Payroll during the year totals \$455,767 which is paid to 53 members of the faculty and employees.

Annual budget for the Goldthwaite School system is Annual budget for the Goldthwaite school system this year is \$598,365. This does not include lunchroom operations

There are 41 teachers and administrators in the school system.

The school system operates seven buses, driving approximately 96,000 miles per year.

Estimated value of school buildings, land and equipment and all physical facilities of the district, would run in the neighborhood of \$750,000. These include Elementary School, High School, Gymnasium, Stadium, Agriculture Building, Storage Building, High School Lunchroom, and approximately 80 acres of land. Total enrollment for the 77-78 year has now reached 435 pupils for both high school, junior high and elementary school.

Goldthwaite Schools operate two modern lunchrooms serving an average of 320 meals daily and total expected for the year of 62,000.



Extension Agent Report -

Lime Important Factor In Quality Forage Production

By DANNY LONG Mills County Ext. Agent

It is estimated that four million acres of pasture soils in Texas is deficient in lime. Forage growth and quality, as well as profits, can be restricted on this acreage.

I think we often tend to neglect the fact that extreme applications of nitrogen can increase acid conditions in the soil, resulting in less than optimum production circumstances. 


