

There are a number of things we should do to help keep our county and state relatively free of screwworms. We should do as little dehorning, tail docking or castrating as possible during the seasons when the screwworm flies are normally present. We should contribute to the financial support of the screwworm program when it is needed. We must send samples of worms to the proper authority if we find a
