During my visit to Mr. Gholson, my attention was called to an article published recently in one of the leading newspapers of Texas, in which the writer described Gholson's Gap as a rugged cleft through a nountain, shrouded in heavy timber with a mad torrent flowing through it, and so gloomy and dismal that only

ghosts and evil spirits would approach it. As a matter of fact the only timber about the gap is what is known as mountain brush. It is some distance to water of any kind. Large boulders and cliffs abound near it, but a State highway passes

through it, and the view one gets from the top of the gap is decidedly one of the most peaceful and beautiful to be found in Texas.
