Sports were quickly coming into view and enjoyed by all. Football began to draw huge crowds; golf and tennis had grown in popularity at a phenomenal speed by 1930.

The '20s were the golden years of baseball. Tens of illions followed the career of the lovable 'Babe' Ruth. Mills County people loved aseball and rooted for the Yankees and White Sox; they kept up with baseball scores ning Western Union at the Depot

The decade of the '20s was called the "Jazz Age". The charleston was the going dance of the day; youngsters worked long hours in their living rooms with the victrola playing "Ain't She Sweet" to learn the difficult dance.

In short, the flapper age was here and with it came women with bobbed hair. short dresses, lipstick, rouge, heavy mascara, and cigarette smoking. The cosmetic industry boomed, cigarette sales increased, wo men wobbled about on high heels and everywhere there was gaiety.




