

W. Lumpkins, they erected a native stone building. John Dan Chesser was elected to serve on the board later that year as a steward and trustee. It is not known who drew up the plans, but Barney Lammers was the contractor. The members did much of the work on the 35' X 40' structure, consisting of one story. The sanctuary was fur-

nished with folding wooden chairs and kerosene lamps. The stone was drayed to the site from a rock quarry located on the Charles Mullins place. The men used picks to unearth the rocks. then broke them into smaller pieces with mauls. They were loaded by hand on horse-drawn wagons and hauled to the building site. The dedication service was

one of thanksgiving and singing praises to the Lord

for their beautiful church. The sermon inspired shout-ing from the "little old ladies essed in black with their black bonnets tied with a bow". They worshipped in this building for twenty-three years before it was destroyed by a cyclone on April 8, 1919. Undaunted by their loss and steadfast in their Christ-

ian faith, they met in homes for regular worship as they planned a larger, more beautiful church. They were led by Pastor J. Weems and Presiding

Elder Thomas Gregory. The board of trustees - E. F. Casey, A. F. Shelton, Dr. R. H. Jones, J. D. Cobb, John Boland, L. L. Wilson, and Leslie Pickens were empowered to accept donations from the General **Board of Church Extensions** not to exceed \$2500 for the purpose of building a church.
