Brewster told the group, "I now you realize this country isn't perfect, because it's run by people, and people just aren't perfect. But it's the best there is at this time. Also addressing the group

He urged the group, made up primarily of Mexico natives not to throw away the heritage of their homelands but to use it to build a better life in America.

The Rev. Vinson pointed out the freedoms the new Americans would have, but added, With this freedom is the responsibility to guard it for those who come after you. I challenge you to be a contri-

bution to this hour in America." Among those becoming naturalized citizens was Guenaro Castillo Siller of Mexico, a resident of Goldthwaite, Texas.

From The County Agent-

The Mills County Adult Leaders Association will sponsor a county-wide Youth Dog Show on May 27, 1975, at the T. A. Head Arena. Registration will begin at 1:00 p.m. and judging will begin at 2:00 p.m.

The show has been planned to interest youth in dog care and training. Any boy or girl between the ages of 19 and under is eligible to participate in the show. The dog exhibited by the youngster must be owned by the exhibitor himself or a member of his immediate family. All dogs must be on leash at all times. The dogs will be classified at registration. Ribbon awards will be given through five places.

Dogs do not have to be registered or purebred. We just plan to have a good time. The classes for the show are as follows:

1. Obedience - all age dogs Sporting Dogs: Class 2 - 6 months old

and under. 3. Class 3 - 7 - 12 months 4. Class 4 - 13 - 24 months 5. Class 5 - over 2 years Small Dogs

6. Class 6 - 6 months old and under

7. Class 7 - 7 to 12 months 8, Class 8 - 13 - 24 months 9. Class 9 - over 2 years 10. Class 10 - Smallest dog -All ages

11. Class 11 - Biggest dog -Nothing Fancy - Just Fun!

To insure effective dates, producers should examine nut clusters for signs of eggs. When eggs appear, application using one of the following chemicals

should be made: Guthion - 11/2 lbs, of 25 per cent WP mixed with 100 gal. of

Thiodan - 1 lb. of 50 percent WP mixed with 100 gal. of

Malathion - 3 lbs, of 25 per cent WP mixed with 100 gal. of water. Sevin - 112 lbs. of 80 per cent WP mixed with 100 gal.

More than one application may be necessary. Be sure to follow all label restrictions and

instructions carefully. If two applications are made, they should be applied on May or 24 and again on May 30, 1975. If only one applica-tion is to be made, it should be applied on May 25, 1975.
