Officer for a three-year period. The court spent the majority of the two-day session discussing salaries for county officials and employees. All persons on the county payroll received some increase in salary and the county judge and countydistrict clerk were put on straight salary instead of the salary-plus-fee basis. From now on, all fees will be turned directly over to the county

treasurer. Justice of the Peace Court jurors will be paid three dollars per day instead of two dollars for services on JP juries.

## 100-Balboa Coin On Sale In Goldthwaite

The Mills County State Bank announces it will offer to the public uncirculated specimens of the first gold coin minted in the United States since the removal of the government's 41-year ban on ownership, announces W. P. Duren, bank president.

> The coin is the 1975 One Hundred Balboa Gold Coin of the Republic of Panama, the first gold coin of any nation to be minted in the U.S. since April 1933, which can be owned by U.S. citizens. The coin is official legal tender in Panama with a value there equivalent to 100 U. S. dollars. It is the first gold coin ever issued by the Republic of Panama.

The official purchase price of the 100-Balboa gold coin at the bank will be at the face value of \$100, plus a small handling charge.

> Mr. Duren said, "Bank customers will be accommodated on a first come, first served basis as long as our allocation lasts.







Homeowners should be considering the practice of using dormant oil on their fruit & nut trees. On peaches and plums, the dormant oil emulsion should be used at the rate of 4 gallons of 97 percent oil emulsion per 100 gallons of water. The spray should be applied during dormant season prior to bud swelling. The rate is the same for apple and pear 3. The application should be made as buds begin to swell and when the temperature is between 50 - 85 degrees F. and no freeze is expected for at least 8 hours. For pecan trees, the rate of application is 31/2 gallons of 97 percent oil analysis percent oil emulsion mixed with 100 gallons of water. For homeowners with only a few trees, the spray can be reduced according tr 'abel recommendations.
