Receives More Funding For Employment

Mills County has been appropriated more monies through the Department of Labor for the purpose of funding more employment. These funds are under Title VI and Title I of the Manpower CETA bill. Though the total amount of money available is limited to a degree, those persons seeking employment will be placed with a program if they are eligible, or assisted with direct placement, whenever possible.

Openings available in the Adult Public Sector are funded through June, 1975, at which time the fiscal year will be re-evaluated for the continuance of the programs.

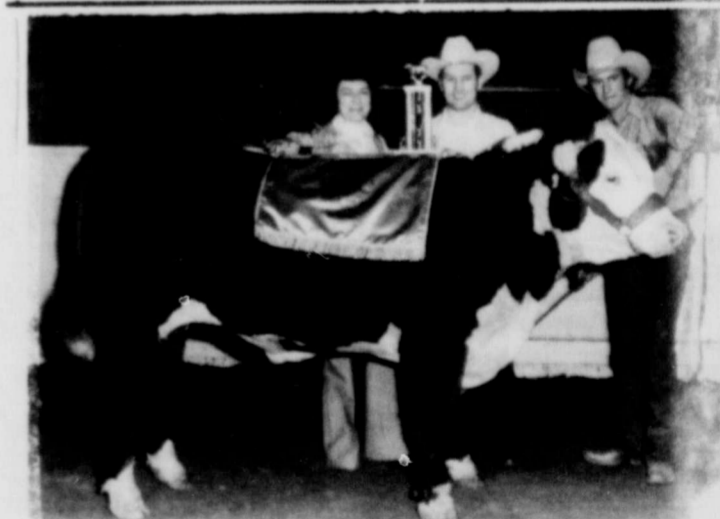
Vicki Holcomb Named Local 1975 Heart Fund Chairman

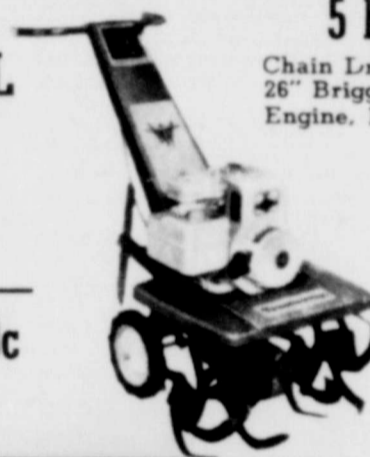
