County Man Killed In Car-Truck Accident

Thursday, May 8, 1975, at approximately 2:40 a.m. Henry Bert Moore of Goldthwaite was killed instantly when the 1968 Ford Torino he was driving was in collision with a 1969 Peterbilt diesel tractor-trailer. The truck was driven by Holly Allen Morrow, 61, of Abilene.

The accident occurred 13.2 miles north of Goldthwaite on Texas 16.

Morrow was headed south on 16 when the Moore vehicle, traveling north, crossed the center line and hit the truck semi-head-on. Troy Williams, Justice of the Peace of Precinct 6, pronounced Mr. Moore dead at the scene. With an ambulance was called to the scene to transport the victim.

Local law enforcement officers investigated.

Funeral services for Mr. Moore were conducted Friday, May 9, 1975, at 3 p.m. in the Wilkins Funeral Chapel, with burial in the Wallace Creek Cemetery in San Saba County. Rev. Dan Connally, assisted by Rev. Albert Brown of the First Baptist Church, San Saba, officiated. Wilkins Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Moore was born July 31, 1914, in San Saba, Texas, to Henry Dave Moore and Maggie Williams Moore. On November 8, 1947, he was married to Zula Lee Dufer in San Angelo, Texas. They moved to Goldthwaite from Dallas in 1959.

Mr. Moore was a veteran of World War II, a member of the First Baptist Church, and also a member of the American Legion Post 487, Priddy, Texas. He is preceded in death by his

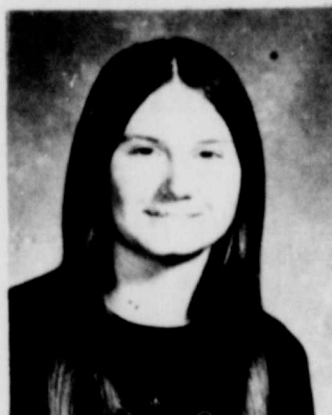

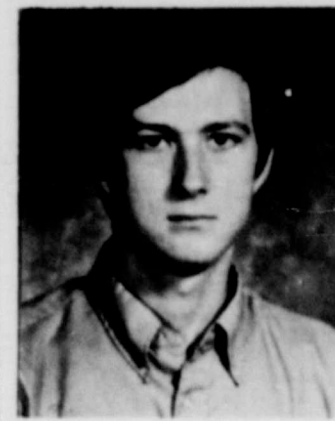

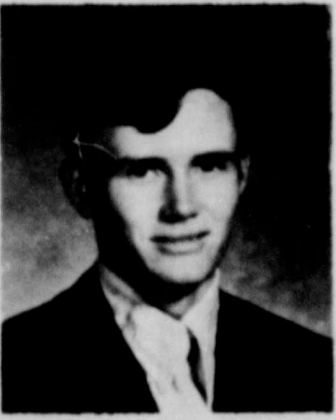
