Thursday (tonight) at 8 p.m. the Goldthwaite elementary students will have commencement exercises. The exercises will be conducted at the high school auditorium.

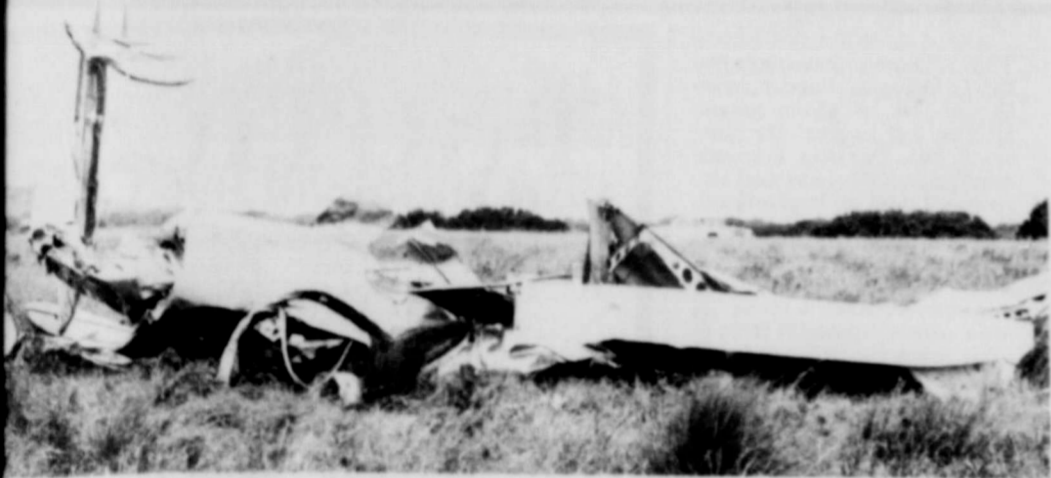

Plane Crash Claims Life Of Goldthwaite Businessman

Sunday, May 18th, at approximately 7:40 p.m., R. G. Kelly, president of Goldthwaite, was killed in his air craft crash-landed at about 2,000 feet when he was about four feet of the right wing, causing the craft to tumble over-end to the ground.

Witnesses to the crash said Kelly was performing acrobatic stunts at about 2,000 feet when he lost about four feet of the right wing, causing the craft to tumble over-end to the ground.

Witnesses also said Kelly tried several different maneuvers to try to correct the problem, but the attempts were in vain.

Kelly was the only occupant of the plane at the time of the crash.

Local law enforcement officers investigated.

Funeral services for Mr. Kelly were conducted Tuesday, May 20, 1975, at 4 p.m. in the First United Methodist Church, with interment in the Pleasant Grove Cemetery, Rev. Gordon Cook officiated. Arrangements were under the direction of Wilkins Funeral Home.

Mr. Kelly, a member of the Methodist Church, was born October 21, 1927, in the Pleasant Grove Community to Lawrence O. and Olantha Horne Kelly.

Mr. Kelly, operator of a TV sales and service business here in Goldthwaite, is survived by his son, Roland Kelly, Dallas; his daughter, Pam Kelly of Austin; his mother, Mrs. L. Kelly of Goldthwaite; and

two brothers, Arnold Kelly of Goldthwaite and Olney G. Kelly of Fort Worth.

Pallbearers were Floyd Spradley, Cleo Dempsey, Kenneth Kelly, Darse Kelly, Sammy Gummelt and Glenn Kelly.

Mr. Kelly attended Star High School and Port Arthur College in 1957 and received his bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering from Lamar State University in 1961.

He was formerly an engineer with Western Electric Company International Telephone and Telegraph, Texas Instruments Inc. and LTV Aerospace.

On January 30, 1950, he was married to Nelda Charlene Hammond.

W. L. Woodruff, an Abilene attorney, led the naturalization proceedings for eighteen adults and one child from seven different countries Wednesday, May 7.

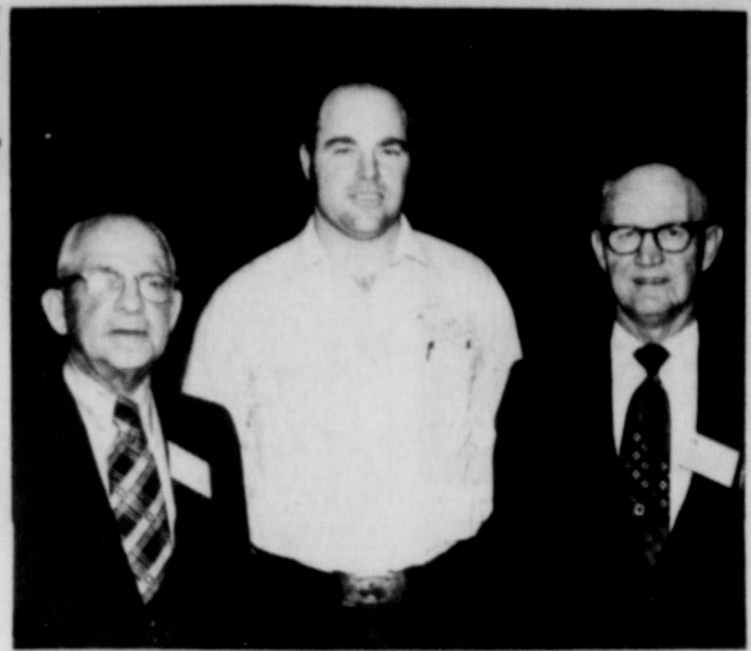

The Mills County Adult Leaders Association will sponsor a county-wide Youth Dog Show on May 27, 1975, at the T. A. Head Arena. Registration will begin at 1:00 p.m. and judging will begin at 2:00 p.m.

The show has been planned to interest youth in dog care and training. Any boy or girl between the ages of 19 and under is eligible to participate in the show. The dog exhibited by the youngster must be owned by the exhibitor himself or a member of his immediate family. All dogs must be on leash at all times. The dogs will be classified at registration. Ribbon awards will be given through five places.

The pecan nut casebearer will be doing his damage very soon. Pecan producers are encouraged to spray for this pest. We anticipate the initial spray date to be May 24, 1975. To insure effective dates, producers should examine nut clusters for signs of eggs. When eggs appear, application using one of the following chemicals should be made:

Guthion - 1½ lbs. of 25 per cent WP mixed with 100 gal. of water.

Thiodan - 1 lb. of 50 percent WP mixed with 100 gal. of water.

Malathion - 3 lbs. of 25 per cent WP mixed with 100 gal. of water.

Sevin - 1½ lbs. of 80 per cent WP mixed with 100 gal. of water.

More than one application may be necessary. Be sure to follow all label restrictions and instructions carefully.

If two applications are made, they should be applied on May 23 or 24 and again on May 30, 1975. If only one application is to be made, it should be applied on May 25, 1975.
