Screwworm Problem Soars During May

"The Texas screwworm situation broke wide open with astonishing speed during the second half of May," comments Dr. M.E. (Cotton) Meadows, Jr.

The director of the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture (USDA) Screwworm Eradication Program says a late April case in Hudspeth County, and another tallied May 8 in Presidio County, were not particularly unexpected.

The surprises started May 15 with confirmation of a case in west-central Texas' Coleman County, followed promptly by a second in that county and cases in Mitchell and Stonewall counties. Along with those in west-central Texas came six in three south Texas counties - Live Oak, 4; Hidalgo, 1; Willacy, 1.

The Big Bend area was strongly represented with two cases in El Paso County, another in Presidio, one each in Culberson and in Brewster. This brought the 1978 total to 18 through May, compared to 22 at the same time last year.

Records at the Screwworm lab, operated for USDA by the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), show 559 Arizona cases through May, 44 in New Mexico and 19 in California.

Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) started requiring inspection and spraying or dipping of all animals entering Texas from Arizona and New Mexico as of June 1. All such animals must have a prior permit

from TAHC before entry.

Dr. Meadows says cases in west-central Texas are being treated with sterile flies from a temporary distribution center at San Angelo. This is done two days per week by APHIS planes based at Mission.

Plans are to establish a distribution center at Alpine next week. This will allow locally based treatment for cases occurring in the Big Bend Region.

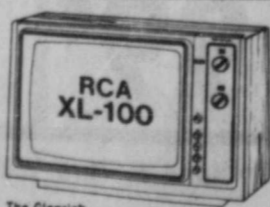

Extension Highlights

A sound fertilization program is a carefully planned segment of production on today's farms and ranches.

Fertilization plans should take into account the amount of hay or grazing needed during a given period of time. A soil test can help determine lime, phosphorus and potassium needs.

If intensive grazing is not planned, only one application of 50 to 60 pounds of nitrogen per acre may be needed if the soil tests medium or higher in phosphorus and potassium. It may be desirable to fertilize a portion of the acreage in the spring, summer and fall rather than all in the spring.

These suggestions are offered for producing an abundant supply of summer grass - provided it rains, of course:

- Use a nitrogen rate of at least 50 to 60 lbs. of actual nitrogen per acre.
- Test the soil every three or four years to determine when to add lime, phosphorus and potassium.
- If the total nitrogen to be applied is more than 200 or 300 lbs. per acre, add 15 to 20 lbs. of sulphur per acre on

deep sandy soils.
• Combine fertilization with rotational grazing to extend the grazing period, maintain quality forage, and make more efficient use of plant nutrients, especially nitrogen. Applying fertilizer over the entire pasture before heavy spring growth produces grass too fast for efficient grazing. Thus, excess forage should be harvested to get the most from the fertilized acreage.

Capacity Crowd Attends First Area Beefmaster Sale

The first Beefmaster sale ever held in this area drew a large crowd, and set an average of \$1163 on 78 lots.

The sale was managed and auctioneered by Bert & Ruben Reyes of San Antonio for Baird Beefmasters of Priddy, Texas. The sale was held in Brownwood recently.

The City Manager shared work progress reports.

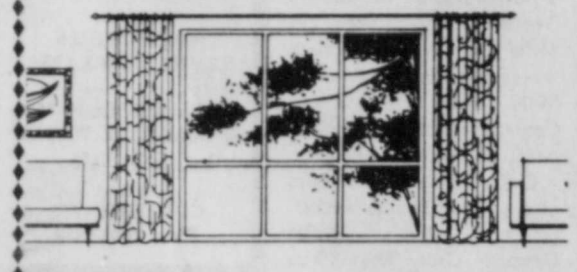
A contract for wholesale electricity from LCRA for a minimum use was presented and approved for a 5-year period. The contract is reviewed each year in terms of use adjustment.
