★ 1977: A year of ups and downs ★

a brief review . . .

1977 may not have been the "best ever" but it's just about gone now and if there was something you forgot to do this year, you better get with it.

It was a year of contrast. The heavy rains of April were opposed by a general drought the rest of the year and into the winter months. The fact that it hasn't rained is the big news at the close of the year.

And for a non-election year, activity was brisk.

The year, from the files of the Eagle, witnessed these main stories:

JANUARY—The 39th annual Livestock Show and Sale.

County Commissioner William Glenn Crawford sworn in, along with complete county commissioners court.

Dale Allen was named City Manager by the City Council of Goldthwaite.

Joanna Lynn Witty was the first baby of 1977, born Jan 10.

FEBRUARY—The Eaglettes win the district championship in basketball, but lose to Robert Lee, 50-31 in bi-district.

The Geeslin building collapses, and the City Council condemns the building.

MARCH—This was a real "routine" month.

The annual Eagle Relays were held here, one of the biggest in recent years.

APRIL—City and school elections were held, with several new faces appearing.

The redistricting plan of the county was undertaken and approved, giving the county a one-man, one-vote arrangement.

Mills County received about a 4 inch rain in April, the last good rain for the year, except for scattered showers.

MAY—The big Lions Club Fiddlers contest and assorted accompanying activities dominated the scene in May. It was a big weekend in Mills County.

JUNE—Ronnie Wetterman was named new Mills County Deputy.

Roland Fry was introduced as the new preacher at the Church of Christ in Goldthwaite.

The Commissioners Court initiated a bounty program. The first ever United Fund drive was begun.

JULY—The rancher's delight, pesticide training sessions, were held in the County.

The new house for the Mills County Museum was officially opened, and was welcomed by a lot of people.

AUGUST—The Gold-Tex Rodeo Finals shared the spotlight in August with the opening of schools in the county.

SEPTEMBER—Dove Season opened the first day of the month, with offerings slim.

The Eagles lose the opening football game of 1977, and of course, it had to be to San Saba, 30-14.

Tommy Head joins the staff of Mills County State Bank.

County Commissioner Burtel Roberts resigns, and Bill Bishop is appointed to fill his unexpired term as Precinct 1 commissioner.

The Eagles also get their first win of the season, besting Santa Anna.

OCTOBER—Emergency Medical Training school begins with a record enrollment.

County Judge Herbert Faulkner resigns, and James W. Ledbetter is appointed to fill the unexpired term.

The annual Mills County Pecan Show is held.

NOVEMBER—

The opening of deer season sees the influx of hunters of every description, bying articles of every description along for the hunt.

United States Senator John Tower made a visit here to discuss items of public interest.

DECEMBER—Jolly old St. Nick made his first and official visit here in December, and promised to return on Dec. 24th.

Alvin Tiemann was named the new director of the ASCS office in Mills County.

A trio of shoplifters marred the otherwise quiet Christmas shopping season in Goldthwaite.

So, you can see, that it was a good year in Mills County. And most observers will tell you that 1978 should be more of the same.
