



# **Indemnity Rate** Hike Proposed

"big un"

AUSTIN -- Separate brucellosis indemnity rates for female calves and non-registered dairy cattle have been proposed, as well as increases in the indemnity rate for registered cattle, Agriculture Commissioner

Reagan V. Brown has noted. The new rates now under consideration by the U.S. Department of Agriculture \$250 for registered cattle, \$150 for non-registered dairy cattle and \$25 for female calves destroyed because of brucellosis infection or exposure. The \$50 rate for other non-registered cattle would remain unchanged, Brown added.

'The changes would bring indemnities closer to the animals' true market values," Brown said. "This should encourage greater participation by cattle owners in the cooperative state-federal brucellosis
