mittee members.

The main item on the agenda...  
was the listing of projects by...

the celebration - Festival, Her-...  
itage and Horizons.

The radio team from station...  
KNCT at Central Texas College...  
in Killeen was discussed. The

team will be here in April to...  
tape conversations with local-...  
ites and to put the "Sounds of...  
Mills County" on the air. In-...  
dividuals were discussed who...  
might be interviewed by the...  
station, particularly persons...  
with a wide knowledge of his-...  
torical happenings in Mills...  
County.

The Santa Fe Depot was dis-...  
cussed at length again, with...  
letters from high-standing Santa...

retary Vicki Holcomb. The com-...  
ments were that the depot would...  
not be useable by the committee...  
for any sort of activity, and that

the building would be disposed...  
of in the near future, on a bids...  
for salvage proposition. The...  
committee expressed the opin-...  
ion that this would be the...  
single most important building...  
in the historical growth of Gold-...  
thwaite and that it really would...  
be an attraction if the building...  
could be used in some way.

The letters read said that...  
Santa Fe did not want the li-...

motion was seconded by Coun-...  
cillman Jim Smith.

The Council expressed con-...  
cern that many complaints have...  
been lodged with them about...  
the work not being done by City...  
employees. It was the consen-...  
sus that the pay raise situation...  
would be looked on more favor-...  
ably if the employees attitude...  
and work habits were to im-...  
prove. City Manager Petty was...  
instructed by Mayor Ray Duren...  
to call a meeting of City em-...  
ployees and take care of this...  
situation, as it is not the coun-...  
cil's duty to handle matters of...  
this kind.

called for April 5, 1975, at the...  
City Utilities building.

Two councilmen, Ancle Morgan...  
and Donald Padgett, will be...  
up for re-election and Mayor...  
Duren will also. However, Morgan...  
and Padgett both expressed...  
their desire not to be on the...  
ballot for 1975.

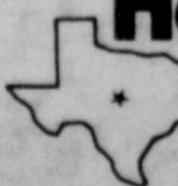

## 100 Balboa Coin On Sale In Goldthwaite

The Mills County State Bank announces it will offer to the public uncirculated specimens of the first gold coin minted in the United States since the removal of the government's 41-year ban on ownership, announces W. P. Duren, bank president.

The coin is the 1975 One Hundred Balboa Gold Coin of the Republic of Panama, the first gold coin of any nation to be minted in the U. S. since April 1933, which can be owned by U. S. citizens. The coin is official legal tender in Panama with a value there equivalent to 100 U. S. dollars. It is the first gold coin ever issued by the Republic of Panama.

The official purchase price of the 100-Balboa gold coin at the bank will be at the face value of \$100, plus a small handling charge.

Mr. Duren said, "Bank customers will be accommodated on a first come, first served basis as long as our allocation lasts."
