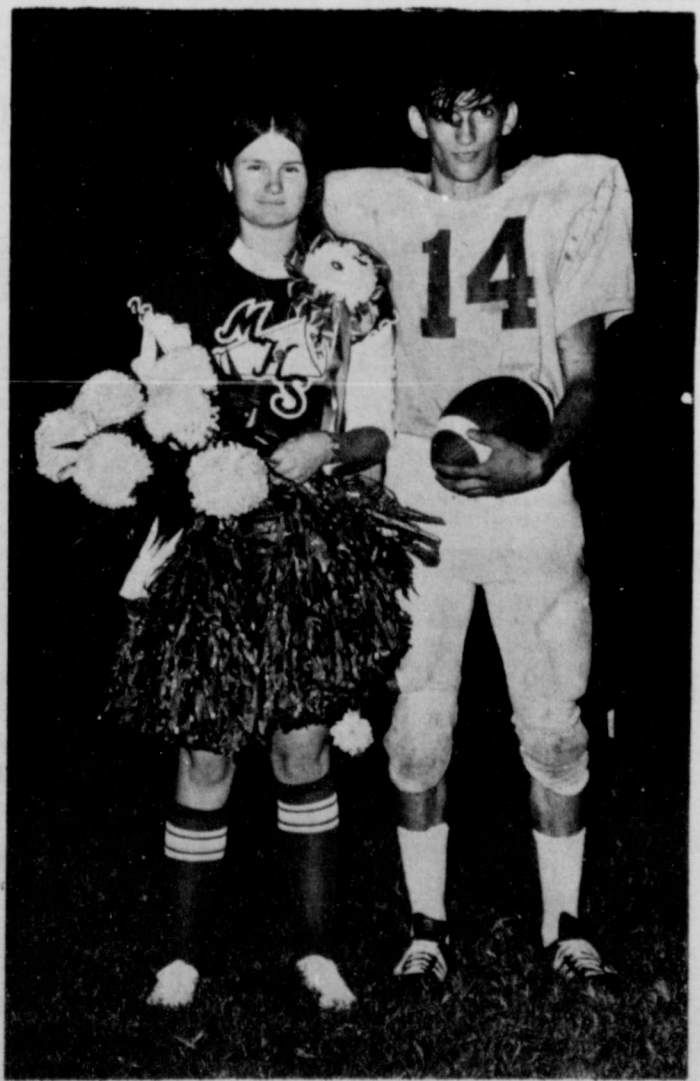

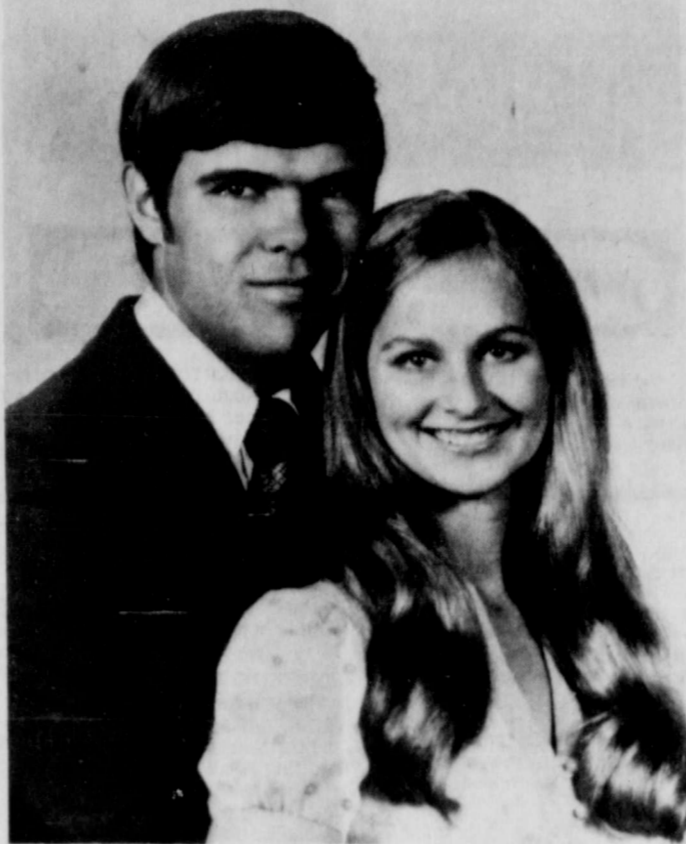
